# **EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR'S REPORT**



Dear Kingdom partner,

At the End of the year 2022, God spoke to us clearly as we entered the New Year 2023, that GOA Teams were entering the season during which many of the things we had found difficult to do would be done. We were guided by the word of God from Numbers 13:30 "We are well able". God in his faithfulness kept us connected with you in partnership for the Great commission and together we have been able to achieve great things for the Kingdom.

GOA Discipleship teams have planted new congregations among the reached and the unreached people groups. Six new congregations have been planted and

are now reaching the communities with the Gospel and newer believers are being made. As a result of these new congregations together with the creative evangelism strategies more than 400 new believers have been reached with the Gospel and received Christ as their personal savior. More than half of them have been baptized in many waters and are growing in their relationship with God. Praise God! We celebrated the gift of fellowship through the GOA regional Conferences all year round. Children, young adults as well as the adults came together during the conferences and celebrated fellowship with each other. More than 2000 members across the GOA Regions took part in the 13 conferences that were held in the regions. However, as we celebrated the great milestones that we achieved together we too had tough times. The GOA Team leader for Uganda, Bishop Ephraim Sentambule went to be with the Lord after a long battle with ill health. The family was left in great devastation and need. We thank God that together we were able to overcome this difficult time, laid Bishop Sentambule to rest and comforted the family. We would not have achieved all these on our own would you your support not have been there. We thank God for your support throughout the year.

GOA Compassion teams have cared for 352 children in our homes and more than 30 children through foster families. All our children have access to a loving family of brothers and sisters and parents as well as care givers who love them. Despite the difficult times we have kept the children well cared for. Some of the children have experienced challenges with their health, some have been treated and are well while some are on medication. Please pray for them that they get well soon. One of our priority needs remains empowering families to care for children away from the children homes. Most of the guardians to the children in our homes are living in dilapidated conditions, unable to provide for their own needs leave alone providing for the needs of the children. Would you partner with GOA Compassion teams to build a house for one of these families to provide better care for the children? Would you partner with GOA by sponsoring a child in the home with a monthly gift of USD 117? This will go a long way in making a child happy.

GOA Leadership training teams are celebrating 3892 leaders across Africa that have been empowered to pursue God given visions for their lives and impacting their communities as they accelerate the spread of the Gospel. Halle-lujah!!! Many Pastors that could not afford the cost of Theological training are being equipped to be more effective preachers and teachers of the word. More leader's families have been positively impacted to grow into strong families that are in living in harmony. Preachers Seminar and the Global Servant leaders training have been such new strong partnerships for equipping

leaders in Africa. More than 1000 leaders have been equipped and are growing in their service to God. We are

grateful to all the GOA partners that have been key in equipping and mentoring leaders for the Gospel.

It is during the year of believing that we are well able that the GOA peace teams' efforts paid off well. Over the

years our teams have been at the Centre of preaching peace, uniting warring communities and building strong

families in the country and the entire East and Central African region. In recognition of these efforts the GOA pre-

siding Bishop, Bishop David Munyiri Thagana, was awarded the DIAR Peace and Cohesion champion recognition

award. This recognition crowns the efforts of GOA teams in building and keeping peace among the communities.

Many strong families have been given birth to through the celebration of marriages around the GOA regions. The

young couples have been well prepared for the journeys ahead as they chose to live with each other until death

does them part. We pray for all these families as well as the ones still coming ahead. Did you know that mental

health is a growing concern among the societies today? This has been proven by the rising number of mental

health cases among families that have led to the establishment of the GOA Mental health team that is ever en-

gaged on one or more issues. Our peace teams are the least funded of all GOA teams despite the great tasks that

they undertake. Would you partner with us with your resources for our peace teams today?

Compared to the previous financial year 2023/2024, the ministry's income increased at the rate of 8.5%. The In-

come rose to Kshs 178,870,241 from the previous year's Kshs 164,858,618 total income. We appreciate our finan-

cial partners for the continued support to wards the GOA vision. Through your support our teams are well support-

ed, our children and churches are being empowered towards sustainability. More members from the GOA churches

and our larger communities have made up their minds to work their way towards financial freedom through invest-

# PLANTING OF NEW CONGREGATIONS

Over the years GOA has embraced church planting as the most effective strategy of discipleship and Evangelism. GOA churches provide centres of effective discipleship of members. New congregations have been planted around the GOA regions. GOA teams have been able to plant six new Congregations. This additionally has given rise to one more prospective GOA administrative region in Kisii.

#### **BUILDING OF PERMANENT WORSHIP SANCTUARIES**

GOA has partnered with ICM church development partner to help build permanent sanctuaries for communities that are not able to put up one for themselves. During the year we had four projects in progress, Kiserian church in Nairobi, Kinja church in Kinangop, Mutaranga church in Tharaka and Nyasita Church in Nyanza region. Out of these projects three have been completed successfully and



all of them have been dedicated. As a result of these church buildings more members of the communities have joined congregations where they are being discipled to maturity.

# SUCCESS IN THE GOA REGIONAL CONFERENCES

Year 2023 was the first year during which all the GOA conferences were held in the regions. A total 15 Conferences were held for different groups around the GOA administrative regions giving close to 2000 members of GOA congregations got an opportunity to fellowship with each other through the conferences. This was a positive impact coming

from a past where we only had close to 400 members drawn from the regions coming together for the National conferences. We are grateful to our ministry partners GOA Switzerland for the tremendous support towards the Conferences. The financial help that we got from GOA Switzerland made the conferences possible to be held successfully.

## LOSS OF BISHOP SENTAMBULE

In the midst of the success stories that GOA teams recorded, we one of the Key GOA leaders in Uganda in the month of May 2023. Bishop Ephraim Sentambule of GOD Uganda went to be with the Lord after battle with his health. Bishop Sentambule had led the GOA teams as well as the International Leadership teams in Uganda for close to 20 years seeing the



planting of 19 GOA congregations in Uganda. The leadership of the GOA teams in Uganda was taken over by His successor Bishop Johnrich Kimera.



# **Breakthrough for Tanzania registration**

After a long battle in the corridors of the Government offices in Tanzania, GOA Tanzania was finally granted Registration. Giving a proper legal framework for the ministry to carry out its activities in the East African Nation for the Next five years when it will be awarded renewal of the Registration. GOA Tanzania has currently planted close to five different branches and continues to Grow. The Greater need of building the churches remains as a biting need for the Tanzanian churches. With a donation of USD 7000, we can help build up a church in Tanzania

#### MINISTRY EMPOWERMENT FOR REV. FRED OKWOMI

The GOA Discipleship Director Rev Fred Okwomi was ordained on 15<sup>th</sup> November 2023. This ceremony was a success. Out of the gifts that friends gave during the ordination ceremony we were able to purchase a ministerial car for Rev Fred. We wish to pass our gratitude to the friends and partners that generously gave towards the buying of the ministerial car.

# Our children welfare



During the past financial yea we took care of 352 children in our homes. The children were well provided with food shelter education and recreation in order to grow like every other child in their families. 38 of these children sat their Primary Level National Examination and transitioned to High Schools while 25 of them sat their High School National Exams to transition to institutions of Higher learning. We admitted a total of 56 new children that were rescued from different cir-

cumstances and have since found a home among the institutions. We however remain grappling with the challenge of the unsponsored children. We invite you to consider sponsor a child with USD 117, which shall provide food, education and all other basic needs.

# FOOD SUSTAINABILITY PROJECTS

Our goal of achieving food sustainability through production of food in our homes is slowly being realized. Many of our homes managed to produce their own vegetables in their gardens while some such as Rehema, Rhema and Tumaini and Kieni West home have invested in Dairy, sheep and poultry farming that provide meat and milk for the children Part of



our homes faced the challenge of dry seasons which however overcome through the irrigation initiatives.

There however remain major needs for our institutions as well as families. Our desire is to have each of our 352 child sponsored. It takes a total of USD 117 to sponsor a child every month.

There still remain major infrastructural developments that we need to undertake in our children homes for the betterment of our children's welfare as well as that of the care givers.

#### Thank you so much

We send our word of thank you to our friends and partners through whose love and generous giving we keep caring for the vulnerable in our community.



In line with eh new Government directives to care for children n the community, GOA Compassion teams seek for families that are willing to take in an extra child or more and care for them together with their own children in their homes. Today we have more than 33 children being cared for by foster families around the country. They receive love and all basic needs in these families.



During the 2023/2024 fiscal year we supported 12 children with school fees. This has kept all our children in school enabling them to pursue their academic goals. The children on care program have been beneficiaries of close mentorship and Spiritual guidance through the church and their parents. Through the food support given to their families, families making up of more than 100 members receive food aid every month. We invite you to partner with us in supporting a child or family on foster care.

#### ADOPTION.

There have been a rise in the number of parents who are seeking to adopt a child due to one reason or the other. Around the nation the approved agencies are so few that they may not be able to address this need. This coupled together with the new direction of family based care that GOA compassion is moving towards has necessitated the need to register the GOA adoption agency. This will help parents who are would like to legally take in a child to be there own to go through the process and finally adopt the child.

Our teams are in the mentorship stage with other players in the area of child care through adoption as we look for-

We intend to have at least 10 children being added on our care. With this addition we shall require an extra USD 600 every month to care for the needs of the additional children.

In the coming year we look forward to expanding our regular mentorship forums for to the greater communities in the areas where our children are being cared for as well as the local churches in the regions to help build a holistic children in the communities.



PEACE



GOA recognizes the need for peace among communities, families and individuals, in the absence of peace around us we cannot be able to preach and spread the gospel which is the main mandate of our ministry. Therefore peace building team meet the need by holding peace seminars in and out of the country and the east And central Africa region.

Goa Teams in conflict prone areas such as the Eastern region of the Democratic republic of Congo ha, Garsen and Samburu i9n Kenya have been on the fore front in creating awareness through Peace Seminar. Through the Peace Seminars we have reached close to 1500 families and individuals through Peace Seminars. The members of these communities are learning to live together with each other through celebrating their differences. The GOA Peace Seminars coupled with the annual cultural Diversity celebrations these communities have been groomed to live at peace with each other.



#### GOA DIAR AWARDS CELEBRATION

Goa ministry has been actively involved in preaching and advocating for peace in every opportunity. Through the efforts of the GOA peace teams in Civic Education, Pre and post election peace campaigns and active engagement of the National Leadership teams on matters of peace Bishop David Thagana was awarded The DIAR Recognition award as the peace and cohesion champion of the year 2023. The award came at the right moment when GOA teams have been similarly accredited as election observers and civic education providers.

# RIPEN MENTORSHIP

As our children transition from child hood to young adults, Peace teams take them through Rites of passage Encounter (RIPEN). Through the initiative, we keep our children in the ways of God unlike leaving them to be taken through initiation by the Community that doesn't value Godly values. A total of 20 boys and 15 Girls went

through the encounter at the end of last year and continue to walk the journey of mentorship with our teams as they grow into adulthood. The youngsters are taught basic life skills such as personal hygiene, safety and are counseled on major issues affecting young people such as life in high school, sexual purity, adulthood, serving Christ among others.

#### MENTAL HEALTH AWARENESS INITIATIVE.



Despite limited resources we reached and trained over 1,500 people through the various activities, with more than 800 of them being children and youths. We have impacted them with information that eradicate mental health stigma, helps them understand how they can seek help or cope with current issues in their lives adequately. Close to 100 households are cele-

brating behavioral changes among the members that we adversely affected. Praise God!!

#### ALCOHOLIC ANONYMOUS (AA) GATHERINGS

One standout stories this year was helping individuals struggling with addiction and substance abuse disorders as they strive to recover from the addictions. Through the Alcoholic anonymous meetings held every week more 30 individuals are recovering from their addictions



We welcome you to partner with GOA Peace teams through your financial resources and networks that will spur our efforts to help the society through Mental health awareness initiatives through out the year. In the month of May we shall be celebrating the Mental Health awareness month as we go on to celebrate Suicide prevention month in September and later in November Stress prevention.

# Family strengthening

We witnessed union of 7 couples in Holy matrimony around our churches. We are excited that the families are so far



growing to be strong and good example families in the community. Among the couples some legalized their marriage vows after having been married under the customary law for some years while a majority of them were all young people getting into marriage for their first time. All these couples have gone through rigorous Pre marital counseling and are well prepared to exercise their love and vows to death. Among the celebrations we have had this year, we celebrated the union of

our children raised through the Compassion children homes at Naivasha church between Ian and Susan Muthoni. Besides the celebrations that we held in the year our team has also actively engaged new couples that are due for marriage in the course of this new fiscal year. One of such, also involving one of own children Josphat Mukubwa, the manager of Tumaini family has already been celebrated at Ndunyu Njeru Church. We look forward to preparing more of these families and celebrating them as they fulfil the desires of God that "it is not good for a man to alone."

#### COUNSELING AND SUPPORT FOR COMMUNITIES AND TEAMS WAS A SUCCESS



Our counseling teams have worked together with other teams of professional counselors in reaching our communities. During the year we together worked together in our children homes in partnership with mental health awareness teams. Children in our homes are now in better mental status as well as other young people from the slums of Soweto.

We send our appreciations to our team of partners in Switzerland. Through the Support of GOA Switzerland, our team has been able to travel around the GOA Homes and the communities reaching the members of the community through peace and counseling initiatives. Our teams on the grounds have been effective in putting together these peace initiatives and steering their success. Thank you so much.

#### PRIORITY NEEDS

A head of us this year our teams will be taking part in the global families' day celebration with a focus on the impact of climate change on families on May 15th 2024. at the same time we are trusting God for provision of the resources needed to build the GOA peace Centre in Mkungi to sustainability status.

Our teams too have a series of Peace campaigns among the Kenyan tribes and the Nations of East African coming up to foster peaceful co existence among communities. Please pray for our teams and consider giving generously to help our teams keep the Gospel of Peace on the airwaves.

History Makers Leadership training



History makers training teams equipped 3982 leaders with the 8 core values. We are blessed that Rwanda, Tanzania, Namibia and Eswatini Nations have been revived and now more leaders are being equipped in these nations. Similarly we held the first ever History Makers for business people in Kenya and Zambia reaching business people and equipping them to reach the world with the Gospel through their businesses.



#### Bible and Theological training

A total of 50 Pastors are being equipped through the Bible and Theology training at the GOA Bible Centres. At our main Campus in Tharaka 30 Pastors and Church leaders consistently meet every month for their week long class while our Satellite Centre in Nairobi at Kahawa Wendani GOA church has 20 Pastors both in Level one and two. We were blessed to complete the boarding facilities at the Main campus in Tharaka. Today our students

reside within the school during their weeklong studies with plans underway to furnish the institutions with a modern chapel, dining hall among other basic learning facilities. We are grateful to our ministry partners that have kept our teams motivated to equip more pastors for the work of ministry. 10 Students at the Kinamba training Centre got interrupted from their studies due to the unforeseen circumstances that forces the training Centre to relocate to a new location. We are however working hard to restore the class.

#### **FAITH DRIVEN ENTERPRENUERSHIP**

In the past year we launched our first FDE class. Both the first and the subsequent classes have been successful. Through the training We have equipped 55 entrepreneurs to practice faith in the market place, and see their business ventures as an avenue for God to use to change the world positively. The Mentorship cycle among the entrepreneurs is bearing fruits as more and more get equipped and impact their work places for the Lord.

#### Consistent Bible Reading Discipline

The discipline of consistent Bible reading has been invaluable among the believers that have been trained by it. Members of our churches can today read the Bible for themselves and Listen to God. More than 60 believers were commissioned in Nairobi and Tharaka to live the discipline of reading the Bible while close to 60 more are still under training to be commissioned late in the year.

The Goa leadership training teams in partnership with Dr. Carey Akin with Dr. Wayne Dorset was very successful. A Global Servant leaders movement held the second GSL Conference for the GOA minsters. Impacting a total of 24 staff from GOA churches and homes, the leaders have grown to serve better in their respective capacities. We are grateful to GSL for the impactful Seminar.

#### Top Priorities in 2024/2025 financial year

We are thankful to our ministry partners through whose support we have prepared leaders for the spread of the Gospel. We are trusting God for provision of Kes. 2 million to complete GGU construction work and an addition Kes 1,500,000 to help us meet the learning expenses at the GGU Centre as well as facilitating Consistent Bible reading trainings. Our History Makers teams target up to 5000 leaders. Cumulatively this will cost our teams an upwards of Kes, 30Million and an additional Kes. 1,500,000 for coaching the Nation teams. There are more languages in African that have not gotten access to training materials. At a cost of Kes. 500,000 we look forward to translate the materials to Luganda, Malawian Chichewa language. We invite you to partner with GOA leadership teams in impacting the Nations for Christ.



Education is one of the tools that GOA teams use to dignify the members of our communities. GOA schools provide education to both children and adults alike. With one High school and four Primary schools more than 500 children have had an opportunity to be impacted through education. Year 2023 was the point of Significant changes in the education sector in the Country; following the Covid 19 disruption in the school calendar, schools finally went back to normal year calendar, it also is the year that saw the last group of Primary school grade candidates sit their last National Exam as the education system transitions to the new competence based Curriculum. GOA Education Centre, Nabwelpus in Turkana and the Adult school fielded candidates in these Historic Exam being their first Class eight candidates class and the last one as the changes take effect.

# **GOA High School**

At GO High school, the population of the students grew to a new enrolment of 110 across the four grades. With the

## **GOA Education Center**

The population has continued to grow from 121 in April 2023 to a near double of 206 on 31st March 2024, This has been attrib-

ute to all a range of factors including availability of a school bus for children transport, a team of committed teaching staff as well as better management of the school. The children have excelled both in their academic and co-curriculum engagement with the school sports team participating in the games competitions up to the County Levels in Athletics, Football and the creative arts teams. With a greater investment in the Pastoral Program of Instruction (PPI) and the Christian Union Movement, the children are well guided Spiritually through counseling.



In the year 2023 the last class of the Grade 8 candidates sat for their National Examination. A total of 25 candidates sat for the exam posting an impressive mean score of 293 up from the previous years grade of 254. We appreciate the support of GOA Switerland through provison of funds for building new classes which were a great need in the school. Similarly during his visit Jeff Herdman from the United States donated new Games uniform for all the children motivating them to perform better.

# STEWARDSHIP AND INTEGRITY

#### NABWELIPU SCHOOL IN TURKANA



GOA Nabwelpus in Turkana has fielded candidates in the National exams for the first and last time. With a teacher population of only 6 members of staff handling close to 11 classes, 10 candidates performed relatively well with a majority of them proceeding to High schools. Through the efforts of friends and well wishers the children have received food occasionally. We trust God for provision of two more classrooms for the children, provision of food for

the children as well as basic learning materials for the school



Nkirashi School in among the Samburu people in Laikipia has rapidly grown to now 232 children in Primary school and close to 100 in the preprimary school. Through the support of the Local leadership the school has received two new classrooms for the children. The children still suffer lack of food while at school. Through the support of partners we have provided food for the children for the first term as we hope that they will keep provided for in future to keep them in school as well as desks for the children. We pray for provision of funds for more classrooms, more teachers and food for the children

#### **NAOTIN ADULT SCHOOL**

The school started well, with a total of 55 learners. 15 new learners have joined the school after the encouraging results of the past years National Exam class. The school is however in urgent need of close to Kes. 600000 to help build class-rooms for the learners who still learn under the tree.



# **BURUNDI GOA SCHOOL**



The school opened its doors at the beginning of the year and has 25 children. This was after a closure of the school after it had been hosted within the church premises. Through Kingdom partners of GOA we acquired a piece of land and relocated the school to it's own dedicated premises. The school is in good progress. However we are in need of funds to improve the sanitation and provide learning and playing equipment for the children and build more classrooms.

Later this year, close to 26 new students will be joining post secondary team as they join institutions of higher learning. The financial year 2023/2024 was a very productive year full of activities and great impact in the ministry. As at the end of the year the ministry had a total of 80 members of staff, 35 being in the children homes, 19 at the head office, 23 in the schools,1 missionary based in Garsen located at the coast of Kenya and 2 staff working GOA Global University. There is also a bigger team of more than 200 pastors who serve in the churches and several volunteers working in the ministry both from within and outside the

country.

Our financial year 2023/2024 began well and we thank God that some of the projects that have been pending for so long received funding and were implemented. The ministry had plenty of activities which include and not limited to, Kieni dorms construction, Face-lifting and separation of GOA Kinangop schools, Installation of solar systems in Rhema and Strong Tower homes, Purchase of GOA Kinamba land, completion of 3 ICM Funded churches, purchase of furniture and equipment for various departments, educating, feeding and clothing children in the homes and foster care programme, training leaders, peace activities etc. Some of the projects are still in progress awaiting dedications in a few months to come.

## The Ministry Income

Compared to the previous financial year 2023/2024, the ministry's income increased at the rate of 8.5%. The Income rose to Kshs 178,870,241 from the previous year's Kshs 164,858,618 total income.



During the year the ministry made substantial capital investments in different projects that are spread across the GOA ministry areas. Some are already completed while some of the projects will be completed and dedicated in a few months to come during the current Fiscal year.

### **GOA SUSTAINABILITY EFFORTS**



During the year our churches managed to remit a total of KES 1,353,657/. An average of 70 churches were consistent in remitting their tithes monthly. We received a monthly remittance of KES 112,805 which was below our monthly target of KES 150,000/. We keep praying for our congregations to grow further and support the ministry through their monthly tithes and other free will conations.



Financial stability and sustainability strategies envision a financial independent ministry with reduced donor dependency in its call to changing livelihoods especially those of the vulnerable and orphans amongst our communities. In order to continue making life-lasting impact the Ministry has laid out strategies that help mitigate risks that are associated with over reliance on donor funding. Currently the ministry has adopted several major projects that are key in making this dream become a reality

## NAIVASHA GUEST HOUSE

This is a five star Guest house based in the High



tourism activity town. The facility will feature a conference center, executive guest rooms, conference halls, a restaurant, and a swimming pool. These amenities, combined with the growing tourism industry in Naivasha, are projected to generate annual revenue of **KShs. 15,000,000**.

# **NAIROBI BASED APARTMENTS**

We are currently in the stages of finalizing drawings and ap-



provals. It is our prayer to start construction this year, trusting in God's provision of resources and guidance for this project. At this point we are seeking **5,000USD** to help us get the approvals through and be ready to start construction. The total cost of constructing this apartment is **200,000USD**. The apartment will have 10 units and is expected to generate **2,500USD** per month.

#### GITHABAI FARM IN KINAGOP



Githabai Farm is a mixed fam venture in Kinangop region. With a sure trust in investing in Agribusiness we are positive that this investment will yield results. We have planted vegetables, potatoes among other crops on the farm in addition to which we are currently in need of Kenya Shillings 500,000 to invest in sheep farming. Through the partnership with A Childs Hope International we have been able to sink a borehole that will provide water for the farming activities. There are greater partnership opportunities in investing in the farm for the future.



GOA SACCO is a sustainability strategy that seeks to empower the members of GOA financially. Through the collective savings that the members pool together they are in turn able to access credit facilities for the development projects, children education as well as emergency needs. With a total members hip of 377 member the SACCO members put together Kes. 11.6 Million up from Kes. 8.4in the previous year through their savings. Members are now able to save as low as Kes 50 towards their financially free future. Out of the among of money saved, Kes. 3.72Million was issued out as loans to members raising the SACCO loan book to Kes. 9.34 Million.




## Savings

#### Loans facilities

Through the loan repayment of the members the SACCO has remained afloat giving it more power to extend further credit facilities to member. In the year a total of Kes. 2.7 Million was paid back by the members who borrowed to invest in their businesses as well as take care of their other needs. We are glad to see GOA SACCO members growing financial muscles that enable them meet their needs as well as support other people in need.



#### Our Days to come

We are conscious of the trends in the country and with a survey done by the Kenya National Chamber of Commerce, 76% of Kenyans showed optimism in expanding their businesses in the 2rd quarter of this year which is the 1<sup>st</sup> quarter of GOA's financial year. With this study we anticipate a growth in the credit uptake by the members. Our SACCO team has put measures to cushion the Institution from running into a cash crunch. Through credit facilities by the banks and other financial partners the SACCO will now access credit to extend such to its members. We are equally optimistic that the members hip of the SACCO will grow tremendously with the number of members being empowered growing exponentially.
