EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR'S REPORT



Warm greetings from GOA Kenya teams. Through your support to the GOA teams we have been able to reach out to communities and individuals with the Gospel of Jesus. Stories of changed lives and transformed communities and celebration are growing here in Africa all because of your love and generous giving.

GOA Discipleship teams continue to reach to the communities with the Gospel through creative strategies. New congregations have been planted which continue to engage the communities through evangelism and discipleship. Many of these congregations planted in poverty stricken areas are faced with a lot of

challenges. Many continue to meet and worship in dilapidated worship structures while some meet under trees and are in dire need of your help to build a decent sanctuary. Through the Support of GOA church development partners ICM, three congregations are about to benefit with a permanent worship sanctuary. There remains close to 10 congregations that are praying and crying for such a gift. Would you love to partner with our teams to bless a community with a worship sanctuary? Please talk to our teams and learn the opportunities that are waiting for you to be a blessing.

GOA Compassion teams are taking care of close to 352 children in the homes. All our children have been well kept by our dedicated teams of caregivers by the Grace of God. All of them are in school and performing well in different areas of both academics and development of Gifts and talents. As they close home for the August Holiday we shall have more time with the m at home to help them grow in different areas and capacities as we nurture their talents and gifts. Through your support they receive well prepared and balanced meals. As the number of the children under our care grows we continue to pray that one day all of them will have a sponsor each to cater for their needs fully. At the same time the GOA compassion ministry director, Esther Muchiri is praying to God for the Gift of a ministry car that will help her reach all these homes to check on the staff and the children for their well-being. With Kes. 2,000,000 we shall gift Mama Esther Muchiri with a better ministry car that will go a long way in helping her serve these children better. Would you love to partner with us to make this dream happen before 7th September 2024?

The GOA Leadership teams have equipped leaders in five Africa Nations in the month. These teams of well selected influential leaders will be key in accelerating the spread of the Gospel around the Nations. While the leaders have joined the teams of History Makers globally, other teams of Pastors and church leaders are being equipped with Theological studies that will enable them teach the word better to equip believers. Rev Phylis the Director of GOA Stewardship teams is also the Pastor GOA Murera, a church that she planted during the Covid Season and nurtured to a mature congregation that is currently impacting Murera community. GOA Murera was built on a very small piece of land that has denied the church space to expand and offer better service to the community. GOA Murera is now raising funds to buy the piece of land that is next to the church premises. Today GOA Murera needs only USD. 10,000 to buy the land. EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR'S REPORT

The Country was thrown into turmoil by the young generation popularly known by their generation as the Gen Z.

The Nationwide spontaneous protests were sparked by the contentious finance Bill that introduced punitive taxa-

tion to the tax regime. Many of the young protestors were fell by the police and other security agencies as they

meted excessive force on them to try and suppress the protests to no avail until their demands were partly met by

the country's leadership. Many families lost very young productive members during these protests while many were

disabled by the brutality of the Government agencies. Our peace teams have worked tirelessly helping these fami-

lies come to terms with the losses which were too painful to bear. As a result of this turmoil GOA peace team has

been incorporated in the National Dialogue team that is charting the way forward for the formulation of govern-

ment policies that will provide leadership to the Nation. While our teams were out to help the nation get pieced up

together more needs in our communities have been growing and the GOA Peace teams have responded to all these

in a way of helping raise Godly generation of young people and grow peace. Please pray for our teams.

We are grateful for the support your financial support. Through your generous giving, GOA Teams received a sum of

10.7 Million Kenya Shillings for different Kingdom impact projects. These funds enabled us to keep all our team of

80 staff members in different projects serving with the right motivation and the running ministry projects were run-

ning well. We trust God for provision for all other projects that have not been provided for yet.

As we draw towards the month of September we are approaching the time when I will be travelling to the States for

my annual Kingdom building trip. There are many opportunities still open on my itinerary which is still work in pro-

History Makers Leadership training



Our teams had the goal to tran at least 300 leaders through ILI/HM in the English/ Swahili Africa Region. 375 Leaders were trained this month through ILI Program in five different nations, Kenya, Burundi, Zanzibar South Africa and Zambia

John Nyaga. After the completion students were given exams as an assignment to do it while at home and bring it for marking in the



next class which will start from 15th of July. The CBR class at the same venue had 9 students diligently following the course and gaining the discipline of reading God's word daily. In GOA Murera, CBR class continues every first Sunday of the month from 2-6p.m.

GOA EDUCATION

Syllabus coverage in all our schools is being achieved in good time. Each of the class participated in an academic trip. Form one and two went to Nairobi National Park and Kenya National Museum. Learning area included many subjects; Geography, History, Biology, Chemistry and Business studies, the students gained greatly.

Form three and four students participated in a trip to Nakuru Agriculture show and Trade Fair . They learned a great deal on agricultural machinery, animal and plant production and health. They visited KRA to learn about taxes and public finance, Co-Op Bank for banking and also visited several production processes rich in Business Studies topics. In the Kenya Bureau of Statistics they learnt about population in Geography among other areas.

Schools in the Unreached communities

The month of July had been busy with ball games competition. One of our pupils was selected and represented the school in football from the zone to the county i.e. Jarred Eloiloi grade 6.

Our teachers have been committed on duty enabling the month to go smoothly. The ECDE at Kaapokor is picking up due to our assistance in terms of feeding.

The school was closed on 1.8.2024 and the enrolment on closure at GOA NABWELPUS was at 79 at the end of July. At Nkirashi school the school was able to put up some temporary staff houses through fund raising. GOA helped in putting up a temporary kitchen. They were cooking from outside

Kenya Floorball Sport is in need

In the year 2015, a team of 11 Swiss coaches travelled to Kenya to introduce floorball. This was through a partnership with floorball4all International through the connection of GOA Switzerland

We are forever grateful for this sport that has impacted thousands of youths in Africa. The sport has helped us transverse Kenya with the good news of Christ with teams in slums, churches, children homes, communities and even schools. We have over 100 teams in Kenya. We have also gone overboard to other African Nations including Tanzania, Burundi, Malawi and Uganda. It has also opened International doors for our youths and leaders in other nations of the world.

There is an active league in Kenya and a national team with our sports coordinator leading the officially registered federation in Kenya. Kenya has since participated in the 2^{nd} and 3^{rd} African cup and has won the bid to host the 4^{th} African cup from 13^{th} to 15^{th} September 2024.

We invite you to support this vibrant team that won the 2nd African cup. The target is 10 nations with 6 nations having confirmed their participation. A proposal with more details is also available with a total budget of Ksh 5 Million

Post Secondary mentorship



We begin by expressing our deepest gratitude to our partners for their continued support. Your generous contributions have provided school fees, monthly upkeep, laptops, house rent, and other learning materials for 87 students currently enrolled in various colleges. This support is instrumental in equipping these young individuals to change the course of history, regardless of their backgrounds. We are preparing to support 29 students joining college in the September and January intakes. To support one student is only \$250 per month, covering monthly upkeep and school fees. Contributions of learning materials such as laptops are also welcomed.

Training for the youth

We brought together more than 50 students and young people from our churches to educate them on how to respond appropriately to LGBTQ issues as a Christian family. This training is significant for young people, helping them navigate contemporary



challenges from a Christian perspective. Our expectations are that as we churn this breed of young people into institutions of Higher education their influence will be felt among the rest of the youthful population and be agents of positive change.

The internship program has been very active this month with four students on internship



FINANCIAL REPORT

Leadership and Administration teams envision a ministry that operates under effective and efficient management principles, and an organizational structure that serves to ensure accountability at all levels of operations. During the month of July the ministry had a total of 80 members of staff, 35 being in the children homes, 19 at the head office, 23 in the schools,1 missionary based in Garsen located at the coast of Kenya and 2 staff working GOA Global University. We also have a bigger team of more than 200 pastors who serve in the churches and several local & international volunteers serving in the ministry.

Ministry activities funding

During the month, we received funds for various projects in the ministry. As a result compassion received the highest at the rate of 31.3%, Governance and Leadership at 25.2%, Stewardship & Integrity at 25%, Mentorship at 12.4%, Discipleship at 6%, and Peace at 0.1%.





We are so grateful that together we are able to transform the lives of less fortunate and vulnerable groups in our society. Through this support many leaders have been empowered through trainings that not only develop them spiritually as individuals but also those they serve. We thank God for His provision which has enabled us to construct many amenities that are impactful to the society. We look forward to doing more by Gods grace. Together we can walk and work together and achieve more.



For the past three decades, the GOA Ministry has largely depended on the generosity of donors to fund its programs. To mitigate the risks of this dependency, the Ministry has strategically embarked on income-generating ventures to foster sustainability and self-sufficiency. At the children's homes, initiatives such as crop cultivation and livestock farming have been established. These projects not only provide nutritional support for the orphanages but also equip the children with practical agricultural skills.



<u>GITHABAI FARM BREAKTHROUGH</u>

During the month of July we completed the completed drilling and operationalizing the Githabai water borehole.

Our next phase will be connecting community members with the water, even as we explore the opportunity of commercializing this water by bottling it to optimize the utility of this borehole. Due to fuel and equipment price fluctuations, there was an increase in the total cost by USD 3,488

LOCAL FUNDS MOBILIZATION



During the month of May, We received a total of KShs. 100,928/ which is a 24% decrease from the previous month's total of KShs. 133,302/. Our monthly target remains at Kes 150,000 which we are working together with our teams to achieve. Other sustainability projects that are already running at the Head Office are still showing signs of growth. They include the Internet Shop, The restaurant and the Umoja residential house. We pray for better days in our sustainability efforts.

ADMIN AND LEADERSHIP



We are excited about our upcoming project, The Umoja House, and are at a crucial stage finalizing the plans and obtaining approvals. Our goal is to begin construction this year and we are trusting in God to provide the resources and guidance needed. To move forward, we are seeking partnerships to help raise \$5,000 necessary for approvals so we can commence construction. The total cost of the project will be \$200,000, and once complete, the apartment complex with 10 units is expected to generate a monthly income of \$2,500. We invite interested partners to join us in this endeavor to create a valuable and impactful Ministry asset.

NAIVASHA BASED GUEST HOUSE

We are initiating a promising project within our ministry and seek your support and partnership.

Phase I of our multiphase project includes, Erecting a perimeter wall around a 2.2-acre property. Constructing a swimming pool



with accompanying changing rooms. Landscaping the designated area.

The outcome of Phase I is to create revenue-generating opportunities by leasing the pool, which is in high demand in our region, and utilizing the landscaped area for events like weddings, which are also expected to generate substantial funds. Proceeds from these services will finance the next phase of the project. The budget for Phase I is set

at USD 150,000. Our current financial target is to raise USD 50,000 to fund the construction of the perimeter wall and gate.







SACCO JULY TRENDS

The month of July in the Country was majorly characterized by political unrests. The youthful population led the Nation to rests the country to reject the finance Bill for the year 2024/2025 that had been passed by the parliament. The political instability in the country led to major disruptions in the business landscape in the country that led to suppressed saving power and loan uptake by the members as the risks were too high. SACCO business over the month of July was not very impressive. We are however looking forward to better times in the month of August and September as many business recover from the economic disruption. The total deposits made for savings in the month of July amounted to Ksh 149,076. This was a decrease from Ksh 172,044 in June. However, The amount paid back as loan repayment in the month of July was Ksh 269,663. This was an increase by Ksh 28,470 from June which had loan repayments amounting to Ksh 241,193.

Outlook for August

After constituting the management offices under the guidance from the Ministry of Cooperatives, we finally got the authorization from the government to upgrade our system. We will be implementing phase 1 of the upgrade which is installation and plugging in the upgrade to our current system while ensuring our data is not affected. We also plan to have a Sacco training for the officials in partnership with the Ministry. We hope this will help the management better direct the Sacco towards growth and ensure maximization of value for our members. We appeal to our members to continue being ambassadors by promoting and marketing the Sacco as that would mean increased revenue generation which in turn increases the interest they get and fully utilizing the benefit with numbers.
