As we come to the close of this year, I want to take a moment to express our heartfelt gratitude for the incredible work and dedication to GOA in supporting us. Your compassion, hard work, and unwavering commitment have made a profound impact on so many lives. The progress we've seen would not have been possible without each of you. We are truly blessed to have such a dedicated of partners, and I look forward to continuing this important work together in the future. May

God bless all your efforts, and may the year ahead bring even more opportunities for us to make a difference in the lives of these children and their families. Thank you for your service, your generosity, and your heart for those in need.

When the year 2023 was coming to close, the Lord spoke clearly to us and told us that he was ushering GOA into a season of open doors. A season that would see us hit milestones and achievements that have been difficult for us to reach. This became of theme for the year 2024, the year of Open Doors. Isaiah 60:11. IN deed the year 2024 has been exactly what The Lord spoke to us, the year of open doors. Your generous support and prayers have made God's work in GOA very enjoyable.

GOA discipleship teams have empowered regional Bishops throughout the year and equipped them to lead the GOA regions to prosperity. We have ordained eight GOA Bishops, giving them greater mandate to lead GOA regions to plant more churches and reach more communities with the Gospel. This has proven successful with close to 7 new churches having been planted in areas that thirsty for the Gospel. GOA teams launched the new entry into Kisii County this year with a presence of three churches that are rapidly growing. More people have received the Gospel. Accepted Jesus as their savior and are being disciplined to mature in their relationship with the Lord. Four of these communities will be celebrating the completion of new permanent worship sanctuaries built in partnership with our church development partners, International Cooperating ministries ICM. However there are still open opportunities for you to partner with our teams in reaching these communities with the Gospel. More than 10 more congregations still worship under trees trusting God for the gift of a worship sanctuary

GOA Compassion ministry is growing each and every day. Doors opened for more needy children to be rescued. Today both GOA homes and foster families are caring for 354 children. The children have a loving family that provides for their needs and care for them. All our children who are of school going age have been in school with their needs provided for. Thank you so much to our partners who have given their generous support to keep all these children comfortable. Our care givers are working around the clock to initiate and nurture projects that will help us feed

the children on well balanced nutritious food. They have initiated vegetable farming, poultry farming and dairy farming which provide milk, vegetables and eggs for our children. We are moving towards doing better. We however, have to provide sparingly for these children since we do not have full sponsorships for all of them. Today we are in need of 327 child sponsorships that will enable us to give a bright future for the children. Would you sponsor a GOA child today?

GOA Leadership training teams have experienced greater open doors in the year. More than 200 leaders have been equipped with eight core values of effective leaders, Bible and Theological training and entrepreneurial skills. More than 15 African Nations have benefited from the Goa Leadership training opportunities. Leaders in these Nations are multiplying themselves and accelerating the spread of the Gospel of Jesus.

Our Bible and Theological training College in Tharaka Kenya however still remains in need of a chapel for the community and students. Many churches in Africa are led by Pastors who have not yet been trained. It is part of our top priorities that we shall get training to all these Pastors for them to lead their churches with a better understanding of God and their calling. Would you partners with GOA in taking the training to all the Pastors in the remote and marginalized areas?

This year came with very heavy response opportunities to the needs of the people. The heavy rains that hit the country this year left behind a trail of destructions. Floods swept away villages and devastated families. In one of the severe incidences in Maimahiu a whole village was swept away when heavy rains came down at night leading to massive losses of lives and property. The families were displaced and remained hopeless. Our Peace teams camped in Maimahiu operating from Beat The Drum Home to rescue and encourage these families through provision of relief food and other needs. Months after the floods tragedies across the country, many of these families are still struggling to piece their lives together. Please pray for them and consider a generous donation that can help one family return to their normal lives.

The GOA Mentorship teams are equipping the merging leaders within GOA communities. This year along we have had a total of 29 students graduate from their High Schools to join the 87 students in Post-secondary Education and mentorship. The financial need for this class of students is very heavy. It however Gives us joy to see the students grow in their careers paths and finally become self-reliant as adults. We pray for your support to GOA mentorship to care for all these students. GOA Sports ministry on the other hand has been vibrant amidst an array of challenges. GOA has pioneered the introduction of Floorball in Kenya. The sport has grown so fast and the Kenya Teams hold the world titles currently. However, the Kenyan Government has been adamant supporting the sport. In the just concluded African Championships Kenyan Teams have performed so well to win the title for the ladies while men emerged second with no government

support. We invite you to partner with GOA to grow the GOA Sports evangelism and help us reach more young people with Gospel.

Comparing the first with months of 2024 and the 2023, our financial resources have shown growth. During the first eight months of year 2024 we received a total Income of Kshs 122,648,837 which is a slight increase from an equivalent period in year 2023 whose amount was Kshs 121,415,493. Praise the Lord. These resources have translated to happy families and communities in Africa. Thank you for your generous giving.

As we draw to the close of the year, the GOA Leadership Summit for the year 2024 will be in Naivasha Kenya from the 2<sup>nd</sup> to the 5<sup>th</sup> of December. We shall be bringing together GOA Leadership teams from all over Africa for Thanks giving for the open doors as well as listen to God's direction for the year 2025. Many of the GOA leaders who travel from long distances to come to the summit are not able to support themselves financially. I will be sharing with you the open opportunities for you to sponsor a leader to the Summit be equipped. This will be our third leadership mentorship summit that seeks to help GOA Leadership teams equip leaders for GOA vision 2055.

The opportunities for partnership with GOA in 2025 are already open and many partners and friends of GOA are booking their mission dates for 2025. Please let us know what time of the New Year 2025 will be most appropriate for you to visit either individually or with your team and our teams will be ready to receive you.

GOA Kibukwo successfully reached their next Milestone reporting stage. The remaining two projects will be reach the reporting stage early in the month of November. The communities are excited by these projects to the Glory of God. Close to 500 members of GOA will celebrate ones finished.

GOA Manunga and Mawingu in Kipipiri region were planted to reach the communities with the Gospel of Jesus and care for the vulnerable in the society.

## MINI BIBLE COLLEGE , DISCIPLESHIP

Our teams have disbursed 170 Mini Bible College audio devices to the churches for the use by the congregation in their Bible training in Western, Nyanza and Nandi regions. The audio Bible Colleges were shipped into the Country through the GOA partnership with ICM for growing the GOA congregations in their Knowledge and understanding of the Word of God. Close to 70 Discipleship groups making up

more than 4000 members have received them and will be using the devices to disciple the believers.

In the month of July the GOA Compassion and dignity teams were privileged to be the hands and feet of Jesus as they have cared for 354 children in our homes and foster programme. Indeed great doors were opened for us, 4 children were admitted at our Tumaini children home. All our children were able to attend school with their needs met. We plan to have the children spend part of their holiday with their guardians. Our day to day activities were joyous to attend to, we enjoyed delicious meals and healthy relationship all around. We however had some health experiences, all the same the Lord has preserved

## Our children welfare

Samuel was born in 2006 and is the first born in a family of four children. Together with his second born



brother, they were left in the house to take care and fed for themselves after the mother was admitted in the hospital after their third born brother was severely burnt with hot water. It is very frustrating when such a young kid is left on his own. Neighbor's reported the case to the children's officer who requested Tumaini Children's home to rescue them to be provided with the basics, care and protection. The kids can now smile for the future. Samuel and his younger brother are among the 4 children that have been admitted at Tumaini home raising the number of the children in our Compassion care to 358. All these children are well save for a few cases of

ill health that have been reported across the homes where all our children are under treatment.

## PRAY FOR OUR CHILDREN

1. Gladys from Beat The Drum Home whose creatine and urea levels have gone up and has been transferred to Dialysis clinic where she is set to start dialysis, several tests are set to be done between now and January for her treatment
2. Raphael also from Beat The Drum Home has been sick for a while, his viral load has been reported to be very high and has had several tests carried and we are still recommended to undertake others. The doctors are still establishing the problem so that he can be given appropriate medication.
3. Alex Mwendwa from CCRC home had an ear infection that causes pus ooze from his ears which strains his hearing, he was taken to Kangundo hospital and is under treatment
4. Abel Katam also from CCRC home suffers from tongue-tie which is a health condition where his tip of the tongue is attached to the floor of his mouth, he was taken to Kangundo hospital. The doctor suggested he needs a minor surgery to detach it.
5. Paul Gachoka from Rhema home has a thin-walled anechoic enhancement cystic mass in the right lobe of liver, he has been under medication for a while, he has greatly improved and will therefore not undergo a surgery as earlier proposed.
6. Bernard Mucheru from Rhema home has been having eyes problem in which his eyes have been teary painful and red-dish. He has been attending eye clinic checkup as scheduled, we thank God for the improvements
7. Jonah from strong Tower had a bad day last Sunday when he was hit by a speeding car while crossing the road. We thank God for preserving his life, was taken to hospital later discharged and is under medication.

## Our farming Efforts

We have successfully been able to do dairy farming at Rhema, Tumaini and Beat the drum. Vegetable and fruit growing is also practiced at Rhema, beat the drum and Tumaini. During the month introduced fruit farming at CCRC which we hope is going to do well. The project is not only a source of fruit but also a plan to have children learn different skills. From this month we shall no longer be buying eggs at CCRC, the poultry is doing well with 26 hens. We intend to add more after we received donations for the same.

## Our Top Prayer needs

1. Child sponsorship - we have a deficit of 320 @\$39 each
2. Tumaini Solar installation- We have had power outage most of the times in our institution leading to stoppage of a lot of thing serving our children.
3. Construction of perimeter wall at Strong Tower home and expansion of the current dining hall
4. Tumaini re-routing of electricity poles and upgrade of the feeder road:
5. Building New washrooms at Kieni home
6. Tumaini drainage system:- One of Tumaini drainage system is a pathetic condition and we would love to upgrade it for children health and safety.
7. School bags, shoes and books as we open schools in January
8. Healing for the sick kids
9. Permanent buildings at Rhema
10. Dam upgrade at Rhema home.

I also wish to register my gratitude for the continued child support, indeed through this support lives have been improved.





## Sports Ministry

The year 2024 has not only been characterized by open doors of blessings by opportunities of serving too. When the year began, one of our children at GOA Kahawa Wendani Gloria Wanjiru schooling at Kwangethe School, birthed the vision of feeding a hungry child with lunch. Many of the children at the school were staying at school without a meal. Unfortunately for many of these children, the lunch they get at school could be the only meal they are guaranteed to have in the whole day. After much considerations, GOA took up the challenge to provide food for the children. We launched the program in the second term of the year with a total of 56 children that receive lunch everyday. The Initiative dubbed Glorias Lunch Box has been life saving to these children. With more funding we would like to feed more children and share the love of God with them. Would you partners with GOA to feed a child at only Kes. 1000 per tem?

### **Alternative care efforts**

In line with the child care reforms, Goa compassion team is caring for a total of 35 children in families in Tharaka Nyeri and other parts of the country. These children have been taken in by other families after their parents went to the with Lord leaving them orphaned and helpless. Through the support of our partners all these children are in school and have their basic supplies provided. With the resources we have received from our partners to care for these children we have been able to provide food for close to 60 members of these families since the fostering families themselves are struggling with their basic needs. However, as they're struggle to provide for their needs the fostered children are happy to have a family to belong to where they feel loved an=care for as their needs are provided. Our desire is to care for more children and give them hope for a better future. Would you partner with GOA to sponsor one of these families with an income generating project to help provide for their needs well?

### **Community empowerment**

We have been able to host two trainings which have been of great help to all the people who have attended. We started by ushering the Easter holiday through empowering the community around the Kahawa Wendani area with Child protection skills and this has served as an eye opener to many in child care.

Regina has had to take up menial jobs to provide for her family in the absence of her husband to the point where she was not able to pay for her daughters school fees Just a few months before sitting her national examination.

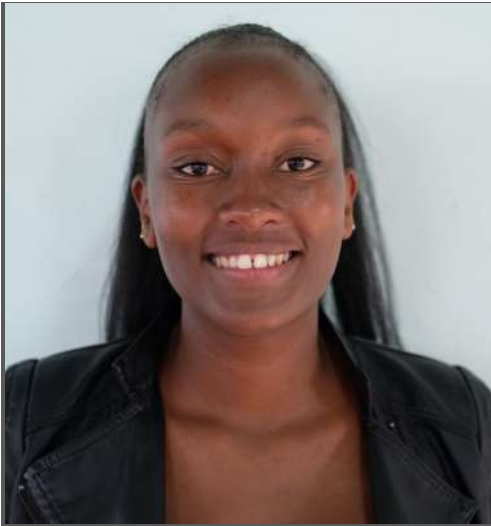

# Mental Health

## Mental Health Initiatives

The GOA Mental health teams have been instrumental in addressing some of the most overlooked needs in our communities that affect the daily lives of the members of the communities.



We have invested a lot of time and resources in counseling initiatives helping the members of our teams as well as the larger communities to accept and deal with losses, Changes in their lives and coping up with difficult situations. Our major highlight this year has been helping the members of the 4 families among

the victims of the tragic floods that hit the country earlier in the year. Many of them have since come to terms and pieced their lives together for a new lease of life.

## Empowerment for the Mental Health Team

This year has seen our team not only empower members of the communities but build partnerships that has helped us empower mental health champions with training in dealing with Trauma, Psychological first aid and adverse childhood experiences. With these training many of our Champions will be able to handle mental health cases within their communities are bring down the cases of suicide the rising homicide cases, which are mostly a result of poor handling of their causes. Working together with other partners our team has reached more than 12,000 persons through social media as well as well as more than 7,000 other being impacted through the self care programs that the Mental Health teams champion for.

Our teams celebrate the successful recovery of Brian Macharia. Brian is one of the alumni of GOA compassion Homes that got affected by drugs. Through concerted Efforts Brian has undergone rehabilitation and learning change of Lifestyle as he slowly begins to gain back sobriety and productivity

## History Makers Leadership training



The Year 2024 has been a year of open doors. Across Africa We have been blessed to equip 3458 leaders with the eight core values through History Makers. The leaders have been equipped in 84 different conferences that have been held in 16 different African Nations. This revival has given a new phase to the multiplication of leaders who are actively sharing the Gospel and equipping others too

## THEOLOGICAL TRAINING AND BIBLE READING CLASSES

The Bible and theology class at the GGU main campus in Tharaka was run successfully throughout the year equipping Pastors and church leaders for to effectively share the Gospel. The classes in the satellite campuses in Nairobi at Kahawa Wendani have also been in good progress. In the month of November the classes that were successfully finished earlier in May 2024 will be graduating. The students have been diligent in their studies to the present and are still moving to the next levels. In the same month at GOA Murera we launched a new satellite Campus for Bible and Theology that is expected to start their classes in February 2025. Close to 20 students have already registered for the class.

The second of the Global Servant leaders Conference was held this year. In partnership with Dr. Carey Akin with the conference equipped a total of 30 GPa leaders and care givers. This has greatly transformed the leadership of GOA institutions and families across the ministry. The continuing leadership mentorship has impacted close to 70 leaders who in turn continue to multiply themselves through training and service. In this era and time where leadership is seen as the power to be served, it is of great importance to have the GSL training that is leading God's people to follow the example of the master leader Jesus Christ whose leadership was demonstrated through service. The intention is to get all GOA leaders go through the GSL program so that we may lead by example.

## HEART FOR PASTORS CONFERENCE SEASON THREE



This year was quite challenging because of the floods that left the Nation in great loss of both life and properties. Many were displaced and some were completely disoriented after they lost everything, they had included their families. However, the thirst for the heart for pastor's seminar impacted 526 leaders in Kisii and Tharaka Nithi counties. Dr. Wayne Dorsett taught about preaching and family seminar, while Dr. Jack Millwood taught, "Jogging through the Bible." a very powerful course that was taught with a lot of fun and simplicity for everyone to understand the journey

I also wish to appreciate our great partners locally, Nairobi Pentecostal Bible college and the daily word feast. Thank you for not only answering God's call to pray for more laborers but also to equip them for the great harvest.



We are almost coming to the end of the year 2024 which has been a year of open doors. Three of our schools sat for KPSEA from 28-30<sup>th</sup> October; GOA Education center in Kinangop fielded 11 candidates, Nkirashi school among the Samburu people fielded 16 candidates while Nabwelpus in Turkana fielded 9 candidates. A total of 36 candidates have already completed their National exam and are ready to join junior schools in grade 7 next year, 2025. 22 of our form four candidates from GOA high school are sitting for the KCSE exams which started this week on 4<sup>th</sup> after the rehearsals which were done last week. The exam will end on 22<sup>nd</sup> November.



GOA Nabwelpus candidates sat the National KPSEA Examination together with the rest of the learners across the Nation. They will be joining Grade 7 in January 2025

## Open doors for our schools

As we close year our schools have impacted a total of 915 children. Majority of these children are from families that could not have managed to take them to school of any kind. The children are distributed among our schools as follows GOA High school had a population of 110, Education center Kinangop had 230, GOA Nabwelpus and Kaapokor ECDE, and population of 200, Nkirashi 228, adult school had 65 while GOA Burundi had 82. GOA Schools as at the end of year 2024 stands at 915.

The efforts of our partners have paid off very well. Some of the schools did not have any infrastructure for the children to use in learning. Many were learning under trees and some in the open sun.

There is an active league in Kenya and a national team with our sports coordinator leading the officially registered federation in Kenya. Kenya has since participated in the 2<sup>nd</sup> and 3<sup>rd</sup> African cup and has won the bid to host the 4<sup>th</sup> African cup from 13<sup>th</sup> to 15<sup>th</sup> September 2024.

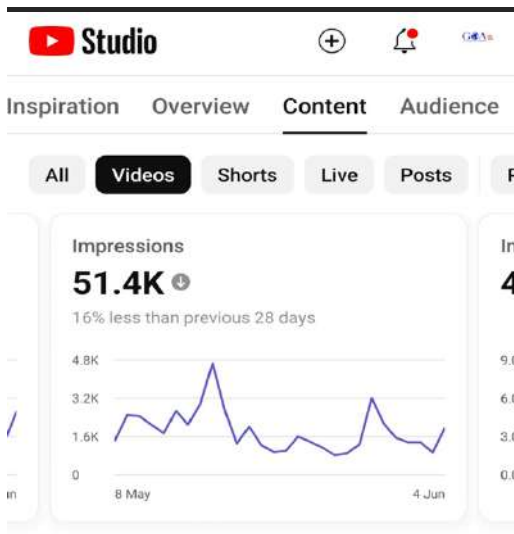

Governance and leadership department is a strategy implementation framework whose main aim is to establish a stable governance and management structure for the ministry. Together with partnership collaboration and financial sustainability strategies they play a supportive role to the five main pillars of the ministry which include Discipleship, Compassion and Dignity, Mentorship, Stewardship & Integrity and Peace building. The department also has a financial and administration section whose main aim is to provide oversight, control, management and accountability of ministry resources.

The department envisions a ministry that operates under effective and efficient management principles, and an organizational structure that serves to ensure accountability at all levels of operations.

### Ministry's Financial resources

October marks the beginning of the third quarter of our financial year 2024/2025. The ministry has experienced tremendous growth throughout the calendar year 2024. We have experienced support both locally and internationally. During this period our income increased at the rate of **2.7%** compared to the same period in the last calendar year. This is highly attributed to funding of some of the long-time pending projects that were funded and we are so grateful to God for using our ministry friends and partners to support this vision. Some of these projects include, Construction of 2 Kieni dormitories, construction of Naotin and Nabwelpus classes. This was however a decrease by close to 27% of the income compared to the preceding month of September.

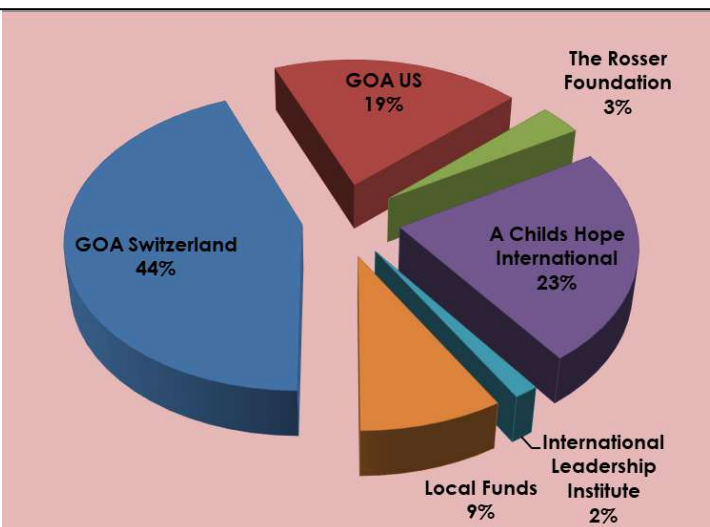
*Summary of the income for the ministry over the month of October 2024*

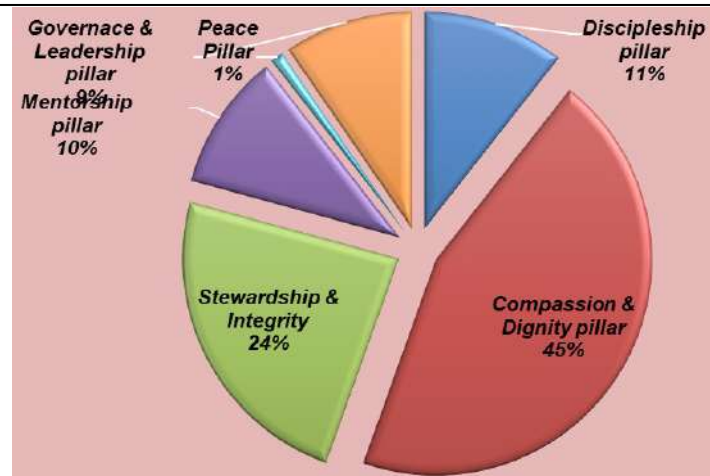


Sources of income for the Goa Ministry for the month of October 2024

## Sustainability and Stability

For over three decades, GOA Ministry has leaned heavily on donor generosity to fund its programs. Recognizing the risks of this dependency, the Ministry has made strategic moves to establish income-generating ventures that enhance sustainability and self-sufficiency. At its children's homes, GOA has implemented agricultural projects, including crop cultivation and livestock farming, to support nutritional needs and equip children with hands-on agricultural skills.

On a larger scale, the Ministry's head office oversees strategic revenue-generating initiatives aimed at financial stability. These are led by the Financial Stability and Sustainability Department and include mobilizing funds through church networks, business operations managed by the head office, and rental income from Umoja House in Nairobi. Additional revenue comes from a managed investment portfolio and the Githabai agricultural project.

### Local Funds mobilization

During the month of October, We received a total of KShs. 107, 378/ which is a 4% increase from the previous month's total of KShs. 103, 745. The Mpesa plus hotel business at the head office did as follows: Mpesa commission -2,321/ airtime profit 1,267. We continue to lease the hotel where we received 3,500/

### UMOJA APARTMENTS PROJECT

The Umoja house currently helps the ministry generate close to Kes. 33,500 per month. We are excited about our upcoming project upgrade. The Umoja upgrade House plans and are at the crucial stage finalizing the plans and obtaining approvals. Our goal is to begin construction before the end of this year



as we are trust in God to provide the resources and guidance needed. To move forward, we are seeking partnerships to help raise \$5,000 necessary for approvals so we can commence construction. The

total cost of the project will be \$200,000, and once complete, the apartment complex with 10 units is expected to generate a monthly income of \$2,500. We invite interested partners to join us in this endeavor to create a valuable and impactful Ministry asset.



## NAIVASHA GUEST HOUSE AND CONFERENCE CENTER



We are initiating a promising project within our ministry and seek your support and partnership.

Phase I of our multiphase project includes:

1. *Erecting a perimeter wall around a 2.2-acre property.*
2. *Constructing a swimming pool with accompanying changing rooms.*
3. *Landscaping the designated area.*

The outcome of Phase I is to create revenue-generating opportunities by leasing the pool, which is in high demand in our region, and utilizing the landscaped area for events like weddings, which are also expected to generate substantial funds. Proceeds from these services will finance the next phase of the project. The budget for Phase I is set at USD 150,000. Our current financial target is to raise USD 50,000 to fund the construction of the perimeter wall and gate.

## MUGUTHA RESIDENTIAL UNITS

GOA plans to construct three high-end residential units in the growing Mugutha estate, Ruiru. This project will require a total investment of KShs 21.5 million (USD 215,000) and is projected to generate KShs 30 million (USD 300,000) in revenue, with a total profit of KShs 8.5 million (USD 85,000). Each unit will sell for KShs 10 million (USD 100,000), providing a clear return on investment in just one year. GOA's decision to invest in high-end residential housing in Mugutha, Ruiru is based on the growing demand for quality housing in this area. The residential project will cater to an affluent market segment, ensuring strong returns in a short time frame. The profits generated from the sale of these units will provide immediate funding for GOA's outreach programs, while also setting the foundation for future real estate developments.

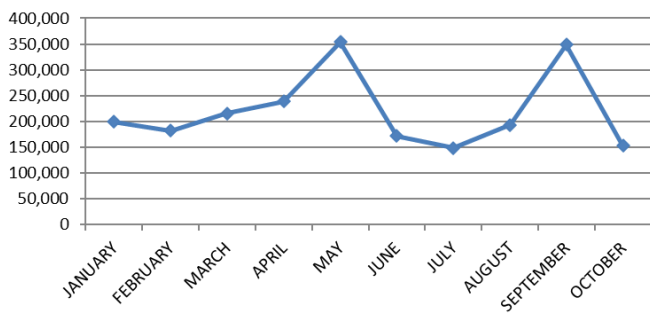

## SACCO GROWTH TREND

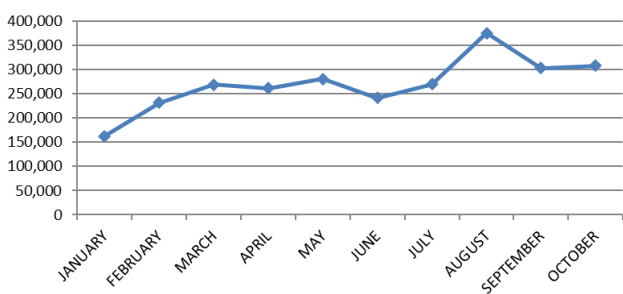
**TRENDS IN MEMBER SAVINGS FOR 10 MONTHS - 2024**

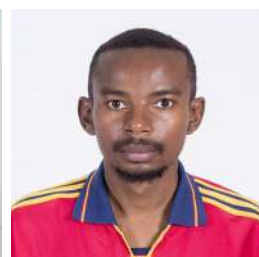
