Dear friend and partner,

A very happy new year, 2023. It gives me so much pleasure to write to you and say thank you so much for your partnership and support to GOA teams in the past year 2022. Through your partnership and support GOA teams around the nations have made more disciples, cared for more vulnerable children, built more peaceful families and communities and equipped more leaders to spread the Gospel of Jesus. The GOA mentorship journey towards vision 2055 that we launched in 2022 December during the Mentorship summit has given us more focus on growing leaders that will take the mantle of the leadership of GOA into the future. Thank you so much.

I began my new year in the style I love most. The whole of the month of January I travelled five different countries beginning from Kenya to make disciples. At the very beginning of the year, on the second day of January together with Joy Griffin we travelled to the norther part of Kenya to the Turkana. More than 200 new people gave their love to Christ during the trip and they are now being discipled by the GOA Teams in Turkana to grow in the knowledge of Christ and to worship Him. The Turkana children were equally excited by our visit. Sharing our time with them at school, church and their homes made them feel the love of Jesus more and more strength to overcome obstacles to pursue their God given purposes in life. From Turkana we proceeded to Nyandarua in Central Kenya where we shared our time with a team of widows who have come together to empower each other to become self-sustainable and grow spiritually. There testimonies of how God has used little resources to help them care for their grandchildren and other needs were so encouraging. We praise God. After these very thrilling trips in Kenya we proceeded to Rwanda, Burundi, and Tanzania to equip leaders and strengthen them in their pursuit of the Great commission. We encountered so many needs that we almost got overwhelmed but we still trust God for the provision.

While I travelled to the Nations with Joy Griffin to equip leaders, the rest of the GOA Teams in the different Nations kept their feet on the ground reaching more people with the Gospel. More than 200 new believers have joined different GOA Congregations and more than half of these have been baptized. We are celebrating more new fellowships that have been planted both in the reached and unreached areas and are reaching more people with the Gospel. Our teams in the remote unreached areas face so many challenges reaching the community with the Gospel. There face the challenge of poor roads, and long distances walking on foot from village to village. Would you partners with GOA to empower a pastor in Turkana with the gift of a motor bike? A gift of USD. 2000 would get a motorbike to pastor to reach more villages with the Gospel.

Our compassion children have all reported to their respective schools. The first term of the year presents greater challenges in paying school fees for these children since the children are going to the next grades and each one of them have requirements for their new grade. With the help of GOA Compassion friends this obstacle is getting overcome bit by bit. With the rising cost of living and the challenges that many of our families are facing their challenge vulnerable children is equally growing. Our compassion team has rescued more children and placed them in our homes for care. You can partner with GOA Compassion to sponsor one of these children and help them look forward to a brighter future.

Our peace teams continue to build and celebrate families with every strategy of strengthening the families being creatively implemented. Ranging from our families at home, the church and the GOA Institutional families in our children homes, our Peace teams have traversed all these with the message of family is a gift, a ministry from God. After a keen assessment of the challenges in our societies the peace teams have now strongly invested in mental health awareness and support. More and more members of the community are getting help to recover from habits that have enslaved them and getting their freedom back. With more resources we can help more young people relive their dreams through rehabilitation.

Our leadership training teams set the goal of training 300 leaders. The harvest was plentiful with a total of 375 leaders equipped across 8 different Nations through History Makers training and many more equipped through consistent Bible Reading and theological studies. These leaders are now ready to go out to multiply themselves and accelerate the spread of the Gospel.

Over the month of January, Our leadership and administration teams have reported a well sustained team. A total of 71 team members have worked together to see the success of the ministry. Thank you for the financial support that you have given to our team, thank you for your prayers and all kinds of support that you have generously given to help us realize success start of the year.

This year GOA Teams have greater focus on starting to build the GOA Dream Centre. We do not have enough resources but we still trust God that as he has spoken clearly to us that we are well able, we will see the Dream of building the Dream Centre begin to come to reality.

All our teams, Discipleship teams, Compassion teams, Leadership training teams, Mentorship Teams and administration teams have put together inspiring stories for you to be blessed as you read this edition of this Newsletter. Please take some time to read and also share with your friends within your networks and let them be blessed by the impact of their partnership with GOA.

As a result of thousands of members of the communities in these areas have known Christ, love him and Worship him. As the New year began early in January The GOA teams around the Nations embarked on reaching out with the life transforming power of the Gospel of Jesus.

## Construction of permanent worship sanctuaries

Through the partnership of ICM have a total of 4 churches under construction. More than 6 new churches

have been dedicated already for the congregational worship. Six others are in the application stage awaiting approval for building to start. The benefitting congregations are excited to have permanent church building after years of no church building within a walking distance. ## Planting of New Fellowships

New churches have been planted around the country and already reaching the communities with the Gospel. In some parts of the Country such as Turkana a new church was planted in Nakhuyanskiria village 50 Kilometers from Lodwar Town. The members of the village are excited to have a church closer to themselves. They have donate a piece of land to build the church. In the mean time they continue

These new believers are being discipled in their different congregations.

## GOA Mission to South Sudan

In 2022 August Ruth Thami from GOA Headquarter church in Nairobi, left for South Sudan having felt God's calling to the war torn nation on a mission to preach the gospel of reconciliation and establish

GOA churches in the country. About five months down the line a fellowship has been established in South Sudan with a round 7 people who consistently meet for fellowship and Spiritual nourishment. The mission suffered greatly the setback of financial constrains. In January 2023 our team empowered Ruth Thami with

equipment to train leaders and evangelize creatively. South Sudan team led by Ruth has the goal of planting the first GOA church in the next one year.

## Prison Ministry with Chris Halfway Home

GOA teams work in partnership with Chris halfway Home as an affiliate ministry that to provide a



platform for GOA to reach prison inmates. In the month of January Chris halfway home made the first visit to Nyeri GK prison to provide love for the inmates. During the visit the team delivered consumables to the inmates and share the gospel them. During the visit 26 inmates gave their lives to

Christ. Thank you to the friends of GOA who provided help to Chris Halfway home for this mission.

## Challenges and Prayer needs

- i) GOA Tana River region has faced difficult times resulting from the constant attacks by the Al Shabab Militia whom in the month of January attached villages killing four and injuring many more. The residents are displaced from their homes and are living in fear with lack of food and other basic
- ii) GOA churches in Turkana are in urgent need of Kes. 100,000 each to help with the transfer of the parcels of land in their ownership to the ministry. A total of 25 churches are in this need to save their land from encroachment.
- iii) We also pray for provision of 10 motorbikes for the Pastors in Turkana region. The Pastors travel for tens of Kilometers on foot to reach the community with the Gospel.
- iv) One of Our pastors from Bungoma Region, Pastor David Wanjala of GOA church in Mayanja got involved in a road accident late last year on his way to the church. Together with his wife they sustained serious injuries with him breaking his feet while his wife too got injuries in her arm. The couples still struggles with their medication and provision for their families.
- v) We pray for provision of recourses for our mission to South Sudan both for Missionary Ruth Grace upkeep and the ministry activities in the Nation.

## Education

The schools were opened for 1<sup>st</sup> term 2023 from January 23<sup>rd</sup>. All our children apart from those joining Form one were able to open school and proceeded to the next grade. We have successfully placed 41 children in different high schools after they successfully sat their Primary school education last year. Our children at Rhema Home can now school at Rhema GOA Education Centre. The new school bus now picks them from the home every morning and drops them back in the evening after school. We appreciate the partners who helped us purchase the Bus.

## New Admissions

In the month of January we were able to rescue 10 children. Six were placed at Strong Tower, 4 were placed at Beat the drum. One of those placed at Beat the drum was transferred from Rhema children due to her status. They have already joined school together with the rest of the children.

January is generally a dry month, as a result of this we experienced water shortages, thus our farming projects were negatively affected. However we still have some home generating vegetable.

Dairy farming at Rehema and Tumaini is doing fairly well. We also have sheep farming at Rhema and Tumaini. Our prayer is to

have better water sources in future.

Our home managers met for the year strategy meeting to help create team synergy. We were able to discuss last year's achievements and also discussed on how to navigate through the challenges. We agreed on the standards and goals to set and achieve this year. Everyone in the team is committed to see the success of the department.

## GOA Foster Care

All our children have gone back to school. Through provision of our friends none of the children is not in school. Some of the children such as Anita Muthoni joined Grade 7 after their six grade exams last year. Anita Muthoni and her sister Ruth Wangui



were taken up by one of the GOA Foster family after they were abandoned by their parents due to poverty and desperation. Together with their brother Joseph Kamau joined GOA while they were very tiny kids, they were at the nursery level but right now, two of them did their sixth grade national exam and their baby sister who is waiting to do the sixth grade exam this year.

In the month of January, we supported 18 families with food, which will enable the children to remain in school. Having done this, we were able to support three families whose parents could not able to provide due to their health condition. We pray to God and appeal to our partners to help these families support themselves through Small business enterprises

## GOA HIGH SCHOOL

The School is celebrating an improvement in the National examination performance with a mean score of 3.63 up from 3.55 in the preceding year. There have been identified major areas of improvement that the teachers and together with the children and parents are working together to improve. The process of registering the candidates for this years national examination is already underway to be closed later in march. With the strong counseling and teams at the school the children have notably improved in their discipline and overall disposition. Later in the year the top classes Form three and four students will be going out on Geo-

graphical tours around the countries in addition to the other co curricular activities that the students shall be engaged in. These trips are meant to help develop our children. Currently we have a population of 70 students against 9 teachers attending to them. We look forward to greater performance this year as the Agriculture students begin their National Exam project later this month. We are grateful to GOA Switzerland for the New tuition Block that will provide space for our children studies and other programs after its dedication on 12 February 2023

We currently have 105 children. We look forward to growth in this number especially with the new school bus that can transport children from far places. Our teaching staff team of 8 currently handle the children with the need for more teachers due to the new Grade 7 introduced by the New Curriculum. In the past National Examination our children scored a mean score of 254.54, with room for improvement. With the introduction of the new curriculum

that focuses on developing the children our children will be involved in many school projects which require more financial resources. Our teachers are well equipped to help the children excel in their studies

## GOA NABWELPUS PRIMARY SCHOOL



The school was opened on 23/1/2023 for first term. The enrolment kept on increasing day by day and by 30th the enrolment was 98 despite hardship of drought and starvation in the whole region. The school got some food donations from Mary's Meals Kenya it's the one pushing both ECDE and Primary children. The school faces a n acute shortage of

classes with the growing number of classes. We have a total of 7 classes in the Primary School and two in pre-primary with only three rooms to be shared among the classes. The children also need food to keep them at school.

## GOA NAOTIN ADULT SCHOOL

The adult education Centre currently has over 40 learners. The adult learners have progressed very well with many of them exhibiting very good writing and reading skills. A few have expressed interest to register for the Kenya Certificate of Primary Education, KCPE that will be sat later this year. The learners however learn under difficult circumstances. Their only class was blown off by the wind leaving the m to learn under trees in different groups. With the growing number of classes and the leaners we also shave the need of an additional teacher to handle the different classes and different study subjects.

## MAINSTREAM MEDIA OPPORTUNITIES

With the rising cases of domestic violence and mental problems, it is of great importance that we join the conversation on how to address these problems. Our Director, Rev. Joyce Munyiri was at Muoroto Radio for a public discussion on these issues of domestic violence which

leads to killings in the families was done. Cases of suicide and homicide have been common in families leading to divorces and separation which leaves children suffering. Kiheo Tv also hosted Rev. Joyce on the discussion around the challenges of spouses of the ministers of the Gospel. These two programs have started conversations that our teams are handling and engaging the members of the public with the view of finding lasting solutions to family problems.

## Women Seminar

We held a 2 day seminar at GOA Mother Church, Ndunyu Njeru. A total of 86 women attended the seminar where we discussed topics of serving God and their families in a godly way in among many others.



During the service more emphasis was laid on listening to the voice of God as many are listening to many other voices. We climaxed the seminar with the launch of the blessed women Head scarfs for GOA

Women.

## Youth Seminar

A youth seminar was held during the month focusing on the young people joining colleges, the ones in college and universities. The session on self-awareness and self-esteem was taught among other topics covered. The planning was done together with the mentorship department, in order to help in the mentorship of the youths in these different categories





### Mental health awareness initiatives

Due to the rising trends in Mental problems among the members of our societies GOA peace teams are engaging the communities through mental health awareness initiatives. We have continued with our role of enhancing mental health through counseling. In our current environment, majority of the members of our communities are yet to have full knowledge of the needs they have for mental health awareness.

We however have members of the community that continue to find help with their difficult situations and are coping well and on their right tracks to recovery. We have targeted groups of young people within the community including young people who have been addicted to hard drugs and substance abuse as well as other elderly members of our community.



January being the Mentorship Month we set ourselves to mentor the younger generation. In a two day training for them. We addressed issues of mental health, educated them on the challenges that comes with the stage they are at, we also trained them on how to remain objective and manouvre the challenges.

Our team has engaged individual members of the community in counseling and therapy to help them recover from past traumas, effects of drug abuse. As a result the local authorities have embraced mental health as a key solution to the escalating vices in the community. More families and individuals are going through these sessions on their road to recovery and stability. More friends and partners and joining hands to help with issues of mental health.



### Network and Partnership



We seek to partner with like-minded individuals, groups, organizations, corporates, stakeholders and government offices among others. Building on what we began late last year, a couple of Kutoa- Project employees visited us. We continue to explore our areas of common interest and how we can complement each other in our roles.



Stewardship & Integrity

Glory Outreach Assembly, recognizes the importance of training and mentoring leaders to nurture equitable, just and peaceful communities. Just like Christ calls us to discipleship, GOA works with members to mentor and train leaders especially among youthful congregants who will take up the leadership mantle and sustain the future God-fearing and loving communities. In the leadership department, we help members discover, develop and deploy their spiritual gifts to help fulfil the great commission.

To realize the vision for leadership training and development, GOA works in partnership with International Leadership Institute (ILI), GOA Switzerland, Nairobi Pentecostal Bible College (NPBC) and Daily word feast foundation (CBR).



### History Makers Training

At the beginning of the year, our leadership training teams set the goal to train 300 leaders in History Makers leadership training. Through the grace of God we achieved 377 leaders were trained this month. A total of 2 History Makers Journey and 9 Module 1 Conferences were conducted during the month of January in

8 different nations a cross English and Swahilis speaking African.

### Bible College

The students at our main campus in Tharaka have continued to love the Biblical studies. Our Campus buildings have for a long times been in need of flooring to host our boarding students. The floor has been done for the first floor. The students were able to move the beds into the school compound and to free the rental rooms. The ground floor section has not yet been done. We trust God for the provision of funds for the whole building to be completely done and made suitable for learning and boarding. In addition to the students attending the class at the main campus in Tharaka, 25 more students are also going on with their studies at our satellite campus in Nairobi Kahawa Wendani church and Kinamba. The two classes will graduate in the course of the year and proceed to the next level of studies.

### Consistent Bible Reading classes (CBR)

Members of GOA congregations are excited to learn the discipline of Consistent Bible Reading. Two classes in Tharaka and Murera are among those running successfully looking forward to be commissioned in the course of the year with a total of 25, 15 in Tharaka and 20 at GOA Murera church.

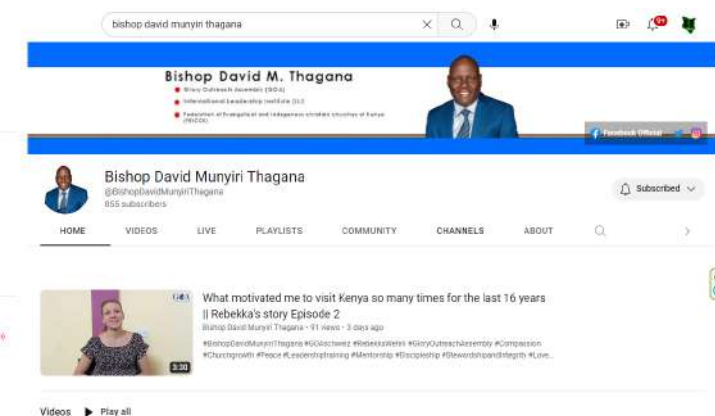


## Media and Communications

## GOA FINANCE REPORT

During the month of January the ministry had a total of 71 members of staff, 32 being in the children homes, 17 at the head office, 18 in the schools, 1 missionary based in Garsen located at the coast of Kenya, 2 staff working GOA Global University and 1 farm manager in GOA Githabai farm. We also have a bigger team of more than 200 pastors who serve in the churches and several volunteers working in the children orphanages.

### Financial Performance overview

January marks the beginning of the last quarter of the financial year 2022/2023. We are so grateful and thankful to God for the far we have come and the support we have received from our partners and friends. During the month, the ministry's income reduced significantly at the rate of 46.68% compared to the previous month of December. The significant change was as a result of the fact that we did not receive GOA US funds within the month but we have received them in February. During the month of December we received a lot of ILI funds that were to be used in training in the subsequent months

During the month we received a total Income of Kshs 9,877,373 which is a significant decrease from last month of December whose amount was Kshs 18,523,671.

### Income

During the month, we received funds for various projects in different departments. Stewardship & Integrity pillar received the highest at the rate of 33.35%, followed by Compassion at 19.57%, Volunteers at 16.23%, Admin at 10.23% & Discipleship at 9.8%, and Peace Building at 0%

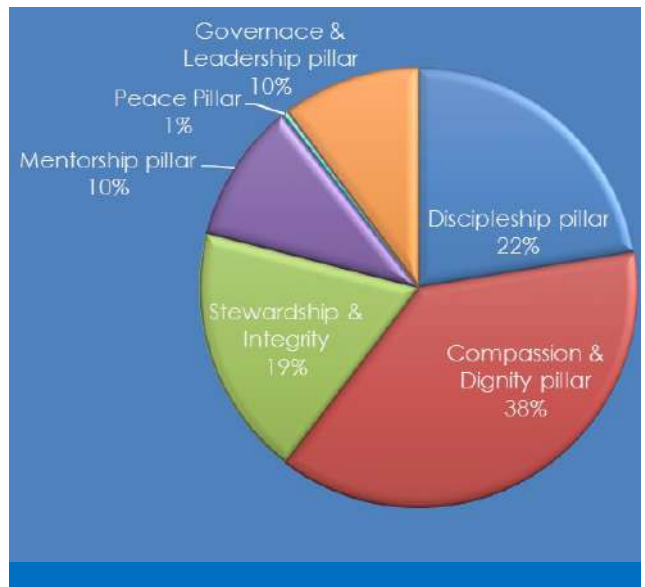

The ministry spent 24.15% of its resources in capital expenditure during the month. The rest were used to meet operating expenses.

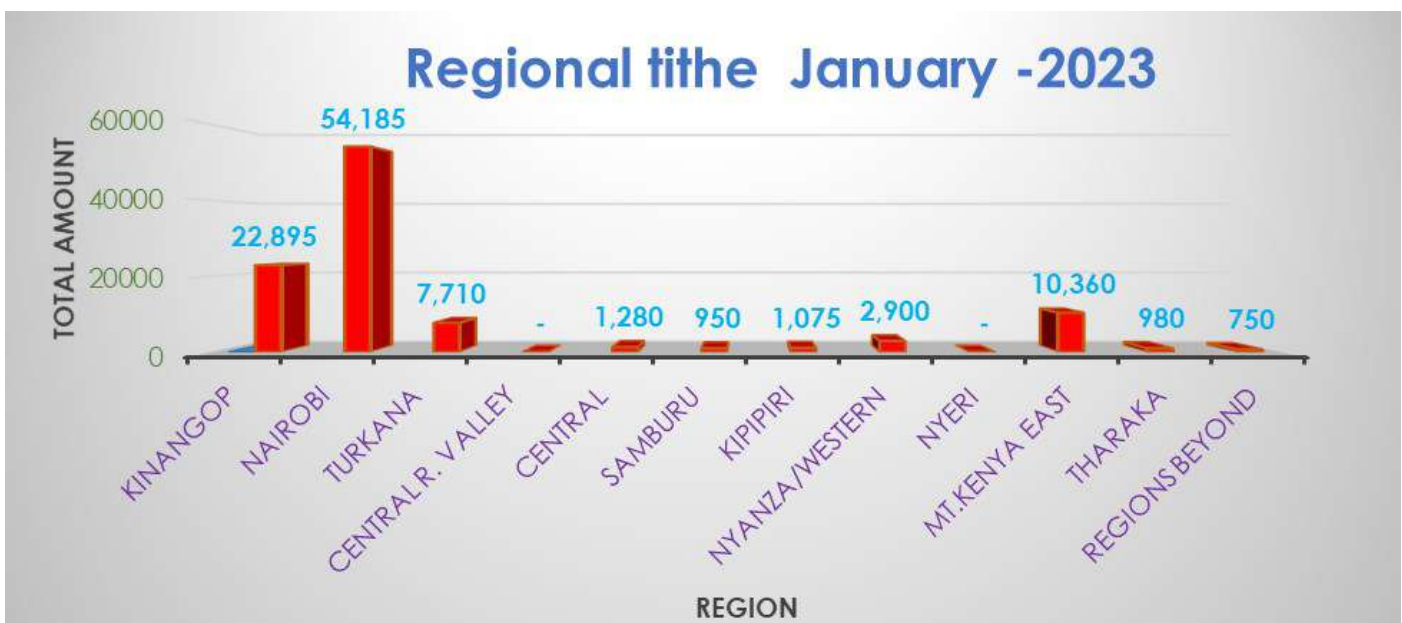

## TITHES FROM THE CHURCHES

Out of the 146 churches that are currently in our church register, 60 churches managed to send their tithes to the head office. This represents 41% of the total congregations. The total amount tithes received was KShs. 103, 085/. Our target for this calendar year is to receive a monthly tithes average of KShs. 150, 000/. We look forward to growth in the tithes from our regions for better ministry growth.



## SUSTAINABILITY PROJECTS PERFORMANCE

At the GOA Head Office the GOA sustainability team manages a several projects. The Mpesa mobile money business received a commission of KShs. 4380. Our rental café earns the office Kes 3500 per month while the Internet café had an income of Kes. 16,800. These projects are meant to help our admin teams become financially self sustainable. At the same time the sale of the water to support the dream Centre made an income of Kes. 9820. With projected growth in these project we look forward to have a self sustainable ministry that is able to meet their daily financial needs.

### Githabai Farm



Currently we have 1.5 acres of peas in the that we are planning to harvest soon. The other projects are performing well. However, we are experiencing a dry season in the region that has affected our yields. In December we sold two bulls at cost of KShs. 80,000/ funds that were deposited in the head office account.

Our rental house in Umoja estate generated an income of Kes. 42000. we look forward to renovate the houses for better habitation and services to our tenants to continue helping us through generation of income.

## BUILDING PROJECTS

We are very thankful to God for the infrastructure projects project. The dining hall project at Rehema is finally completed as well as the classrooms at Tumaini. These two projects will be officially opened on 11th and 12th February by the GOA Switzerland team. We thank GOA Switzerland for supporting these projects fully. At GGU school in Tharaka, works on the entire GGU building floor was started and is almost completed. This will enable convenient utilization of the facility especially by the boarding students.

It targets members of GOA churches and is open to the public. It is easier when people are empowered through accountability of their financial resources. In 2023 we seek to grow in a more robust way while making sure our members grow economically and achieve their goals through GOA Sacco.

Sacco members saved an accumulated amount of Kes. 352,720 in January with 5 new members joining the SACCO to build their financial future. At the same time the members servicing their loans paid back a n amount of Kes. 172,372 with newer loans being processed and issued to the members. With an overall interest income of Kes. 39,472 the SACCO team looks forward to growth in the SACCO business to empower the members to financial sustainability.

### The GOA Dream Centre

GOA Headquarters has continued to be a Centre of transformation to the community and the nations. From the Nairobi based headquarters GOA has sent Missionary teams to rest of the Country as well as oth-



er Nations including the troubled South Sudan. GOA Teams can do more sending with the completion of the GOA headquarters.

Through the generosity of the friends of GOA we have raised Kes. 7 Million. However the first phase of the project would need a total of Kes. 32,000,000. The project team is working on Government approvals and the requisite building permits to start the project soon.

GOA teams appreciate the friends and members of GOA who have continued to give generously towards the building of the Dream Centre.
