We are excited for the gift of water in at Kieni home, the children can now enjoy fresh vegetables from the irrigated garden. Thank you so much for this invaluable gift. With the effects of the rising inflation rates and the cost of living, Our compassion teams are now in need of more financial support to keep the children in school and well provided for with the requirements and feed the children well. Many of our children are not yet sponsored, you can consider today to sponsor a child.

Leaders continue to be equipped to spread the Gospel. More than 200 leaders equipped with the eight core values and multiplying themselves is a great blessing. More Pastors and leaders are getting well equipped with theological training in our training centers in Tharaka, Laikipia and Nairobi. GOA's investment in equipping leaders to spread the Gospel was given a further boost through partnership with Global Servant Leaders team led by Rev. Carey Akin. A team of 24 leaders from different GOA Areas were well equipped to serve in their different areas more effectively.

More families are getting built to be strong building blocks of the society. Many are now smiling after what they thought was too difficult was addressed by our caring and listening counselors. The teams have been a strong pillar to the well-being of the GOA homes. Through regular counseling our children now have many of their unanswered questions addressed and with more peace in their hearts they can live life like any other without feeling the burdens of their pasts. Issues of mental health have raised to be a need that GOA Peace teams are now intentionally investing resources and time to help address. Building of permanent worship sanctuaries



GOA in partnership with ICM seeks to provide permanent places of worship in for communities that are in need. Currently we have four projects in progress. GOA Kinja in Kinangop and Nyasita in Nyanza Kiserian in Nairobi and Mutaranga in Tharaka regions are currently under construction. Closer to

15 more communities are in waiting for a permanent worship sanctuary. We pray for provision of funds.

Planting of new Congregation



GOA Masogo in Kisumu is was planted by the GOA Nyanza region team. The congregation has close to 20 members who regularly meet for fellowship and worship in a small temporary rented premise in Kisumu County

Discipleship and Baptism



Closer to a total of 50 people were baptized in different regions across the country. The Goa pastors and church leaders across the churches led the members into confessing the death and resurrection of Jesus through baptism.

Empowerment of GOA churches for Care reforms



GOA churches are preparing to become the centers of care for the needy members in the community. Most of these churches are however challenged financially. As a result our teams through Kingdom partnerships are have embarked on an exploration of strategies to financially equip the congregations to self-sustainability for care reforms and the needs of the congregations. These include

farm inputs that can help the members of the congregation venture into agribusiness. However the financial need for equipping these churches is enormous.

Prayer needs and priorities

1. We pray for provision of funds for the construction of the churches that are in dire need.
2. Many of our churches need to be financially equipped to provide care for the needy children.
3. Our Pastors in the unreached areas are in need of motorbikes for transportation. 10 Pastors are currently in need.

5. GOA Lodwar town church is raising funds for expanding the church which has grown in population.

During the month we rescued three children and placed them in two of our homes Kieni and Rhea home where they are being cared for by our compassion teams.

Farming projects



The gift of the borehole at Kieni children home has seen the home boost their farming. We envision

growing of different kinds of cabbages which we could also sell with time.

We constructed a poultry house at Rhema, our vision is to keep 100 chicken. The donation to do this is highly appreciated

Dairy farming at Tumaini and Rehema are in good progress despite the challenges that the projects face which together the teams are working on addressing. We look forward growing to full sustainability in our home through viable farming projects

Staff Development

The Compassion was able to organize and facilitate a leader's training at Ukombozi retreat Centre with donations from GOA Switzerland. From the Staff training we expect more motivated and informed care givers to care for the children in the homes as well as the community. In the year 2012 Kieni children home received children who were abandoned by their mother and locked in a rented house. The youngest kid was 3year while the oldest was 10 years. Efforts to trace the mother bore fruit last year when a lady was sent to the home to visit and establish whether we still house the children, who would later inform us that the Mother to the four children was a live and married with two other children. Finally, the mother, Jane, visited her children in the month of June. It was a great re-union. The children are David Kimani currently in class 8, David Kabara in Form one, Paul Migwi in form 2 and Mary Njeri in trade school.

GOA High School



The school has adopted a new learning model for our learners where students are given interesting discussion questions and are given time to discuss at a house level. The students then engage in a contest through presentation of their answers to the questions as they are awarded points. This model enhances knowledge and application of learned concepts in school and nurture teamwork in learning.

The Form Four Agriculture students are directly involved in taking care of their projects. The Second Milestone evaluation is currently being done and expected to be complete and submitted by the end of the month of July.

In this term the school participated actively in both internal and external ball games at multi-stages: Basic Block, Zonal level and Sub-County levels and did profoundly well especially in football teams.

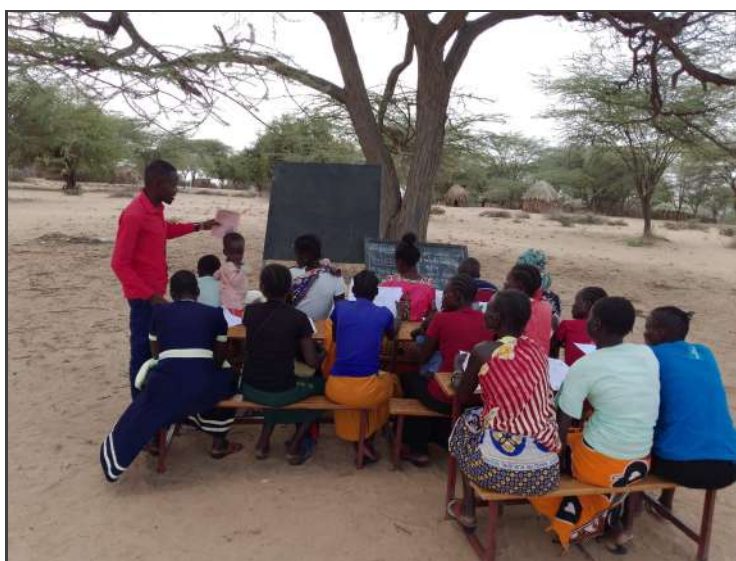
GOA Education Centre



Grade 3 KNEC CBC Project Started, the teacher was guided accordingly and was provided with all the requirements. We are expecting Projects for Grades 4-7 early July. Class 8 and JSS Students went for the trip; the children visited Nairobi CBD, Museum, Animal orphanage and Safari walk. The other classes will be going for their trip in the course of July.



Through the 4K club movement, the children have learnt to do farming and have grown crops like water melons and vegetables within their dry school compound. The school has continued enjoying the yields from the farm. The school has embarked on planting trees in the school compound. We look forward to see a change in the environment. The school however continues to suffer lack of food for the children which keeps most of them away from school. The school also needs a perimeter fence around school compound which would enhance security and keeping off animals from destroying the crops. More crops will be planted since the school has piped water. The school is still struggling with learning spaces since the classrooms are not enough.

Two potable blackboards were bought for the school. The school enrollment is at 32. The candidates are being prepared for the KCPE exam at the end of the year. The school has two teachers, teaching two levels of the students.

The school is still learning under the trees since their class broke down.

Leadership Training



Glory Outreach Assembly, GOA, recognizes the importance of training and mentoring leaders to nurture equitable, just and peaceful communities. Just like Christ calls us to discipleship, GOA works with members to mentor and train leaders especially among youthful congregants who will take up the leadership mantle and sustain the future God-fearing and loving communities. We help our members to discover, develop and deploy their spiritual gifts to help fulfil the great commission. To realize the vision for leadership training and development, GOA works in partnership with International Leadership Institute (ILI), GOA Switzerland, Nairobi Pentecostal Bible College (NPBC) and Daily word feast foundation (CBR).

History Makers Leadership training



Our teams had set the goal of training at least 300 leaders through History Makers in English/ Swahili speaking Africa. A total of 222 leaders were equipped with the eight core values in Kenya and Malawi.

Bible and Theology Training



A total of 52 students are in progress with theological training in Three Centres, Tharaka, Kahawa Wendani and Kinamba in Laikipia. The first groups in our satellite Centres in Nairobi and Laikipia finished the Level one training and started level two training at the same centers creating opportunity for new enrolment for level I students.

Consistent Bible Reading classes are also in progress in Tharaka and Murera Church. Four Bible readers were commissioned at GOA Kahawa Wendani paving way for a new class to start in August to equip believers with the discipline of Bible Reading.



Global Servant Leaders Conference 2023

The GSL seminar took place from 19-22nd June at Ukombozi retreat Centre. 18 participants from the group that was trained last year gathered on 19th for follow up and fellowship while a new group had 24 participants with representation from 7 GOA administrative Regions and 3 children homes. It was a life transforming experience and the participants gratefully appreciated the facilitator pastor Carey Akin for the great training.

Out of the total 10 students will have completed the courses and will be graduating within different months within the year.

Successful zoom fellowships with post-secondary brought together a total of 23 students participated. These fellowships continue to spiritually equip our students as they all move towards being young people who are firmly grounded on the foundation of God's word.

Our team in partnership with GOA Switzerland has embarked on developing a curriculum that will help disciple the young people in our churches and homes. With this curriculum we shall help the young people in our churches grow in their Spiritual walk of faith.



Sports Ministry

The Kenya Rollball Teams for both men and women won the world titles during the world cup games held in Pune India from 21st to 26th April 2023. GOA ministry has invested heavily in Rollball right from its inception by even fully sponsoring the team to East African games and African games in 2017[Uganda] and 2015 [Malawi] respectively. The GOA Rollball team and church members make more than a third of the Kenyan National Team. The team brought the trophies to church on 30th April where they were received by Bishop David Thagana.



Moses Atenya and Angela Kithinji were crowned the most valuable players in the world games in the men and women category respectively. Both Moses and Angela play for the GOA Rollball Teams in the National League.

June marks the end of the first quarter of our financial year 2023/2024. We thank God that we have begun the year on a high note with the ministry having partners who visited the country to see and experience some of the projects that we have. Compared to the previous month of May, the ministry's income reduced significantly at the rate of 49.6%. During the month we received a total Income of Kshs 10,249,630 which is a decrease from last month of May whose amount was Kshs 20,673,614.

Financial Income for the month of June 2023

During the month, we received funds for various projects in the ministry. As a result compassion received the highest at the rate of 49.4%, Governance and Leadership at 19.58%, Mentorship at 16.94%, Stewardship & Integrity at 7.43%, Discipleship at 6.36%, and Peace pillar at 0.29%.

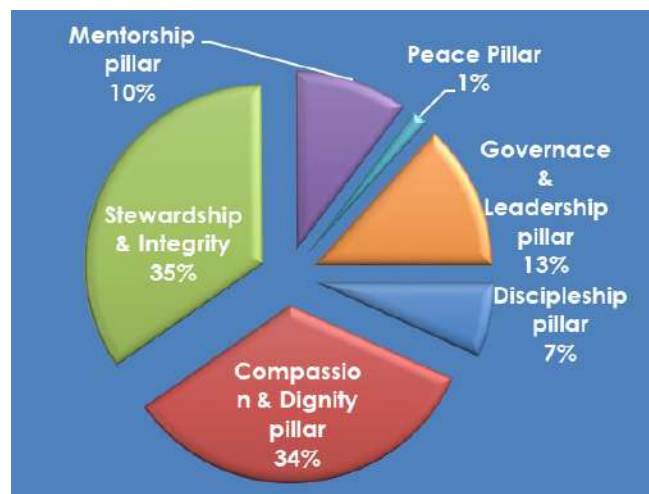

Overall ministry Expenditure

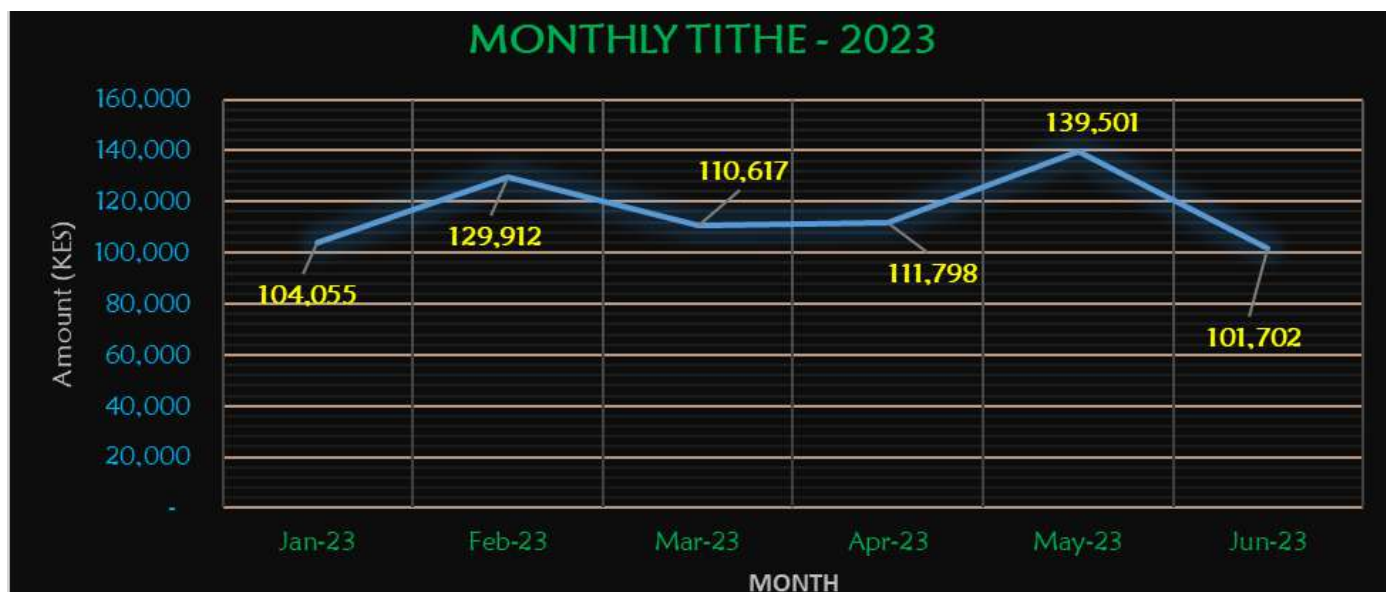
The ministry spent **2.28%** of its resources in capital expenditure during the month. The rest were used to meet operating expense.

Tithes from our Churches



71 churches managed to send their tithes to the head office. This represents 49% of the total congregations. The total amount tithe of tithe received was KShs. 101,702/. This represents 27% decrease from last month (KShs. 139,501/) our target for this calendar year is to receive a monthly tithe average of KShs. 150, 000/.

Githabai Farm

It was truly heartwarming to have had the privilege of hosting several partners on our farm throughout the month of June. This period offered us a valuable opportunity to reflect upon our partnership journey and explore ways to maximize the potential of our land. Among the esteemed guests were members of A Child's Hope International team, led by Doug Peters. A child's hope International through Dough Peters has offered tremendous support to Githabai farm to where the farm has reached so far.

Later on in the month Jeff Herdman together with his family paid a visit to the farm. During the visit the family donated a 10,000 liter tank that will be of great help in irrigating the farm maximizing the farms production. Our current need is a water borehole- it will cost USD 37,500

The 3 M USD Guest House Vision

Our Ministry, committed to financial sustainability, plans to utilize our beautiful land in Naivasha to establish and operate a profitable guesthouse. This endeavor will not only create employment opportunities but also contribute to the economic growth of the local community.



Our potential in Housing



Our plan involves constructing a five storey apart-

ment building in the prime Umoja outskirts of Nairobi, which will not only meet the increasing demand for quality housing but also address a significant market gap. This building will provide residents with high-quality housing options, generating consistent rental income for the Ministry. Upon completion, this investment is projected to yield a monthly income of KShs. 250,000 for the Ministry.

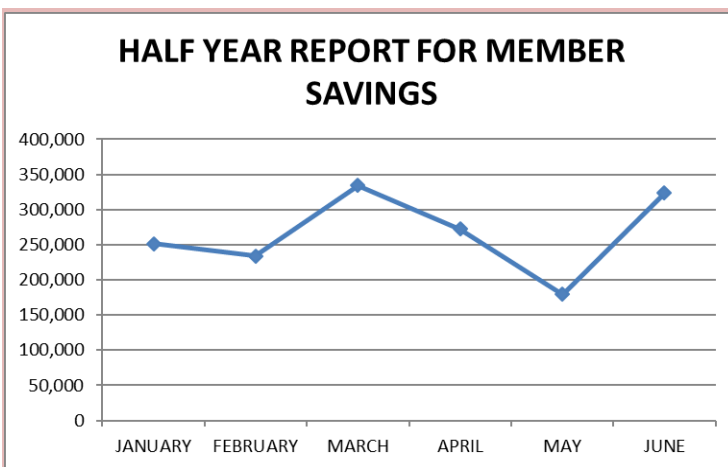

SACCO Members Savings

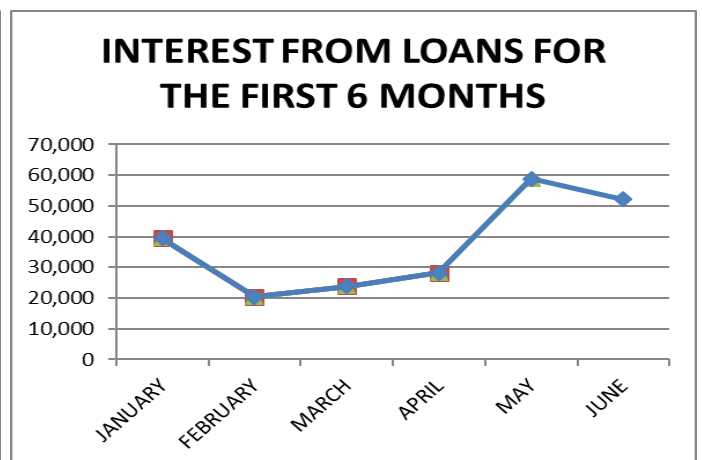
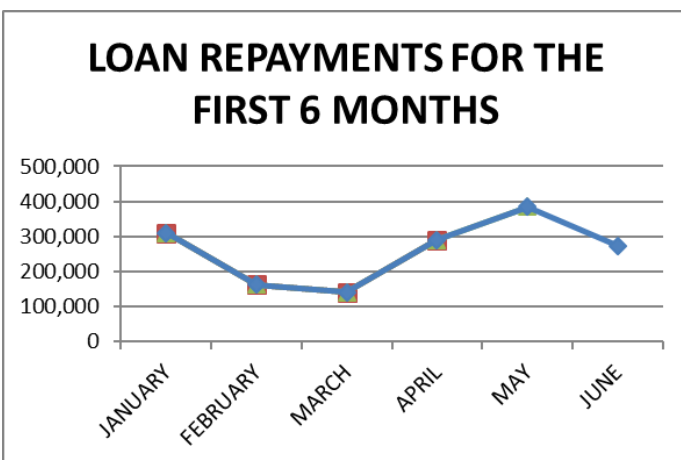

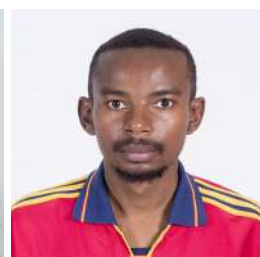
