Happy New Year friend and partner,

I am excited to write again to you with a heart of thanks giving for your faithful friendship and partnership. Through your love and generosity GOA teams are spearheading initiatives for life transformation and making stories of transformation every day. Thank you so much.

God has continued to give us insights into the word he gave to direct us from Isaiah 60:11 that he is keeping our gates open day and night as we pray and trust God for greater opportunities for kingdom partnership that will enable GOA teams to achieve exploits in accordance to his word to us. Welcome aboard the GOA team in this season of Open doors.

The month of January has been a great period for all our teams to experience open doors. All our children were going back to school with more transitioning from one level to the other. These came with very huge financial budgets that at one point we were scared if all the children would go back to school, But God through his miraculous provision made away for all our children.

Our leadership teams have equipped leaders around the African continent, Pastors community leaders and individuals have been empowered to live their God given purposes. We praise God. However, while our teams experienced success all around the Continent, one of our Bible and Theological training centres, Kinamba Laikipia in Kenya was in trouble after the GOA Headquarter church in Kinamba was brought down following a relocation order from the owner of the leased piece of Land. Through the help of our friends and partners the Church is relocating to a new place. The need however is still huge to completely settle the church for the classes to resume as they had been previously.

Over the years GOA peace teams have been instrumental in restoring peace to the Nations of East and central Africa. The continuing conflict in the east of DRC Congo have been a great hindrance to the accelerated spread of the Gospel in the city of Goma and its environs. This has led to the intentional launch of peace campaigns in the Eastern Region of Congo aiming at bringing to an end this prolonged conflict for the prosperity of the region. Please continue praying for Bishop Valery Kitwana and his team in DRC Congo as they work together to restore peace and calm in the area for effective evangelism. More peace initiatives have gone on in Kenyan communities with a greater focus on addressing mental health issues among the members of our communities.

GOA's investment in Education is making impact especially in the unreached areas. In Laikipia region in Kenya a few years ago a community based school was started at GOA Nkirashi church with around 20 children only and one volunteer community teacher. The school has grown with a population of more than 300 children Samburu children who are thirsty for education. They however suffer from hunger while at school and... (Nxt Pg)

Some would stay away from school if there is no food. Through the Help of the local leadership Nkirashi school and GOA Nabwelpus are getting help to address the shortage of classes. These schools are however in need of teachers to attend to the ever growing number of learners. Would you partner. with GOA to provide food, a class room or pay a teacher in one of these schools?

During the month of January funding for the GOA ministry work dropped by close to 30%. However this was attributed to there being no funds received for capital projects that the ministry undertook at the end of the year 2023. We still however trust God for provision of funds for all the projects to be done to completion within the scheduled timespans. All our staff teams are motivated at their various stations of pursuing the vision of reaching the Nations with the Gospel and still look forward to better times ahead. Thank you for supporting our teams through your generous giving and prayer.

Building of permanent worship sanctuaries

GOA invests in the church as the most effective mode of discipleship. As we celebrated the dedications of two projects in the month of December, one more project remains as work in progress. We thank the friends and partner of GOA that have supported GOA Kiserian church to the level it is. We look forward to the completion of the building project in order to have a complete sanctuary for the community in Kiserian. Giving towards the completion of the project is on going as we invite your generous gifts to help to complete the building.



Church planting and Evangelism

More than 200 people in Kisii region and Nandi regions gave their lives to Jesus through the evangelism in the villages. As a result the churches in the regions are growing rapidly as more people join the congregations and get discipled in their relationship with savior Jesus Christ.



GOA Kibukwo in Nandi hills continues to reach the community with the Gospel. More people from the Village are giving their lives to Jesus. However the church meets under the tree. There are more churches in the remote areas of Kenya and beyond that need your help to put up a decent worship sanctuary



Rev Capron from Samburu was empowered through ordination ceremony on 14th January 2024. With the ordination Rev. Capron the Pastoral team in Samburu region has been expanded and given more strength in service. Through his service Rev. Capron has planted GOA church in Yare Samburu which has grown to plant GOA Nkutoto Arus that are both actively reaching the Samburu with Gospel.

PRIPORITY NEEDS FOR YEAR 2024

Our greater focus in the year 2024 is preparing our churches and regions to embrace the new child care reforms and be centres of comprehensive care in the communities as they continue to be champions of effective evangelism and discipleship.

- i) Every month the GOA discipleship teams will need Kes. 30,000 for travel around the country for the ordination ceremonies of the regional Bishops to help them prepare to lead their regions and mobilization of resources towards caring for orphans as they minister the word of God to the congregations.
- ii) Close to 15 Pastors from the GOA unreached areas are in dire need of a motorbike each to help them in ministering to their communities effectively.
- iii) We look forward to conducting Four GOA children and youth ministers training events during the year with an estimated cost of Kes. 400,000.
- iv) We also look forward to hosting one training event for the GOA regional Bishops in preparation for their greater roles as they get ordained. This is estimated to cost discipleship teams up to Kes. 550,000.
- v) This year The GOA Director of Discipleship will be enrolling for a master's degree at a university in the United States we pray for provision of Kes. 750,000 to start off the program

Our children welfare



Over the month of January, we took care of a total of 348 children both in our homes and community based care. We thank God that all our children have been well. Their education needs have been provided while they still remain a prayer item that we shall be consistently provided for. By the grace of God our long awaited project of installing cooking gas at Beat The Drum home was done successfully among other success stories. We are grateful to our partners who have made this possible.

Farming Projects



We have enjoyed good weather in the month of January enabling us to supply fresh food to our kitchens. Rhema children are starting a dairy project, currently the construction of a cow shed is underway.

New Children

We have rescued 16 children and placed them in our different home, 10 at the Mat Tumbini, 3 at Strong Tower while Beat The Drum, Rhema and Rehema homes each had 1 new admission. In response to the needs in our communities compassion team is considering supporting two needy students from the community around Tumbini home who are unable to continue with tier education. We appeal for your support to enable us care for all these needy cases.



Kieni home Dormitory construction

Construction of Kieni children home dorms is in good progress. We highly appreciate all those who have given us the funds to do two dorm at Kieni. The work has continued as scheduled. We are looking forward to the completion of the dorms on schedule.

Children Mentorship



Our team visited four of our homes during the month on evaluation and mentorship trips. Among the major areas of focus that we talked with our children about is on decision making. We are glad to report that the care givers in homes have share positive feedback on the changes among our children who are embracing positive change for better every day.

After sitting her end of primary level national education, she was admitted to Ngaita Girl's High School, one of the extra county school in Tharaka Nithi County. Irene comes from a broken family and is currently being cared for by an aunty who is equally needy. ADOPTION.

There have been a rise in the number of parents who are seeking to adopt a child due to one reason or the other. Around the nation the approved agencies are so few that they may not be able to address this need. This coupled together with the new direction of family based care that GOA compassion is moving towards has necessitated the need to register the GOA adoption agency. This will help parents who are would like to legally take in a child to be there own to go through the process and finally adopt the child.

Our teams are in the mentorship stage with other players in the area of child care through adoption as we look forward to successfully unite a child with their new parent in a few days to come.

Peace for the Troubled DRC



Eastern region of the Democratic republic of Congo has been a scene of conflict for long. The young people in the region and recruited into anti government forces that engage the National government army in running battles over control of Natural resources. The GOA teams in Goma in partnership with the Government of Congo launched and ant radicalization campaign aimed at keeping young people from joining the rebel groups and cutting their lives shot in the battles. In the January 2024 Seminar the team engaged a total of 92 young people who have become champions of peace in the region

With the completion of the Dream Guest house the Peace teams will not only have a center for peace Conferences but also a Centre that will help generate resources for the ministry's sustainability goal.

Many of our the people we have impacted are young people who are at a high risk of being overwhelmed by the daily challenges they face. There are however still grounds to cover to fully achieve this goal.



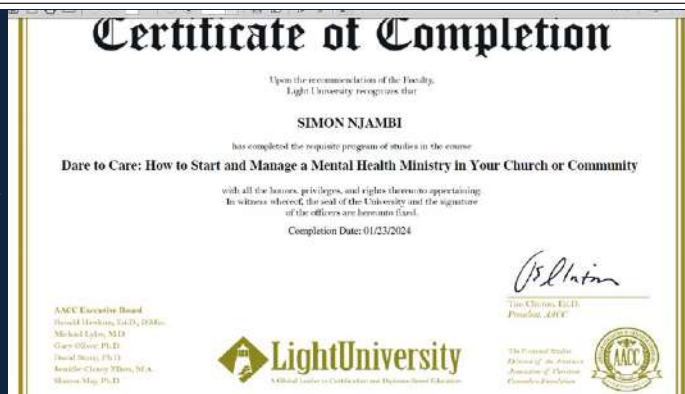
Mental Health Issues trainings

A group of 30 young people from Kahawa Wendani have been equipped on dealing with mental issues and keeping healthy mental lifestyles. Members of the youth group have continued to exhibit healthy mental lifestyles as we continue interacting more and more.

At the same time we have conducted online training for 50 resource persons on Psychology and first aid for children from adverse backgrounds. With this training they become a resource I our efforts to equip the community on mental health issues as well as our children in the community

Partnership in Equipping our champions

The course offered online will go a long way in equipping our teams to address mental health issues in our society as well equipped personnel.

History Makers Leadership training



Our teams had goal of training at least 300 leaders through History Makers in English/ Swahili speaking Africa. A total of 219 leaders were equipped with the eight core values in Kenya, South Africa, Sierra Leon and Namibia in 7 different Conferences. These leaders are in turn multiplying across the continent already.



Bible and Theological training

A total of 28 students were turned up for the January Bible and Theology class at the main Campus in Tharaka. After the lesson on the Old Testament Survey the students were excited by the walk through the Old testament that opened their understanding further. At the same time the classes

in Nairobi had a total of 25 Students both in the First Level and the second Level. The class in Kinamba has been greatly affected by the eviction notice by the owner of the Land where the church is located. However, The Lord has provided a church plot where they are putting up a temporally structure so that the class may resume as soon as they are done.



Consistent Bible Reading Discipline

25 Bible readers were commissioned at GOA Murera after successfully completing the Consistent Bible reading training classes. They continue to harvest the benefits of the discipline and encourage others too. This highlight of the commissioning ceremony was the youngest Bible readers Jeremy Muturi and Alvis Baraka that were commissioned too after successfully finishing the training and becoming a role model to other young people.

Education is one of the tools that GOA teams use to dignify the members of our communities. GOA schools provide education to both children and adults alike. With one High school and four Primary schools more than 500 children have had an opportunity to be impacted through education

GOA HIGH SCHOOL



With a total of 108 students the school has registered an increase in the number of students enrolment. Learning is in good progress with all the students doing their part and teachers alike. The KCSE Agriculture students are already in progress with their Exam project. The current class is determined to raise the performance at the end of the year further higher than the last class. The Christian union movement in the school has been very

key in shaping the spiritual lives of the children as well as their Morals. In order to help the children perform our Team at the school is putting together performance strategies. These include a target to cover the syllabi in the difference subjects early enough to enable them embark on revision. The students will also be involved in interschool academic activities such as symposium and subject contests in order to enhance students' performance and internal Science talks. The target for this year exam class is set at 4.7C-. Engage examiners widely in all subject areas. Our major need stands to be the need for a standby power generator that will help minimize electric power blackouts.

GOA EDUCATION CENTRE KINANGOP SCHOOL



The enrolment in our school has increased drastically from 148 to 204. We have managed to admit 76 more private students since the school opened. Through the guidance of a team of motivated teachers and the guidance of the Spiritual leadership both at the school and the GOA Churches in the region discipline among the students and the staff team has been top notch with regular counselling and guidance sessions with the children.

During the month of January we have been having a privilege in our school of getting scouts trainers who are training our students to play their role as scouts effectively scouts. The trainers are doing the training voluntarily. We hope and have greater expectations a to be the best in scouts and participate in regional and national competitions.

GOA NABWELPUS SCHOOL IN TURKANA,



We got the blessing of a new class room build through the Governments Constituency Development fund. With this blessing we now have a need for two more classrooms to meet the need of the children who take their class in the open sun. However with the growing population of the school and increase in the number of classes we are now in need of two more teachers. We similarly pray for the provision of funds to put up the fence around the school for the security of the children and provision of funds for food for the children.



Nkirashi School in among the Samburu people in Laikipia has rapidly grown to now over 300 children from the community. Through the support of the Local leadership the school has received two new classrooms for the children. The children still suffer lack of food while at school. Through the support of Our volunteer team from Switzerland we have provided food for the children for the first term as we hope that they will keep provided for in future to keep them in school.

NAOTIN ADULT SCHOOL

The school started well, with a total of 43 learners. 15 new learners have joined the school after the encouraging results of the past years National Exam class. The school is however in urgent need of close to Kes. 600000 to help build classrooms for the learners who still learn under the tree.



BURUNDI GOA SCHOOL

The school opened its doors at the beginning of the year and has 25 pupils. A drop in the number of children in the school was caused by the relocation of the school as directed by the Government policy. However the starting of the school is encouraging.

Having bought the piece of land and relocated the school to a new location, the school is currently in need of closer to Kes. 1,000,000. With these funds the school will improve its sanitation facilities by putting up new ablution block, Play facilities for the children an office for the teachers and water provision for the school community.

Kenya floorball federation led by our sports coordinator Paul also got a green light to host the next African cup in September 2024. We are trusting God for open doors of provision even as the government turned down our request to support the event

We are also in the process of starting a sustainability project. Global sounds and events will provide equipment for hire for all events ranging from weddings, burials, crusades, birthdays etc. and the proceeds will help in running of our activities.

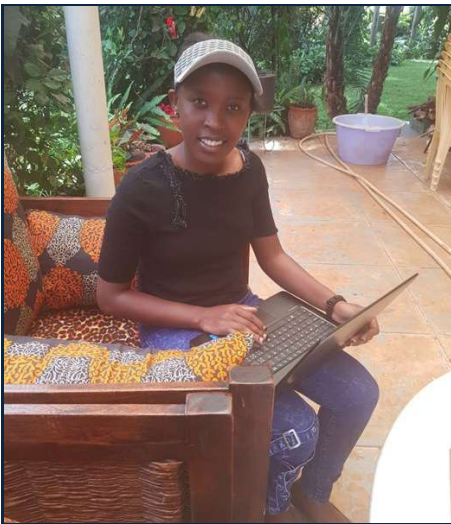

Post-Secondary Students Mentorship

All post-secondary students have successfully returned to college, and we warmly welcome new students joining our ranks. We extend our heartfelt gratitude to God for His continual provision and to our partners, particularly Switzerland, for their unwavering support.



Through the support of our partners we have equipped 12 of our students with laptops for their studies. With these indispensable tools the students are able to flexibly study, research and work on their assignment and access the resources they need for their studies online anywhere. With growing and investments done in digital communication strategies the students are able to collaborate with their peers offsite and enrich their academic and research work among other major benefits of digital learning. Thank you to our partners that enable this empowerment of our students.

In February, we are preparing to host a meeting for 22 high school graduates who will be transitioning to colleges this year. We invite you on board to consider partnering with GOA Mentorship teams to equip these children with their careers studies.

Our volunteers have been key in major development projects in our children homes as well as other projects. There are more volunteering opportunities in GOA projects for both International and Internal volunteers

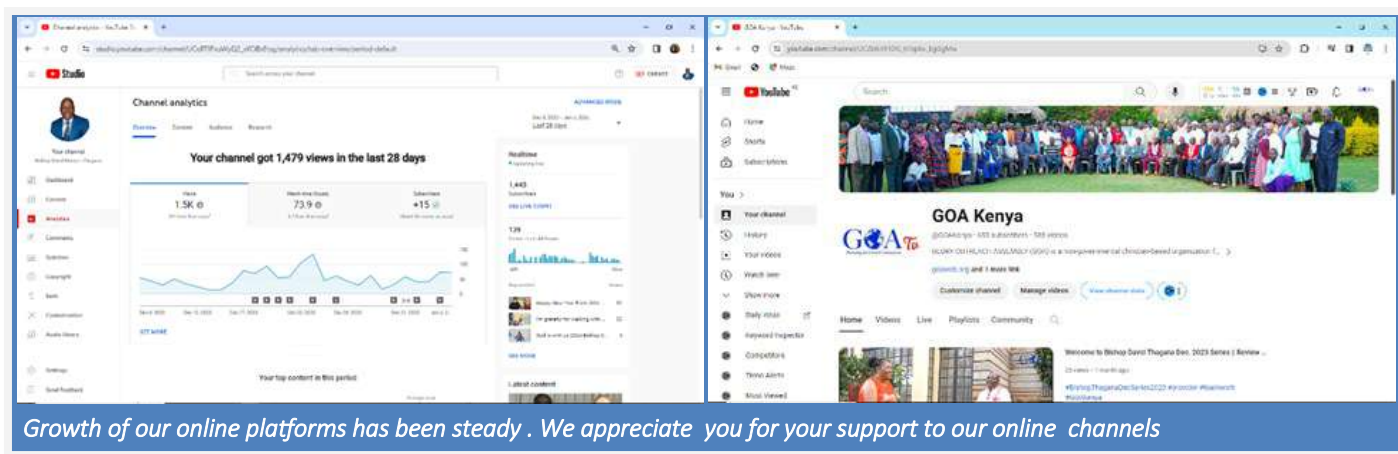

January is the first month of our calendar year and also the first month of the last quarter of our financial year 2023/2024. During the month the ministry had a total of 80 members of staff, 35 being in the children homes, 19 at the head office, 23 in the schools, 1 missionary based in Garsen located at the coast of Kenya and 2 staff working GOA Global University. We also have a bigger team of more than 200 pastors who serve in the churches and several volunteers working in the ministry.

Financial Performance

During the month, we received funds for various projects in the ministry. As a result compassion received the highest at the rate of 41.6%, Stewardship & Integrity at 18.8%, Governance and Leadership at 15.3%, Mentorship at

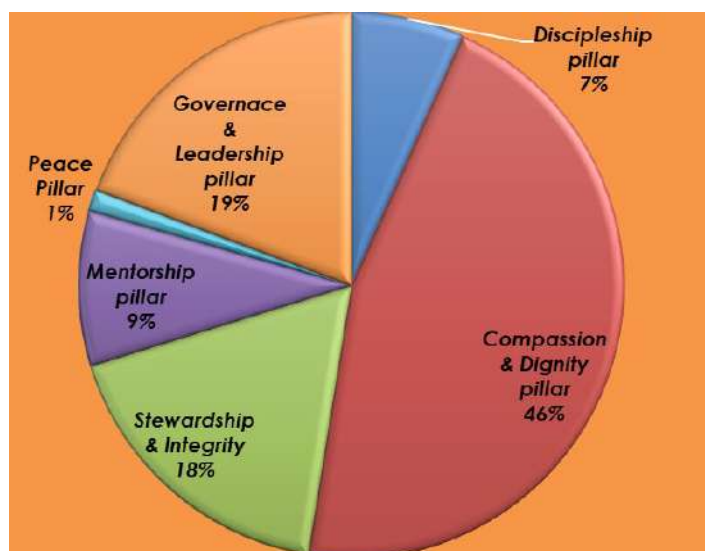
Our Sources of funding from the month of January 2024

In order to continue making life-lasting impact the Ministry has laid out strategies that help mitigate risks that are associated with over reliance on donor funding. Currently the ministry had adopted has adopted three main projects that are key in making this dream become a reality

NAIVASHA GUEST HOUSE

The Naivasha based Guest House steering team is already in the progress of implementation. At the end of the Month of January the team met to chart the way forward. The team came up with the first phase of the project. Phase I of the project would include construction of a perimeter wall, the Facility Swimming Pool, and Landscaping of the entire Ground. At an estimated cost of Kes 15,000,000, the facility would be opened for partial use and start generating income which would be re invested back to grow the facility to the envisioned guest house.

NAIROBI BASED APARTMENTS

We are currently in the stages of finalizing drawings and ap-



provals. It is our prayer to start construction this year, trusting in God's provision of resources and guidance for this project. At this point we are seeking

5,000USD to help us get the approvals through and be ready to start construction. The total cost of constructing this apartment is 200,000USD. The apartment will have 10 units and is expected to generate 2,500USD per month.

GITHABAI FARM

We are currently doing crop farming with the goal to diversify



our farming activities. We are now venturing into sheep farming for meat and dairy Goats for goat milk. We believe that with this hybrid the farm will be

more profitable and successful. Currently we are seeking to raise KShs. 150,000 to purchase young lambs and goat kids to kick start this project. During the month of January we managed to purchase 6 lambs and constructed a sheep pen that can hold approximately 100 sheep. Presently, we require 37,000 USD to fund the drilling of a water borehole that will provide sufficient water for our hybrid farm all year round.

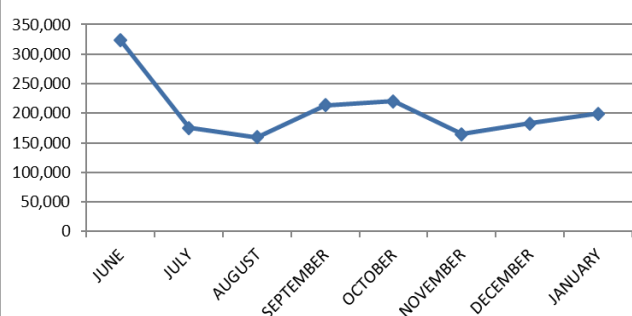

TRENDS IN MEMBER SAVINGS FOR E LAST 8 MONTHS



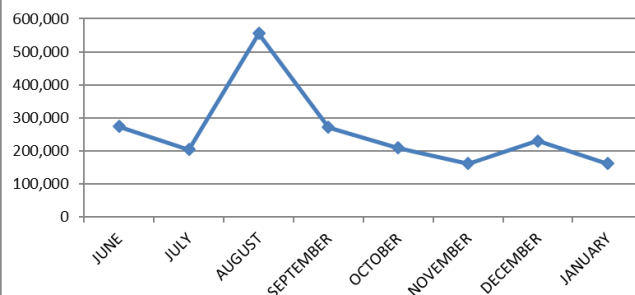
Savings

The total deposits made for savings in the month of January amounted to Ksh 199,572. This was an increase by Ksh 17,116 in the savings from the previous month of December. We look to continue exploring ways of cushioning our members from the tough economic times to enable them save more and grow.

Loans

The amount paid back as loan repayment in the month of January was Ksh 160,011. This was a decrease by Ksh 68,529 from December. The income in interest amounted to Ksh 59,481 while during the month, we issued loans to members amounting to Kes. 880,000. The members needed financial solutions for issues ranging from small Business, family and emergency needs. We are excited that all the members went away smiling after the SACCO was able to meet their financial needs.

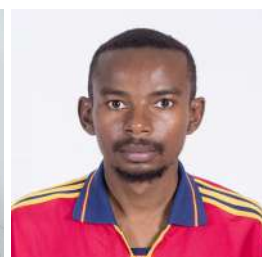
