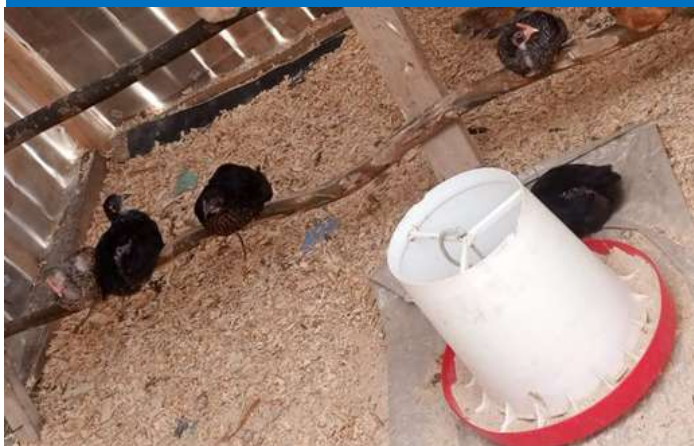

## Our children welfare



All our children have been enabled to be in school in the month of July. Majority of our children participated in ball games. with some of them participating up to county level. Three children were rescued and placed with us at Tumaini and Kieni respectively. We are happy to house each one of them.

## Farming projects



Most of the homes experienced drought during the month of July. This led to crop failure in many of our home farm

projects. In the month of June most of our homes experienced drought thus our crops failed. Thankfully some of our Homes such as Kieni, Tumaini and Rhema had their farms flourish due to the supply of water.

We launched the poultry farming project at Rhema childrens home. With this project the children will now have supply of proteins from the chicken and the eggs from their own farm. The dairy farming projects in Tumaini and Rhema have not gone without challenges. In Tumaini we lost one of our dairy cows that died after an illness while in Rehema the biting drought has caused shortage of feeds for the dairy cows. We pray for another cow for Tumaini as we pray for resources to help obtain the feeds at Rehema

July was a blessed month we had different local friends visiting our different homes. We received different gifts in kinds like foods stuff and cloths. We had a group of 100 people lead by Rev Millicent Matolo visiting beat the drum home. Other GOA homes were invited to the occasion which turned to be a get together. We treasure such relationship and look forward for many more.



## Happy at last



We are however thankful to God that through GOA Switzerland we have been able to install a better and powerful solar system. The system comprise of solar panels, batteries, inverter and other accessories. The system is working well and the home is finally out of darkness Through the support of GOA Switzerland we are also putting up a modern ablution block for the boys at Rhema home. This will go a long way to improve the hygiene of the boys at the Home.

### Please pray for our children

Some of our children are facing health challenges tha require specialized medication and your prayer. They include:

1. Marcus Macharia from Tumaini who has different health issues, recently he was advised to use eye glasses
2. Cornelius Muthui from Kieni needs surgery to remove a metal plate that was installed on his shoulder bone in 2019 after an accident at school. He’s scheduled to undergo the surgery during August holiday and it will cost Sh 80,000.
3. Grace Wahito from Kieno home underwent an MRI at Nyeri PGH Hospital in preparation for un upcoming surgery at the Kijabe Hospital to aadress issues with her spinal cord.
4. Zacharia from Beat the Drum with persisted skin condition was taken to Nakuru Provincial Hospital SKIN DEPARMENT where a specialist prescribed some medicines, he is improving and we hope for fully recovery.

- 1) Thanks, God, for the His continued supply towards the children needs as we also pray for their wellbeing.

- 3) Construction of toilet Strong tower,

- 8) Rerouting of electricity poles that were erected in the mid- dle of the road leading to Tumaini Home.

The students also took academic trips to Nakuru National Park. The academic trips are part of the exposures that help the students grow to understand what they learn in class and relate the same to their environment.

From Friday, 7<sup>th</sup> to Sunday 9<sup>th</sup> July 2023 we hosted students missionaries from different universities and colleges. They were studying different professions like, teaching, nursing, architectural, electrical engineering, law, counseling, IT, military and political science and music. Important topics covered includes: how to be a good Christian student. Gaining self esteem and career choice among others. Several life stories given encouraged many students. We look forward to growth in the spiritual lives of our children leading to their being productive and active Christian students

Due to the shortage of classrooms, the candidates as well as the other learners learn under the tree. They move with their portable blackboard to a favorite learning point throughout the day owing to the hot sun burning them in the classes. The school enrollment is currently 32 with two teachers, teaching two levels of the students.

The couples feel more loved after our team gave them a visit and encouraged them to keep together despite the hurdles they have to overcome.



### **GOA Homes support**

GOA Peace teams visited the GOA homes to talk with the children and staff on and encourage them as well as visit the children who are in schools. These visits to the children in the schools have been a very great encouragement to them as well as boosting their esteem among and encouraging them through the family love.





Our efforts this graciously showed the huge need our society has for mental health interventions; we therefore feel encouraged for the impact we will have. We actualized our plans to offer intervention and help to people struggling with addiction and substance abuse disorders. The program was officially launched at our headquarter church on 23<sup>rd</sup> of July during our Sunday service. As part of this, initiative, we are hosting two young men after they left rehab earlier in the month with aim helping them develop healthy and dependable coping mechanisms.

To further our efforts to assist people struggling with addiction and substance abuse disorders we pursued a partnership with alcoholic anonymous group with an aim to have such meetings in our premises. Our AA meetings run every Thursday between 5.30 and 6.30 seeking to help the people breaking their dependence on alcohol and other narcotic drugs.

### **We are in need**

In as much as our mental health initiatives are highly needed our teams are working with very little to produce much. With more funding we can get more effective teams reaching addressing the needs in the communities.

and Laikipia Centers was also in progress students attended the classes and were well attended to. The Consistent Bible Reading classes also went own at various centers with more than 50 students





The History makers training for Business leaders saw our teams equip 31 Christian Business leaders. The team of leaders is passionate about multiplying themselves through equipping other business people while embracing their business ventures as Gods tools to transform the world. As a result of the training the team has launched a movement of Business people that are inspiring entrepreneurship as a way of transforming the society with the Gospel. The team of leaders meet every week as a follow up meeting to pursue their set goals of mentorship of others and self actualization and growth.

## **Post Secondary**

Today we have a total of 65 students in colleges and universities. These students were encouraged and motivated to save Ksh. 400 each towards their future financial stability. This initiative aims to equip the younger generation with the tools and mindset necessary to achieve financial independence and responsible stewardship of resources. In the near future we look forward to add 20 more students to the program as they join institutions of Higher education. More support is needed for our teams to keep all these students in schools and grow them in their careers.

## **Mentorship and Empowerment Program for Business People**

On the 30th of July 2023, the department organized a mentorship and empowerment program specifically tailored for business people within the G.O.A community in Kahawa Wendani. This event was the starting point of the journey that our teams are walking with starting business people as we seek to empower them to sustainability.

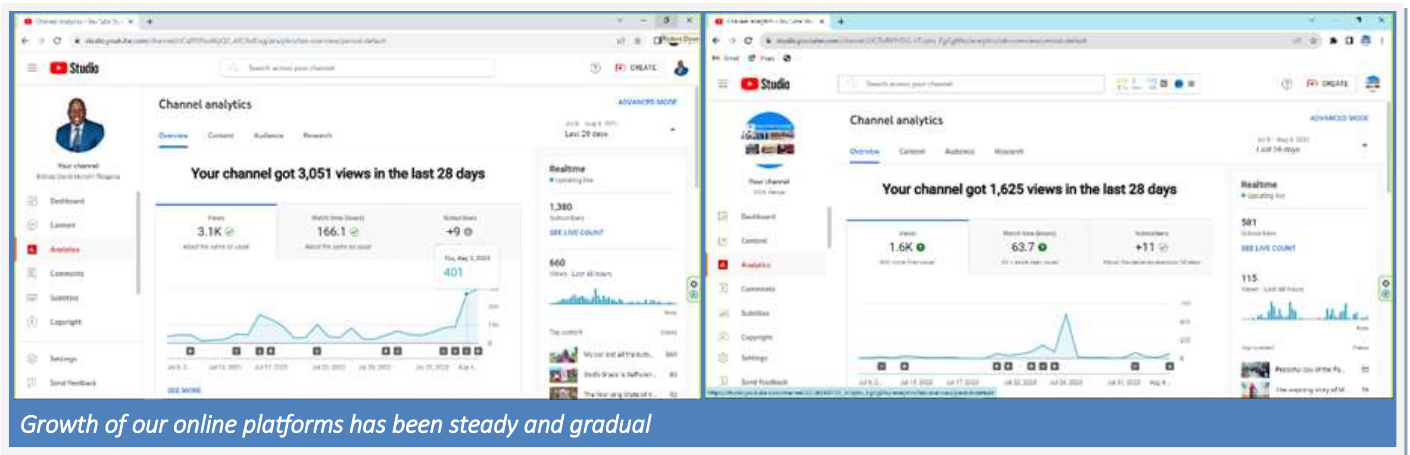

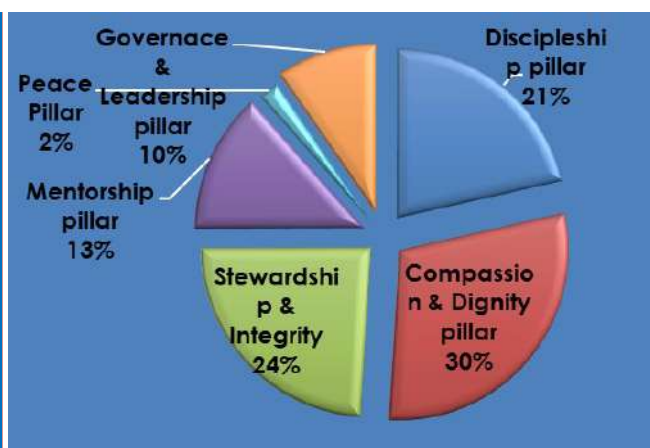

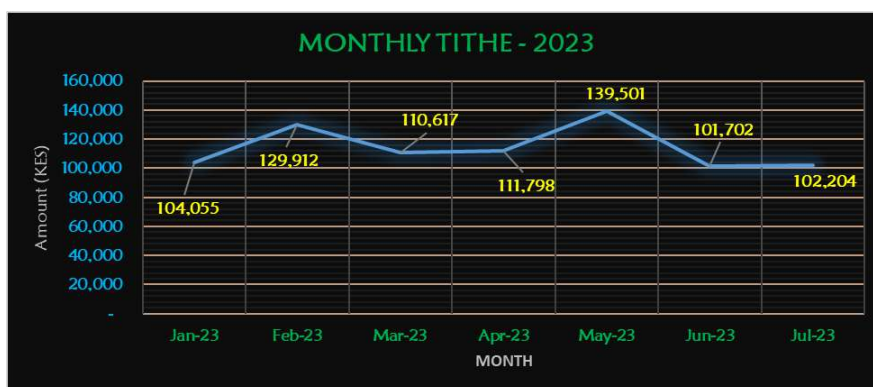

## Tithes from our Churches

69 of churches managed to send their tithes representing 79% of the total congregations. The total tithes received was Ksh. 102, 204/-. This represents 0.5% increase from last month's KShs. 101,702/ our target for this calendar year is to receive a monthly tithe average of KShs. 150, 000/.



## GITHABAI FARM



Farming activities are ongoing well at Githabai farm. Currently we are having 4 acres under cultivation. Two acres of cabbage and two acres of potatoes.

Our current need is a water borehole- it will cost **USD 37,500**

We are praying and believing in God for provision of resources needed for drilling and equipping a solar powered borehole at Githabai farm.

## Financial sustainability projects.

Is a top priority for our ministry as it enables us to effectively pursue our mission and create a lasting impact on the community. We have undertaken strategic initiatives with potential for sustainable income and long-term stability. These include construction of Guesthouse in Naivasha, developing Umoja House in Nairobi (Residential apartments), development of a Guesthouse in Tharaka venturing into commercial agriculture at Githabai Farm, and running several businesses at the head office such as M-Pesa shop, Hotel, cyber and selling water.

### The 3 M USD Guest House Vision

Our Ministry, committed to financial sustainability, plans to utilize our beautiful land in Naivasha to establish and operate a profitable guesthouse. This endeavor will not only create employment opportunities but also contribute to the economic growth of the local community.



### Our potential in Housing



Our plan involves constructing a five storey apart-

ment building in the prime Umoja outskirts of Nairobi, which will not only meet the increasing demand for quality housing but also address a significant market gap. This building will provide residents with high-quality housing options, generating consistent rental income for the Ministry. Upon completion, this investment is projected to yield a monthly income of KShs. 250,000 for the Ministry.

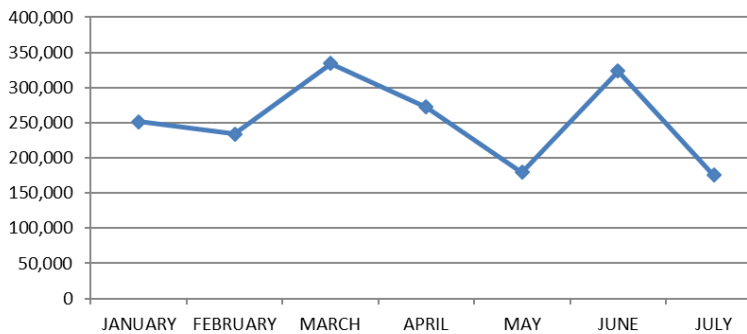

## TRENDS IN MEMBER SAVINGS FROM JANUARY - JULY

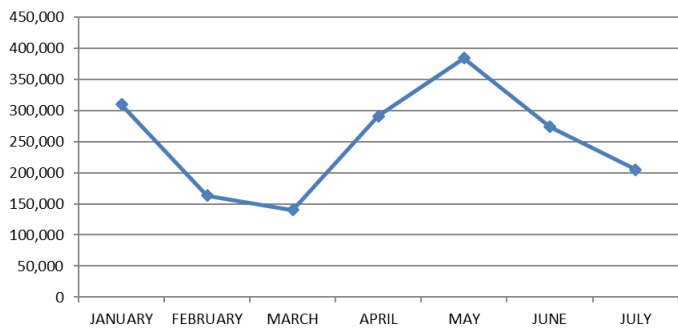

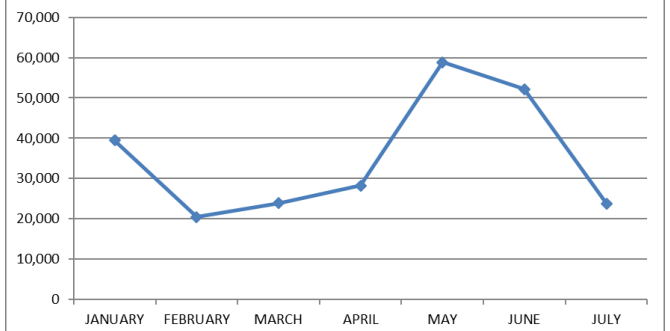
## SACCO CREDIT FACILITIES

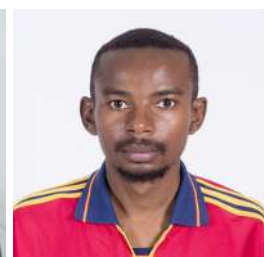

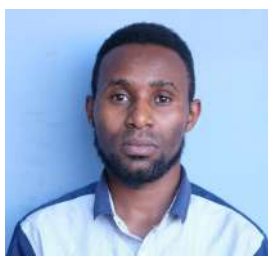
