New churches have been planted to reach more people with the Gospel. They are led by a team of committed pastors and church leaders. Though they may be worshipping in makeshift structures the power of God still moves in their midst and the lives of the people and transformed. Believers have been baptized and children dedicated around the With your support we can help a community church build a sanctuary and start a project to help them raise funds to help the orphans and the needy in their communities.

The GOA Compassion children in the homes have closed schools. Many of them are now with their guardians while some that do not have a any other place to call home have remained with our care givers in the homes. Many of the children who have gone to stay with their guardians face so many challenges. Some of the homes lack basic needs such as good housing, bedding and sanitary facilities. In many cases they are struggling with provision of food for the children as a result of the poverty levels in the families. This has motivated our Compassion teams to start the process of preparing these families through economic empowerment as we move towards the new child care reforms. Empowering a family with a cow, chicken or goats will enable them generate income to provide for their needs and care for the needy children in the community. In the meantime as we still keep the children in our homes we are determined to provide better care for them. The upcoming modern dormitory at Kieni home is one of the projects that will help us care for our children better. All this is achieved through Kingdom partnerships. Thank you for empowering our compassion teams to serve the orphans

EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR'S REPORT

Our leadership teams set the goal to train 300 leaders in the month of August but by the grace of God went beyond the 300 target leaders to equip more than 500 leaders in 8 different countries around African. I More pastors and church leaders are getting equipped with theological training to instruct their congregations with the word of God with an accurate understanding of God. Please keep praying for these leaders to multiply and reach more leaders to be equipped for the work of ministry.

More families are getting built to be strong building blocks of the society. Many are now smiling after what they thought was too difficult was addressed by our caring and listening counselors. The teams have been a strong pillar to the well-being of the GOA homes. Through regular counseling our children now have many of their unanswered questions addressed and with more peace in their hearts they can live life like any other without feeling the burdens of their pasts. Issues of mental health have raised to be a need that GOA Peace teams are now intentionally investing resources and time to help address. Please support our peace teams to be able to actualize their goals of peaceful communities.

While we were away the devil also tried to execute his John 10:10 mission of stealing, Killing and destroying part of our team but he was late Again. Jesus' mission of giving life in abundance prevailed again. Hallelujah!! Rev. Phyllis Githaiga, the GOA, director of leadership and the ILI coordinator for East and Southern Africa was driving her car back to Nairobi from a very successful peace building mission in Laikipia where tribes have been fighting. In her car was Simon Ndirangu (GOA mental health Champion, brought up at Tumaini children's home), Samuel Kairu (GOA Media director, brought up at Tumaini) and Joseph Kago (GOA Sacco and Head office manager). They had a serious head on collision with another car. They all sustained serious injuries. The car that Phylis was driving was damaged beyond any repair. We successfully completed and dedicated GOA Nyasita church in Siaya County built in partnership with ICM. We have three

more church projects are in progress that we look forward to dedicate before the end of the year.



Building of permanent churches

The ICM church building projects that are underway are all making good progress. With the congregations raising more funds the churches will be completed and dedicated soon. The communities will soon have permanent sanctuaries to worship in. GOA Kinja, Mutaranga and Kiserian are in the last phases of construction.

Priorities and prayer needs

- iv. Provision of funds for the registration of the Pastors and the church leaders for the upcoming Leadership Summit.

A drip irrigation kit was installed at CCRC, we look forward to having green vegetables through the year. Rains also came down in down parts of Kenya giving us hope for better results from our farms.

Child welfare

Last Simon Kyalo from CCRC home had been admitted at Kangundo hospital. He was discharged and is recovering from home, and attending weekly clinics at the same hospital. Similarly Joseph Gitau from Tumaini who was diagnosed with bipolar mood disorder. He is home recovering as we explore better ways of helping him equip himself at the Polytechnic where he is currently undergoing career training. We are also grateful that one of our boys from Tumaini home, Benjamin Ndung'u who had swallowed a nail accidentally is now well after the nail found it's own way out, bringing an end to the long suffering of the boy, the staff and his colleagues. Please keep praying for our children and compassion care givers.

Parents Home visit



We continue to experience and feel the desperate environment that most of the guardians to our children are living in. Some of the grown-up boys have no room neither bed to use while they visit their homes. The picture is what one family is using as a washroom. This desperation calls for the support to these families as we transition from the homes to community based care for the orphans and the vulnerable children.

Challenges encountered by guardian and families



We were able to upgrade two rooms at Rehema children home giving us more room to host guests such as volunteers in more decent living conditions. Gas installation was completed at Rehema, we are now enjoying a smoke free kitchen courtesy of GOA Switzerland. Next Month we look forward to having the same done at Beat the drum.



Farming Projects

Our vegetable farming at Rhema and Tumaini is doing very well. At CCRC home we took a great step with the installation of the drip irrigation kit, and we believe the home will always be green.



Shelter Improvements

Construction work for Kieni Homes modern dormitories began and we have been able to do the foundation pillars and work on the ground concrete is going on. We continue to thank GOA Switzerland for their huge support towards the completion of this project. We also enhanced water collection at Rhema and also improved on the sanitation in the same home with installation of new flush toilets.

Partners' visits

This month we were visited by a family from Switzerland. The family sponsors 3 children at Tumaini and has also supported the education reforms, we had a special time together in the head office.



Foster and community based care

We are glad because through the support that we have been getting from our partners we have all our children connected to various schools ranging from primary level, Junior High school as well as Secondary level. All the children are in good health with their families that are loving to them. In addition to the care and provision for their personal needs, the children are also given proper Spiritual guidance and mentorship as they grow on general life issues and careers. However, many of the families that are caring for these children are equally needy. GOA High School

Key outstanding examiners have professionally guided our student in various Sciences, Technical and Languages subjects for both form 3 and four KCSE exam candidates. We look forward to have them come in this term to help in



the other subjects too. The Form Four Agriculture project was completed and manual submission made in August to the Kenya National Examination Council, through the Sub-County Educational Office at Engineer town.

The school Christian Union remains highly active and holds church activities and church services.

The Sports for Jesus Ministry visited our institution on Sunday 6th August 2023. They motivated students through personal testimonies and sports activities. They discussed how to gain self-esteem and career choices available to the youths, professional sports being one of them.



Upgrade of Sanitation facilities

The new modern toilet was sponsored by Joy Griffin and the Beautiful feet. This came at the right time when the institution needed the facility following the inability of the previous facility to handle the needs of the institution

GOA Education Centre Kinangop

The enrolment has grown by an addition of 4 from Private Parents and the school is now having a population of 142 Pupils. The teaching staff has been successful in completing the KNEC projects and marking on time. The Syllabus is at 100% Complete for Class 8 and the other Grades they are working hard to complete it in good time. The school is in great need for two extra class rooms to avoid sharing of the classes as has been the case.

GOA NABWELPUS

The school was opened for third term on 28th with three teachers. The Cabinet Secretary for water, Sanitation and Irrigation Hon Alice Wahome, UNICEF Director, Koica and County Government officials visited the school to officially launch the water project which was installed by UNICEF.



The Cabinet secretary promised the gift of an administration block and two more classrooms. The Constituency Development fund for Turkana Central Constituency has also promised to help build two more classrooms at the school. With this donation the school will have more classrooms to accommodate all the learners from the community. Close to 3 kilometers from Nabwelpus School at GOA Kaapokor, a feeder Kindergarten school was launched by the community to help educate their children. The Kindergarten graduates from

Kaapokor Centre join Nabwelpus for their Primary and Junior Secondary Education. The new centre however suffers lack of basic teaching aids as well as food for the children causing many of them to be inconsistent in the school. We are also in need of one teacher for the ECDE class and one teacher for the Primary level.

The 10 candidates for KCPE are getting ready for the KCPE exam at the end of the year 2023. We keep praying for them for the courage to face the examinations and perform well to proceed with their education journey.

Glory Academy in Burundi school acquired land within the month. Constructions and renovation of the existing building is going on. To transfer the children from the school at the church to the new school premises. The process of the land transfer the land to the school is in progress.

Counseling

Counseling is one of our most important form of intervention. We have engaged both individuals and groups in counseling in the effort to try and keep families and individuals strong. We are always aiming to help our clients achieve peace and be confident in their decisions as they cope through their lives' situation.

AA Meetings

As part of our addiction & drug and substance abuse disorder initiative, we host AA Meetings every Thursday at 6:00 pm – 7:00 pm at the GOA Headquarter in Nairobi. These meetings are bringing positive change to many individuals in our local community as well as creating a safe environment to work through their addiction struggles.

Peace Celebrations

GOA Peace celebrations in Laikipia were a success. Laikipia region has been known for constant conflicts among the tribes living there. The message of peace is so relevant to the communities here more. The celebrations were held on November 11th in Rumuruti with the aim of impacting communities with knowledge of peaceful coexistence.

Networking/ fostering partnerships & Mobilizing resources

A huge focus of this month was working the department becomes financially stable and we believe this can only be achieved through consistent and reliable partnerships. One of the key partners who has been helpful and will remain to be moving forward is the Findlay family and their firm Findlay House Global who have been of key help to help us secure two online courses for our staff and our people while also searching for opportunities for grants to apply one of which we have already applied.

We have also maintained constant communication with other GOA partners and friends and we continue to share our vision with them.

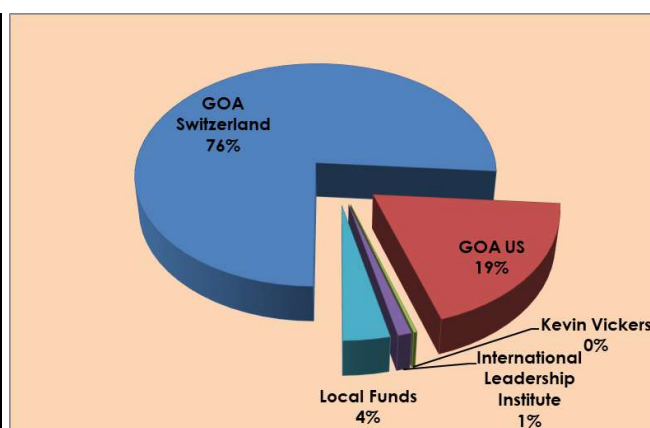
Financial Performance

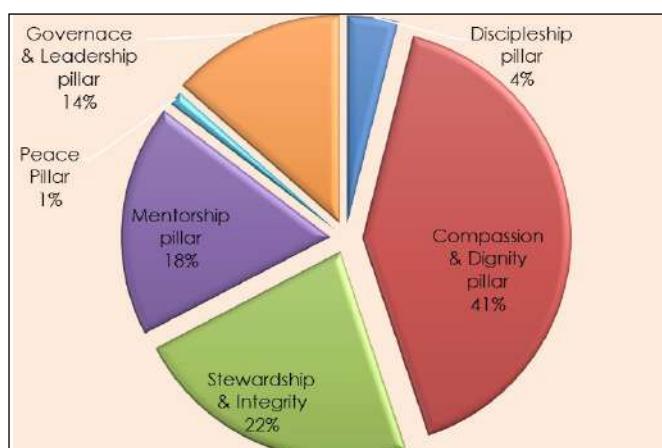
Summary of the sources of income for GOA in September 2023

Summary of the GOA ministry expenditure for the month of September 2023

GOA Financial Sustainability and Stability efforts

GOA aspires to be a financially sustainable ministry. For the past 32 years, the ministry has largely depended on donor funding to carry out its operations. In its strategic planning the ministry is working tirelessly to ensure that it mitigates risks that come with donor overreliance. To achieve this we have established sustainable income generating projects, which include agriculture, real estate, and now venturing into hotel industry. These projects have a potential to generate revenue that will substantially support our annual budget.

Tithes from our Churches

The total amount tithes received was KShs. 98, 785/. This represents 11% decrease from last month (KShs. 110, 604/). During this calendar year (Jan – Sep) we have received KShs. 1, 009,493 worth of tithes support from our local churches, this is encouraging and we sincerely thank the leaders in the churches for supporting GOA vision and mission.



Sustainability projects

We have undertaken strategic initiatives with potential for sustainable income and long-term stability. These include construction of Guesthouse in Naivasha, development of a residential apartment in Umoja estate, in Nairobi, development of a Guesthouse in Tharaka and venturing into agribusiness at Githabai Farm. We currently run several businesses at the head office such as M-pesa shop, Hotel, cyber and selling water. The Mpesa Short during the month of September had an income of Kes.4250. The café rental premise gave us Kes 3500 while the residential property in Umoja currently has an income of Kes. 38,500.

The 3 M USD Guest House Vision

Our Ministry, committed to financial sustainability, plans to utilize our beautiful land in Naivasha to establish and operate a profitable guesthouse. This endeavor will not only create employment opportunities but also contribute to the economic growth of the local community.



Our potential in Housing



Our plan involves constructing a five storey apart-

ment building in the prime Umoja outskirts of Nairobi, which will not only meet the increasing demand for quality housing but also address a significant market gap. This building will provide residents with high-quality housing options, generating consistent rental income for the Ministry. Upon completion, this investment is projected to yield a monthly income of KShs. 250,000 for the Ministry.

Farming at Githabai farm

Farming activities are ongoing well at Githabai farm. In the month of September we sold cabbages worth KShs. 40, 000/. We still have more cabbages in the farm that we anticipate to sell soon. We still have two acres of potatoes that will soon be ready for the market. Our current need is a water borehole- it will cost USD 37,500. We are praying and believing in God for provision of resources needed for drilling and equipping a solar powered borehole at Githabai farm.



KIENI HOME NEW DORMITORIES

Construction of the new building is currently in progress. The need for modern dormitories at Kieni home has been a need that we prayed for for such a long time. With the completion of the dormitories the children will have a well equipped modern boarding facilities.

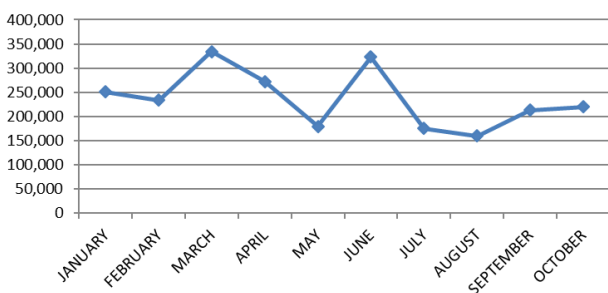
GOA SACCO

We are happy to report on the completion of the audit for 2022 which revealed a profit. The surplus on retained earnings was Ksh 203,047. This was an increase of closer to Kes. 75,000 from 2021 of Ksh 128,101 which was an increase by Ksh 74,946.

TRENDS IN MEMBER SAVINGS FROM JAN - OCT, 2023

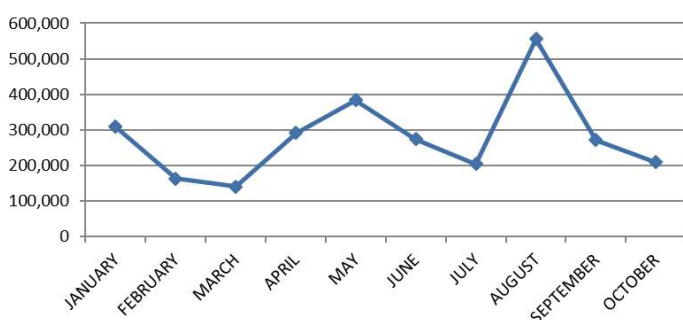

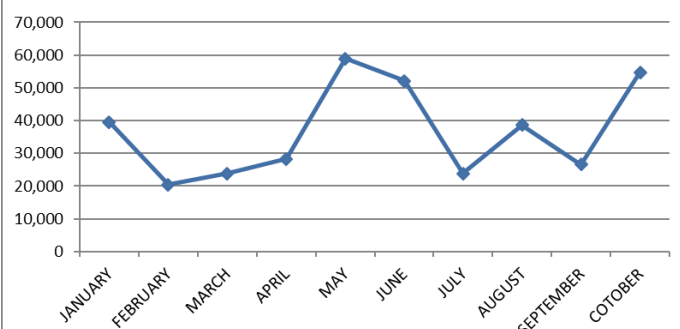
SACCO CREDIT FACILITIES

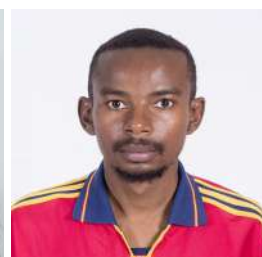
