Please receive the greetings of Our Teams in Kenya, Africa and the entire globe. From deep within our hearts we are glad and equally excited at the power of your friendship and partnership that has brought about so much transformation. Our teams are glad. As we came to the close of the first quarter of the current financial year, we could only celebrate the results of partnership and how much we have been able to achieve in the first three months of the new financial year, as we pray for provision for what has not been achieved yet.

Church planting is one of the most effective forms of evangelism that GOA teams have adopted across the Nations and regions. With a church planted within a community the Congregation leaders reach out with ease into the community. However some of the communities in which GOA has planted churches are so disadvantaged that they are not able to build a worship sanctuary for themselves. Many worship under trees exposing them to adverse weather conditions. During the hot sun or rainy season these congregations face difficulties gathering for worship. We are glad that through the partnership with our church development partners three congregations are currently in the process of getting a permanent worship sanctuary. GOA Siro and Ondati in Nyanza and GOA Kibukwo in Rift valley have through the Funding of ICM began construction of new worship sanctuaries. At the same time more believers are being disciplined and baptized around different GOA congregations and growing in Spiritual Maturity.

The month of June offered compassion teams an opportunity to celebrate the power of Kingdom partnership. For a long time our children and the team at Kieni home have prayed for a new dormitory for the children after the old dormitory cracked and posed great danger to the children. We gladly dedicated the finished dormitories for the boys and girls at Kieni home on 30<sup>th</sup> of June. The new dorms will host all the children in a decent environment together with the staff. We appreciate the friends and partners from GOA Switzerland who sacrificially generously gave towards the construction of the dormitories for the children. Thank you so much. Meanwhile our homes are putting in all efforts towards becoming food sustainable through gardening which at the same time is helping us provide balanced diets for the children.

The Nation of Kenya is going through a difficult time with the young people in the country initiating a revolution that seeks to hold the country's leadership accountable for the resources and decisions they make. This has led to a series of spontaneous protests that have been held around the country opposing the government's punitive tax regime and poor leadership. More than 40 young people have lost their lives through these protests as the police responded to the peaceful protestors with excessive force. With the protests running week after week so much is about to be lost. Please pray for Kenya as you pray that GOA teams will keep the courage of addressing the issues affecting the Country, and holding the country's leadership to account.

Our leadership training teams on the other hand are keen to invest in leaders that will lead with integrity. This response to the need in the leadership gap in the Nation is seen as one of the sure ways of addressing the leadership gap in the country and the continent of Africa. More leaders are being equipped to leader with compassion and Godly values. Pastors, Business community leaders and national level leaders from six African countries have been equipped with the eight core values while more are being equipped through the GOA Bible School to rightly divide

the word of truth. As a result the churches are growing more spiritually healthy and the communities similarly becoming transformed. We appreciate our friends and partners for the support to our leadership teams. We are seeing results.

Our staff's team is well motivated amidst the difficult economic times that we are going through. Our team of 80 staff members spread across the different GOA institutions is highly motivated by the transformation of the lives that your partnership is helping us to achieve. Our homes, schools mission teams as well as the GOA Head Office management staff team all send you their heart felt gratitude. Through the funds you give generously different GOA projects are moving on well. We have so many that have not yet received funding. Please pray that God opens doors for such that we may celebrate God together.

GOA Teams are still responding to the emergency needs and the victims of the floods that rocked the country in the recent past. Many of the victims that got settled in camps have no one to run to since the government is overwhelmed with such needs. With your support to GOA Hope for Nations we are able to help the victims get their daily meal, a place to sleep and also a hope for a better tomorrow. Please consider a generous gift to GO Teams for these families.

The GOA Dream centre remains a top priority for GO Teams. Please keep praying with us that the resources needed for this project will be available for us to start work on it. ## Empowerment of GOA Regional Teams

## Celebration of the work of ministry in Garsen

We similarly celebrated the ordinations of four Pastors from GOA North coast Region. As the region celebrates 13 years since it was birthed, four regional leaders were empowered to lead the region to reach the Coastal tribes with the Gospel. Rev. Lydia

will serve as the regional administrator, Pastor Luke Ngali will be serving as the regional Youth and Sports Director, and Pastor Esther Wangari will be serving as the regional children ministry director. Pastor Angel Mwanahali will be serving at Gumba church.

## Building of GOA Churches

During the month of June we launched two ICM funded building projects in Migori County Nyanza region. The two projects GOA Siro and Ondati received funding from our Church development partners after waiting for a while. The third project GOA Kibukwo in Nandi County of North Rift Region started in the month of June. The GOA Regional leadership teams are in charge of these projects working together with the local churches and the Head Office team for proper accounting of the projects.

husband abandoned the family after their last child was born. Irene has no stable job and depends on daily menial jobs to provide for her seven children. As a result of her tough situation, her first born son dropped out of school to help provide for the family. The family is living in a small, congested single room in the informal settlements of Githurai 45. Many times she is not able to raise her monthly rent of Kesh 1500 for her family house. There are more families like this in the community whose children do not have hope for a meal at home or school. Gloria Lunchbox only helps a few of these children to get lunch at school. With Kes 15 you can provide lunch for a child in a day and save him from hunger that beats him from home to school. 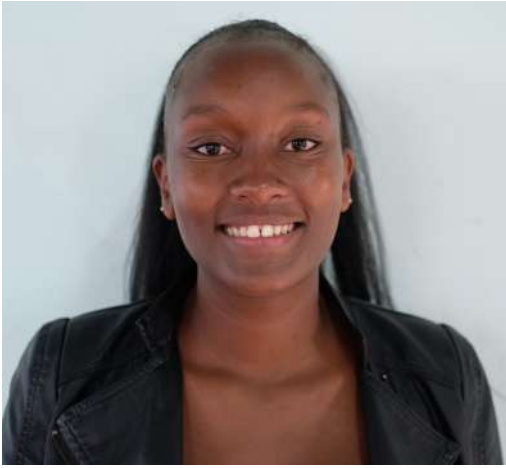

## **History Makers Leadership training**



Our teams had set the goal of training at least 300 leaders through History Makers in English and Swahili speaking Africa. The teams equipped 339 leaders through History Makers training leaders. 11 conferences held in 6 different African Nations were key in equipping the leaders with the eight core values of effective leaders

## **Bible Theology training**

June class begun on Monday 17th afternoon with 27 students. They did Bibliology course with the facilitator being John Mbiti. After the completion students were given exams as an assignment to do it while at home and bring it for marking in the next class which will start from 15th of July. The CBR class at the same venue had 9 students diligently following the course and gaining the discipline of reading God's word daily. The class in Kahawa Wendani Moves to the next level starting July 2024. three classes will be running at Kahawa Wendani Concurrently with a new certificate class set to start in July.



GSL training is currently taking good progress at Kahawa Wendani through home cell at GOA Wendani: The training focuses on equipping leaders to be servant leaders serving from an overflowing relationship with God.

## GOA KINANGOP SCHOOLS

The Students and teachers alike in all the GOA schools are committed towards academic excellence. In many of the classes, the Syllabus coverage has been done very effectively with the students in embarking on intensive revision exercises. Form four candidates are preparing to sit their National Exams at the end of the year while the rest of the students are preparing for the assessments. The GOA schools in Kinangop had a privileged of hosting a team of seven Swiss teachers on internship. The teachers have left lasting impacts among the children and the staff alike through their teaching experience and interactions alike. Through their efforts the team took the students and the staffs on different outings enabling each of the groups to experience a difference and learn more from mother Nature. These came at the right time when we were eagerly looking for funds to take our children for Geographical learning trips and teachers alike. During their time at the complex they equally took part in the culture celebrations with the team at the education centre. We thank the team together with our staffs at the school for the great work well done. With a total of 226 children in Pre and Primary schools and 110 in High School we are now running in need of more classrooms to accommodate the children to learn comfortably

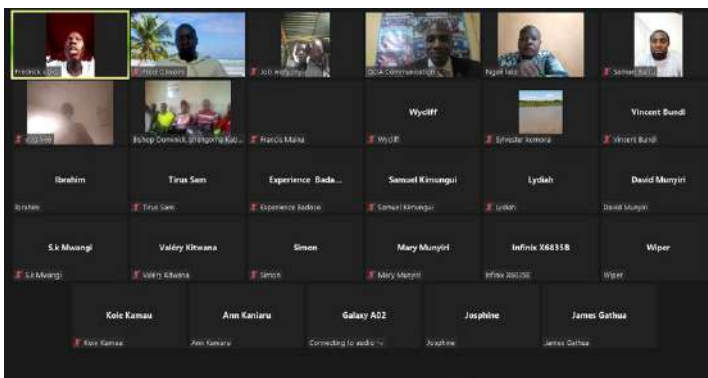
## Youth Mentorship

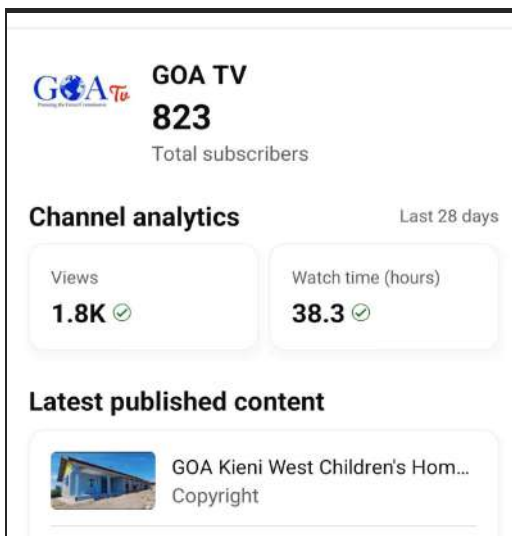

June marks the end of the first quarter of our financial year 2024/2025. The ministry has experienced tremendous support from friends and partners both financially and through prayers. It is during this first quarter that the nation experienced floods in the month of April and the aftermath was displacement of people from their homes and several people died during this period. As a result the ministry intervened and assisted a lot of people who were either seeking shelter in neighbours' homes, schools or camps. This had a huge financial effect and we thank God for the partners who came

through for the ministry during this period. During the month of June the ministry had a total of 80 members of staff, 35 being in the children homes, 19 at the head office, 23 in the schools, 1 missionary based in Garsen located at the coast of Kenya and 2 staff working GOA Global University. We also have a bigger team of more than 200 pastors who serve in the churches and several local & international volunteers serving in the ministry.

### Our Financial Performance

During the month, we received funds for various projects in the ministry. As a result compassion received the highest at the rate of 38%, Stewardship & Integrity at 35.7%, Mentorship at 12%, Governance and Leadership at 10%, Discipleship at 4.2%, and Peace at 0.2%.

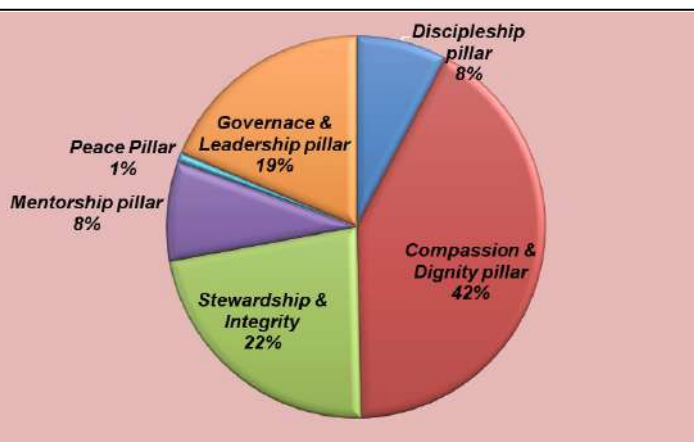

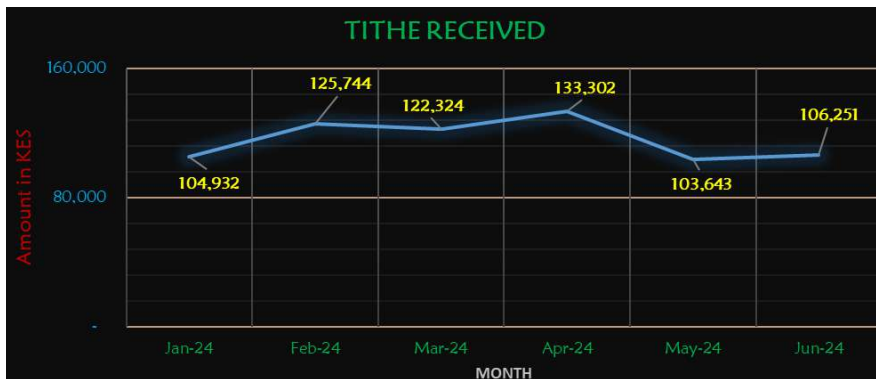


### GITHABAI FARM BREAKTHROUGH

Drilling of the borehole at the farm has been a success. We have successfully installed a solar system that will provide power to run the bore hole saving on the operation costs. The next phase of this project includes construction of a water tanks stand, installation of irrigation system and connection of the water to the neighbouring community. Having this water borehole will result to great impact not only to our farm but also the community around. We really take this opportunity to thank ACHI for this generous support. Githabai

Sheep farming is a promising venture at this point our teams Currently we are seeking to raise **KShs. 500,000/** initial investment to help us purchase 50 sheep this viable project that we are undertaking.

### LOCAL FUNDS MOBILIZATION



During the month of June, We received a total of KShs. 106, 251/ which is a 3% increase from the previous month's total of KShs. 103,643/. During the last 6 months we have received a total of KShs. 696,196/ averaging at KShs. 116,033. The average number of churches that sent their tithes was 72 churches. Our other business ventures that are domiciled at the GOA Head Office are also growing with trickles of income coming in. All these are meant to help the ministry meet the administrative costs of the daily ministry business. We pray that each of them see light od day.



We are excited about our upcoming project, The Umoja House, and are at a crucial stage finalizing the plans and obtaining approvals. Our goal is to begin construction this year and we are trusting in God to provide the resources and guidance needed. To move forward, we are seeking partnerships to help raise \$5,000 necessary for approvals so we can commence construction. The total cost of the project will be \$200,000, and once complete, the apartment complex with 10 units is expected to generate a monthly income of \$2,500. We invite interested partners to join us in this endeavor to create a valuable and impactful Ministry asset.

### **NAIVASHA BASED GUEST HOUSE**

We are initiating a promising project within our ministry and seek your support and partnership.

Phase I of our multiphase project includes, Erecting a perimeter wall around a 2.2-acre property. Constructing a swimming pool with accompanying changing rooms. Landscaping the designated area.



The outcome of Phase I is to create revenue-generating opportunities by leasing the pool, which is in high demand in our region, and utilizing the landscaped area for events like weddings, which are also expected to generate substantial funds. Proceeds from these services will finance the next phase of the project. The budget for Phase I is set

at USD 150,000. Our current financial target is to raise USD 50,000 to fund the construction of the perimeter wall and gate.

We believe this project is a strategic and viable venture that promises Ministry's financial sustainability. To realize this vision, we invite you to join us as a partner in this endeavor. With your support, we can lay the groundwork for a project that serves and uplifts our community for years to come

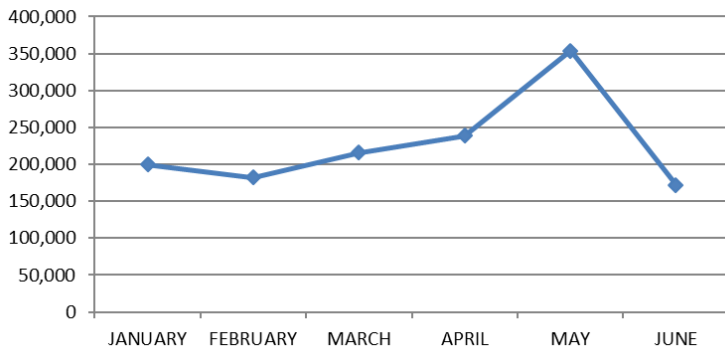

## TRENDS IN MEMBER SAVINGS FOR THE 1ST HALF - 2024



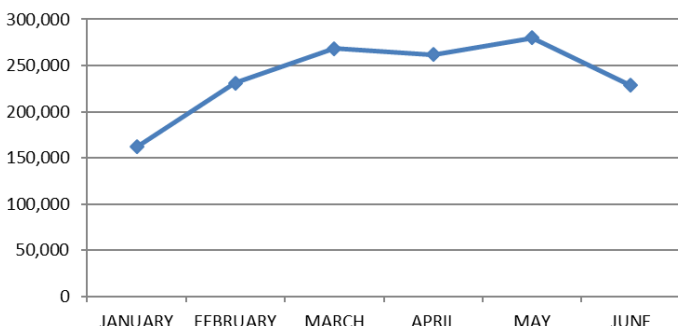
### Members Saving Trend

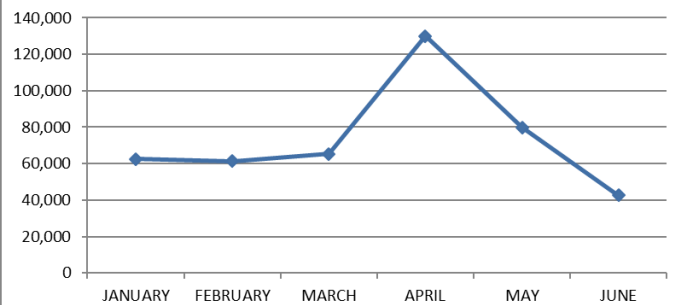
## SACCO CREDIT FACILITIES

In the month of June SACCO issued new loans to members in the amount of Kes. 804,000. The members are investing in businesses while other are undertaking their family development projects. The amount paid back as loan repayment in the month of June was Ksh 228,690. This was a decrease by Ksh 51,547 from May which had loan repayments amounting to Ksh 280,237. These loan repayments amounted to an interest income of Ksh 42,690 which was a decrease from Ksh 79,950 in May which was a drop by Ksh 37,260.

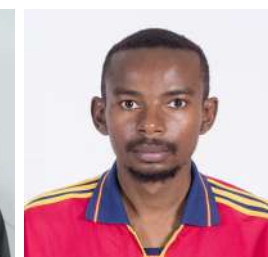

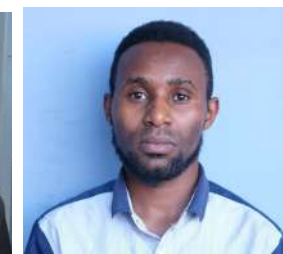
