EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR'S REPORT



Dear friend and partner of GOA,

When the year 2023 was coming to close, the Lord spoke clearly to us and told us that he was ushering GOA into a season of open doors. A season that would see us hit milestones and achievements that have been difficult for us to reach. This became of theme for the year 2024, the year of Open Doors. Isaiah 60:11. IN deed the year 2024 has been exactly what The Lord spoke to us, the year of open doors. Your generous support and prayers have made God's work in GOA very enjoyable.

GOA discipleship teams have empowered regional Bishops throughout the year and equipped them to lead the GOA regions to prosperity. We have ordained eight GOA Bishops, giving them greater mandate to lead GOA regions to plant more churches and reach more communities with the Gospel. This has proven successful with close to 7 new churches having been planted in areas that thirsty for the Gospel. GOA teams launched the new entry into Kisii County this year with a presence of three churches that are rapidly growing. More people have received the Gospel. Accepted Jesus as their savior and are being discipled to mature in their relationship with the Lord. Four of these communities will be celebrating the completion of new permanent worship sanctuaries built in partnership with our church development partners, International Cooperating ministries ICM. However there are still open opportunities for you to partner with our teams in reaching these communities with the Gospel. More than 10 more congregations still worship under trees trusting God for the gift of a worship sanctuary

GOA Compassion ministry is growing each and every day. Doors opened for more needy children to be rescued. Today both GOA homes and foster families are caring for 354 children. The children have a loving family that provides for their needs and care for them. All our children who are of school going age have been in school with their needs provided for. Thank you so much to our partners who have given their generous support to keep all these children comfortable. Our care givers are working around the clock to initiate and nurture projects that will help us feed the children on well balanced nutritious food. They have initiated vegetable farming, poultry farming and dairy farming which provide milk, vegetables and eggs for our children. We are moving towards doing better. We however, have to provide sparingly for these children since we do not have full sponsorships for all of them. Today we are in need of 327 child sponsorships that will enable us to give a bright future for the children. Would you sponsor a GOA child today?

GOA Leadership training teams have experienced greater open doors in the year. More than 200 leaders have been equipped with eight core values of effective leaders, Bible and Theological training and entrepreneurial skills. More than 15 African Nations have benefited from the Goa Leadership training opportunities. Leaders in these Nations are multiplying themselves and accelerating the spread of the Gospel of Jesus.

Our Bible and Theological training College in Tharaka Kenya however still remains in need of a chapel for the community and students. Many churches in Africa are led by Pastors who have not yet been trained. It is part of our top priorities that we shall get training to all these Pastors for them to lead their churches with a better understanding of God and their calling. Would you partners with GOA in taking the training to all the Pastors in the remote and marginalized areas?

This year came with very heavy response opportunities to the needs of the people. The heavy rains that hit the country this year left behind a trail of destructions. Floods swept away villages and devastated families. In one of the severe incidences in Maimahiu a whole village was swept away when heavy rains came down at night leading to massive losses of lives and property. The families were displaced and remained hopeless. Our Peace teams camped in Maimahiu operating from Beat The Drum Home to rescue and encourage these families through provision of relief food and other needs. Months after the floods tragedies across the country, many of these families are still struggling to piece their lives together. Please pray for them and consider a generous donation that can help one family return to their normal lives.

The GOA Mentorship teams are equipping the merging leaders within GOA communities. This year along we have had a total of 29 students graduate from their High Schools to join the 87 students in Post-secondary Education and mentorship. The financial need for this class of students is very heavy. It however Gives us joy to see the students grow in their careers paths and finally become self-reliant as adults. We pray for your support to GOA mentorship to care for all these students. GOA Sports ministry on the other hand has been vibrant amidst an array of challenges. GOA has pioneered the introduction of Floorball in Kenya. The sport has grown so fast and the Kenya Teams hold the world titles currently. However, the Kenyan Government has been adamant supporting the sport. In the just concluded African Championships Kenyan Teams have performed so well to win the title for the ladies while men emerged second with no government support. We invite you to partner with GOA to grow the GOA Sports evangelism and help us reach more young people with Gospel.

Comparing the first with months of 2024 and the 2023, our financial resources have shown growth. During the first eight months of year 2024 we received a total Income of Kshs 122,648,837 which is a slight increase from an equivalent period in year 2023 whose amount was Kshs 121,415,493. Praise the Lord. These resources have translated to happy families and communities in Africa. Thank you for your generous giving.

next class which will start from 15th of July. The CBR class at the same venue had 9 students diligently following the course and gaining the discipline of reading God's word daily. In GOA Murera, CBR class continues every first Sunday of the month from 2-6p.m.

GOA EDUCATION

Syllabus coverage in all our schools is being achieved in good time. Each of the class participated in an academic trip. Form one and two went to Nairobi National Park and Kenya National Museum. Learning area included many subjects; Geography, History, Biology, Chemistry and Business studies, the students gained greatly.

Form three and four students participated in a trip to Nakuru Agriculture show and Trade Fair . They learned a great deal on agricultural machinery, animal and plant production and health. They visited KRA to learn about taxes and public finance, Co-Op Bank for banking and also visited several production processes rich in Business Studies topics. In the Kenya Bureau of Statistics they learnt about population in Geography among other areas.

Schools in the Unreached communities

The month of July had been busy with ball games competition. One of our pupils was selected and represented the school in football from the zone to the county i.e. Jarred Eloiloi grade 6.

Our teachers have been committed on duty enabling the month to go smoothly. The ECDE at Kaapokor is picking up due to our assistance in terms of feeding.

The school was closed on 1.8.2024 and the enrolment on closure at GOA NABWELPUS was at 79 at the end of July. At Nkirashi school the school was able to put up some temporary staff houses through fund raising. GOA helped in putting up a temporary kitchen. They were cooking from outside

Kenya Floorball Sport is in need

In the year 2015, a team of 11 Swiss coaches travelled to Kenya to introduce floorball. This was through a partnership with floorball4all International through the connection of GOA Switzerland

We are forever grateful for this sport that has impacted thousands of youths in Africa. The sport has helped us transverse Kenya with the good news of Christ with teams in slums, churches, children homes, communities and even schools. We have over 100 teams in Kenya. We have also gone overboard to other African Nations including Tanzania, Burundi, Malawi and Uganda. It has also opened International doors for our youths and leaders in other nations of the world.

There is an active league in Kenya and a national team with our sports coordinator leading the officially registered federation in Kenya. Kenya has since participated in the 2^{nd} and 3^{rd} African cup and has won the bid to host the 4^{th} African cup from 13^{th} to 15^{th} September 2024.

We invite you to support this vibrant team that won the 2nd African cup. The target is 10 nations with 6 nations having confirmed their participation. A proposal with more details is also available with a total budget of Ksh 5 Million

Post Secondary mentorship



We begin by expressing our deepest gratitude to our partners for their continued support. Your generous contributions have provided school fees, monthly upkeep, laptops, house rent, and other learning materials for 87 students currently enrolled in various colleges. This support is instrumental in equipping these young individuals to change the course of history, regardless of their backgrounds. We are preparing to support 29 students joining college in the September and January intakes. To support one student is only \$250 per month, covering monthly upkeep and school fees. Contributions of learning materials such as laptops are also welcomed.

Training for the youth

We brought together more than 50 students and young people from our churches to educate them on how to respond appropriately to LGBTQ issues as a Christian family. This training is significant for young people, helping them navigate contemporary



challenges from a Christian perspective. Our expectations are that as we churn this breed of young people into institutions of Higher education their influence will be felt among the rest of the youthful population and be agents of positive change.



- 2. Through our partnership we have also received a group of intern teacher from Switzerland at GOA education Centre. They were of great benefit in the school by teaching extra curriculum activities such as taking the children for swimming, school trip which not only exposed our students but also improved their skills. Together wit the students and the teachers at the school, The team did intensive tree planting leaving the environment smiling with the hope of clean air purified by the trees. Our partners also came as a group of ten who are either our long time partners or staff who work for Goa Switzerland. Through their trip our partnership has grown greatly. Our children have enjoyed time with them for cross cultural learning such as preparing specials meals together which have built friendships and enhanced the existing ones.
- 3. This year we have hosted a close to seven students from Universities on Internship. They have served the ministry both at the Head Office as well as other GOA ministry projects. Their footprints will remain a reminder of the impact they have left among our teams

FINANCIAL REPORT

Our calendar year 2024 began on a high note with a lot of expectations as we head to completion of our first five years of our strategic plan. Compared to the first eight months of year 2023, the ministry's income increased by 1.01% to rise from 121,415,493 to 122,648,837 during the same period in 2024. This is mainly attributed to funding of some projects that have been pending in our budget for quite some time and also positive response by friends and partners as a result of emerging needs like floods. We are all time grateful to our partners that have supported us this far

Ministry activities funding

During the period, we received funds for various projects in the various pillars of the ministry. As a result compassion received the highest at the rate of 42.8%, Stewardship & Integrity at 20.9%, Governance and Leadership at 13.3%, Mentorship at 9.5%, Discipleship at 7.9%, Financial Stability & Sustainability at 5.2%, and Peace at 0.3%.






GOA Ministry sources of income for the open doors season 2024

Breakthrough for Githabai Farm

The past five years at GOA Githabai Farm have been a journey marked by both achievements and challenges. Despite our best efforts to ensure effective farming operations, the lack of a consistent water supply has been a persistent obstacle. Our mission to sustain the Children's Homes through farming, while also generating revenue from surplus production, was frequently constrained by this limitation. However, 2024 marks a turning point for Githabai Farm. Through the incredible support of A Child's Hope International, a critical door has been opened—one that promises to significantly transform not only our farming operations but also the broader community. We have drilled a new borehole installed with sufficient Power supply from the Solar.

The provision of water through this borehole marks the beginning of a new chapter for Githabai Farm. For the first time, we have access to a reliable water source that will allow us to scale up our agricultural activities. Our





immediate objective is to increase food production to ensure the self-sufficiency of our Children's Homes, where the farm's primary output is directed. However, with increased production, we also anticipate a surplus that will be sold commercially to generate revenue, creating a financial base to support our other operational and developmental needs. In the meantime we look forward to install a drip irrigation system on two acres of Githabai farm estimated to cost us close to Kes. 400,000 as part of the farms irrigation strategy. Moreover, a future diversification plan for Githabai farm will include a Sheep farming project that will cost an estimated Kes. 500,000. This will not only be achievement of the diversification but also a response to the growing demand of mutton in the market. We are deeply grateful for the Githabai transformation courtesy of A child Hope International. We believe that this is only the beginning of the partnership that will bear the fruit of transformation for more communities in Kenya and the rest of African population.



GOA SACCO core vision is to empower members economically through saving and from the common pool of savings, they can access credit facilities. It targets members of GOA churches and is open to the public. It is easier when people are empowered through accountability of their financial resources. We continue to seek to grow in a more robust way while making sure our members grow economically and achieve their goals through GOA Sacco.

SACCO GROWTH TREND FOR THE YEAR 2024



GOA SACCO teams are helping grow the discipline of saving among the members and in turn investing in income generating project for further returns and financial freedom. A total of Kes. 1.704 has been saved by the Members during the first eight months of the year. From these resources pulled together members have pulled together, many have accessed credit facilities, and started enterprises that are supporting their

families and churches. One very encouraging Story is of the Wendani Widows group, a group of widows that came together a few years ago to empower each other to economic freedom. Through the Generous donations of the Partners of GOA the widows have a dairy cow each. The group has now joined SACCO and are saving all their extra income from the sale of their milk as they target other projects that are ahead for them.

To better the experience of Our customers GOA SACCO has heavily invested in digital strategy that aims at taking the daily interaction of the SACCO to the members. Upon the upgrade of the current SACCO system, the members will be able to access their accounts at their palms.

Our Top Priorities

- 1. One of our major priorities is the system upgrade software hardware for the GOA SACCO to help in accounting and communication. This will improve efficiency and ensure our members can interact with their accounts in real time.
- 2. Economic literacy seminars and trainings. To ensure that more people have a good grasp of finances and its literacy, we plan to have seminars to ensure that we achieve this.
