Throughout the month we have seen God enable us to do much of what we would not have managed to do with our own strength. Praise God.

When we were closing year 2023, God spoke to us clearly and told us that as we enter into the new year of 2024, it is going to be our season of Open doors, Isaiah 60:11. We pray and trust God for greater opportunities for kingdom partnership that will enable GOA teams to achieve exploits in accordance to his word to us. Welcome aboard the GOA team in this season of Open doors.

The December Holidays for our teams was a time of preparation for the tasks ahead of us in the new year. However, during the holiday season our teams were working tirelessly to reach more people with the Gospel. More congregations have been planted with more churches being built and dedicated for communities to worship together in decent sanctuaries. However more communities in the unreached areas still worship under trees for lack of resources to put up a worship sanctuary. Would you partner with the GOA discipleship teams to build a church today?

Most of the children in our compassion homes took the December Holiday to spend with their guardians. As a result many of them were not in our charitable homes. This reintegration is part of the GOA teams preparation for the transition to the community based care as opposed to the caring for the children in charitable institutions. However, we have found out that the families that are expected to receive these children are in dire need that they struggle to provide basic needs to these children. GOA Community development initiative has responded to this need by trying to empower these families to sustain themselves and the extra children that will join them. At the same time many of our children in the homes do not have someone to sponsor them for the provision of their basic needs. We appeal to you to consider sponsoring a child or more in one of our homes and helping to provide for their needs.

The GOA leadership mentorship Summit 2 was a success. More than 100 practicing and emerging leaders from different parts of the Nation and Nations all gathered in Nairobi for the Four day conference. The leaders left the conference with a renewed zeal to develop more leader for the future of the vision of GOA. When we were planning the Summit we did not have all the financial resources we needed to host the leaders in Nairobi. Through your financial support and prayer it was possible to host the conference and prepare the future leaders who will keep the fire burning. This year, the GOA Leadership Mentorship Summit 3 will be held in Naivasha at the GOA strong Tower Home, where we envision to put up a guest house that will both help us generate income to support GOA care for more orphans.

GOA supports and invests in the education of the children in Africa. More than 100 GOA children sat the National exams at the end of last year in three of our schools. Among them were the 10 adult candidates from Turkana who are looking forward to join High School. Both the Grade eight and form four candidates performed excellently from the results that we got at the end of the year. Many of our students who sat the form four exams got an opportunity to join Universities to pursue their careers while all our class eight candidates have now transitioned to High School. With your support we shall see these children go further with their education.

During the month of December funding for the GOA projects increased by more than 50%. God answered our prayers for some of our key projects and they have started being worked on. Our children in Kieni home will have a new sleeping dormitory after the ongoing project is finished. More other projects are going on while our normal ministry operations are also in good progress. Thanks you for supporting our teams through your generous giving and prayer.

PRIPORITY NEEDS FOR YEAR 2024

Our greater focus in the year 2024 is preparing our churches and regions to embrace the new child care reforms and be centres of comprehensive care in the communities as they continue to be champions of effective evangelism and discipleship.

- i) Every month the GOA discipleship teams will need Kes. 30,000 for travel around the country for the ordination ceremonies of the regional Bishops to help them prepare to lead their regions and mobilization of resources towards caring for orphans as they minister the word of God to the congregations.
- ii) Close to 15 Pastors from the GOA unreached areas are in dire need of a motorbike each to help them in ministering to their communities effectively.
- iii) We look forward to conducting Four GOA children and youth ministers training events during the year with an estimated cost of Kes. 400,000.
- iv) We also look forward to hosting one training event for the GOA regional Bishops in preparation for their greater roles as they get ordained. This is estimated to cost discipleship teams up to Kes. 550,000.
- v) This year The GOA Director of Discipleship will be enrolling for a master's degree at a university in the United States we pray for provision of Kes. 750,000 to start off the program
- vi) Throughout the year the GOA regions will be hosting their regional conferences at difference time in the year. It is estimated that these will cost our teams close to Kes. 4,500,000 to successfully hold these conferences.

Agnes Kariithi who is the mother Gideon Mutuma on of the child in our program lost everything she had in her house which was touched to ashes due to tribal clashes. Right now she is trying to gather resources and establish herself again. They also lost a goat that she hoped to sell and try to boost her income.



Fridah and Riziki need your help

27 year old Fridah had been married for close to 9 years before her marriage collapsed. She was then sent away by her husband and his family together with her daughter Riziki 8 years old before she was again rejected by her own family. She moved to rent a dilapidated house in a remote village where she lives with Riziki. Riziki now risks dropping out of school due to the distance of over 7 Kilometers she has to travel everyday to a from school all by herself. They sleep on a stick bed covered old sack which

they use as a mattress. With your help we can help Fridah and Riziki piece their lives together again.

The History makers training for Business leaders saw our teams equip 31 Christian Business leaders. The team of leaders is passionate about multiplying themselves through equipping other business people while embracing their business ventures as Gods tools to transform the world. As a result of the training the team has launched a movement of Business people that are inspiring entrepreneurship as a way of transforming the society with the Gospel. The team of leaders meet every week as a follow up meeting to pursue their set goals of mentorship of others and self actualization and growth.

Post Secondary

Today we have a total of 65 students in colleges and universities. These students were encouraged and motivated to save Ksh. 400 each towards their future financial stability. This initiative aims to equip the younger generation with the tools and mindset necessary to achieve financial independence and responsible stewardship of resources. In the near future we look forward to add 20 more students to the program as they join institutions of Higher education. More support is needed for our teams to keep all these students in schools and grow them in their careers.

Mentorship and Empowerment Program for Business People

On the 30th of July 2023, the department organized a mentorship and empowerment program specifically tailored for business people within the G.O.A community in Kahawa Wendani. This event was the starting point of the journey that our teams are walking with starting business people as we seek to empower them to sustainability.

December was a time of celebrating KCPE (Kenya certificate of Primary Education) Exam results for candidates from three of our GOA schools; GOA Education center, Kinangop, GOA Nabwelpus and GOA Naotin adult school.

At GOA Education in Kinangop, the class of 21 candidates performed so well in the 2023 Exams raising the school mean score by 41 from the year 2022 results. The good results have attracted many parents who are willing to bring their children to our school. We are looking forward to an increase in the enrollment. However, we have a challenge of lacking two classes to be



able to cater for 11 classes. We pray for provision of resources for this need to be met.

The Exam provided a unique opportunity for our schools in Turkana region. Nabwelpus education center sat for the exam for the first time in the 8.4.4 being the last Grade eight national examination. The class of 10 candidates posted a mean score of 176.50 after learning in very difficult circumstances. Similarly 10 adult candidates at GOA

Naotin adult education Centre sat the last of the KCPE examination. The class attained a mean score of 179.7. The candidates from both school desire to join High school education to further their studies. The school in Turkana region face an acute shortage of learning resources including insufficient classrooms with most of the classes taking place in the open sun and under trees.

PRAYER NEEDS AND WAY FORWARD

- 1) We are in need of two classrooms in Education Centre, Kinangop
- 2) The new Grade 8 class is in need of text books
- 3) We need a new Printer at GOA High school
- 4) We are also in need of Three classes in Nabwelpus school in Turkana.
- 5) Money for fencing off Nabwelpus school compound for the security of the children
- 6) We need to put up a classroom in Naotin Adult school for the adult learners.

The schools are scheduled to open next week and preparations are in place. We are looking forward to receiving the KCSE results soon. A strategic meeting has been planned early this month for Tumaini complex.

We have received year 2024 with great expectations

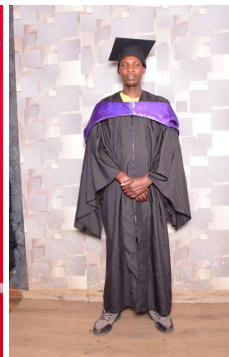

December is a very key month to GOA ministry since it marks the end of the third quarter of our financial year. The month begins with a leadership summit where all GOA leaders gather to evaluate and discuss a way forward for the ministry for the subsequent calendar year. It's also a month of festivities so most staff break for holidays to spend more time with their families.

Compared to the previous month of November, the ministry's income increased at the rate of 51.1%. This is attributed to funds received for Kieni West dormitory Construction Phase II and sustainability projects funds for the sports department. We also received funds for various projects from the United States following Bishop & Rev Joyce visit there in the previous month of November.

Financial Performance

During the month, we received funds for various projects in the ministry. As a result compassion received the highest at the rate of 51.1%, Governance and Leadership at 20.1%, Mentorship at 14.2%, Stewardship & Integrity at 9.3%, Discipleship at 4.4%, and Volunteers at 0.6% and Peace pillar at 0.3%.

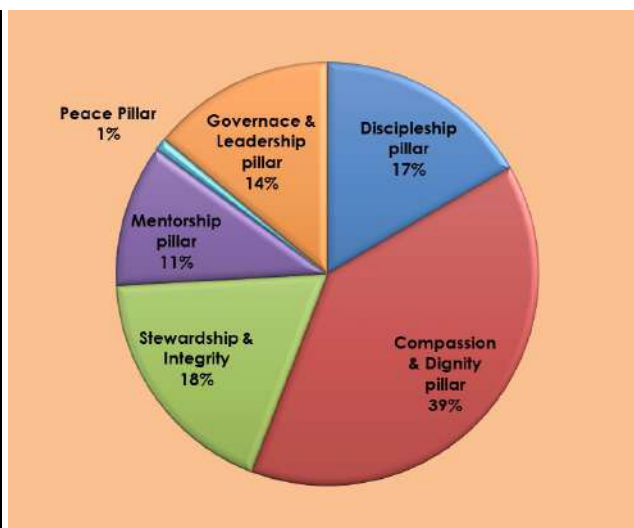

GITHABAI FARM

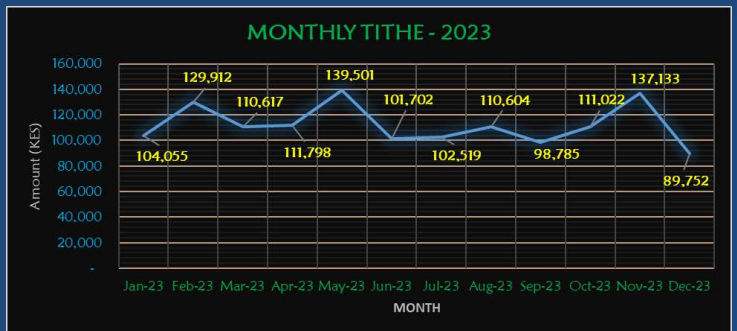
At Githabai far we are diversifying crop and animal farm-



ing to help reap maximum yields. We are introducing daily goats and sheep at the farm in this new year. This project will cost us Kes. 150,000 to start off. However, the farm still needs up to USD 37,000 to drill a borehole that will sustainably provide water for the farming activities.

Tithes from our churches

Closer to an average half of our churches have consistently supported the



ministry through their monthly tithe returns. We received a total of KShs. 89,752/ during the month December. 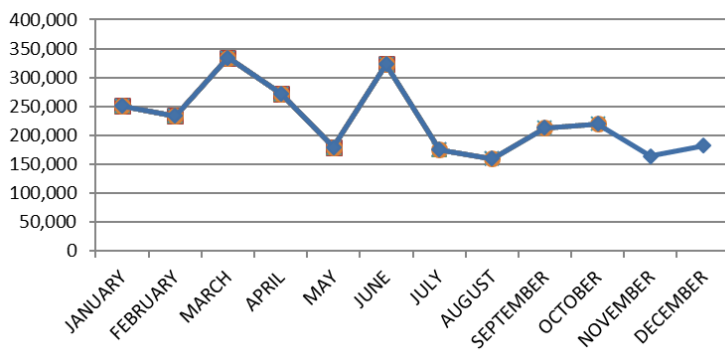

TRENDS IN MEMBER SAVINGS FOR 2023

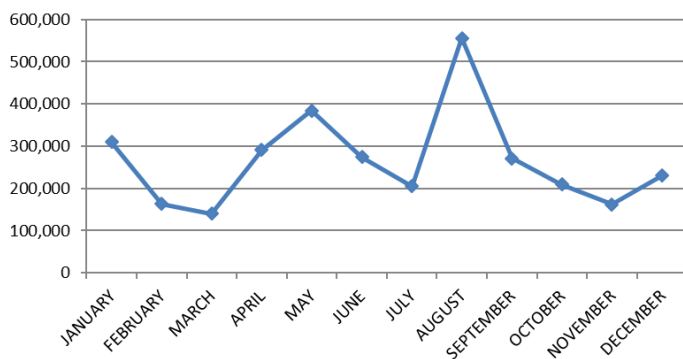


The total deposits made for savings in the month of December amounted to Ksh 182,456. This was an increase by Ksh 17,902 in the savings from the previous month.

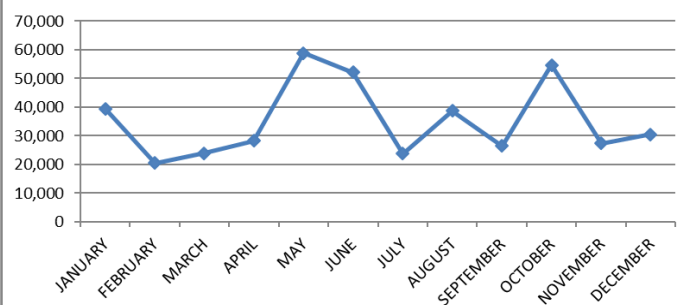
SACCO CREDIT FACILITIES

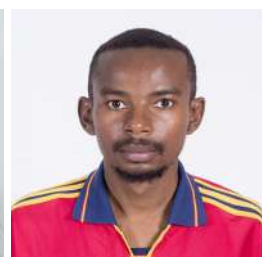
