Dear friend and partner,

Through your support and prayer so much has been accomplished by our teams. Our efforts to creatively reach nations with the Gospel of Jesus have been successful. Not much would have been accomplished without the critical part played by Kingdom Partners which you have done whole heartedly and effectively. Thank you

For the first time, the annual GOA conferences were organized and done successfully by GOA regions unlike in the past where all GOA teams came together in one National Conference. As a result closer to 1000 Members of GOA have had an opportunity to meet and fellowship from ten different GOA regions. In the past when we did the National Conference we only managed less than half this number.

Many GOA churches continue to reach the communities with the Gospel and raise more mature disciples. Some of the GOA congregations actively reaching the communities are in dire need themselves, being unable to raise a temporary worship sanctuary for themselves at the same time these congregations are expected to care for orphans and the vulnerable in the community. With your support we can help A GOA church build a sanctuary and start a project to help them raise funds to help the orphans and the needy in their communities.

All our children have been kept well in the homes as well as the ones with the foster families. Through your support the children are well fed and kept in school. The children care givers and the Compassion staff have led the homes to produce food for the children within their homes and enjoy more nutritious food for their well-being. Each of our homes have a project that is slowly and steadily becoming a source of hope for food security for our homes. We are particularly for the donation that was meant to help us drill a borehole at Beat The Drum home. With the gift of water the home would grow food in the garden and give the children better diet. However, for the second time, having tried in the past we could not find water after drilling 285metres as estimated by the theological surveys done ahead of the drilling. Please pray with us that the God helps us to solve the puzzle of the water at Beat The Drum.

Our leadership teams set the goal to train 300 leaders in the month of August but by the grace of God went beyond the 300 target leaders to equip more than 450 leaders in 14 different conferences around African Nations. In one of the conferences in Lilongwe Malawi, at Dzaleka refugee camp a team of leaders among the refugees are striving to be change agents among the rest the refugees by living more as missionaries than refugees in a foreign land. To help these leaders have more impact, a gift of USD 50 would empower one with a business venture that will help finance the training of more leaders. More refugees will discover, develop and deploy their abilities in serving God to accelerate the spread of the Gospel.

More families are getting built to be strong building blocks of the society. Many are now smiling after what they thought was too difficult was addressed by our caring and listening counselors. The teams have been a strong pillar to the well-being of the GOA homes. Through regular counseling our children now have many of their unanswered questions addressed and with more peace in their hearts they can live life like any other without feeling the burdens of their pasts. Issues of mental health have raised to be a need that GOA Peace teams are now intentionally investing resources and time to help address. Please support our peace teams to be able to actualize their goals of peaceful communities.

The month of October is fast approaching. My wife Joyce and I will be travelling to the States on October 6th. We will be in the states until the Tuesday 14th November when we travel back to Kenya. We look forward to meeting our long time friends and partners of GOA. We have seen divine provision for our trip, many of our friends have generously donated for our flights and many offered to host us during our stay in the States. As we look forward to meeting you during our stay in the States our Itinerary is fast filling up with only a few days left to be filled up. Please get in in contact with me and let me know if we can plan to meet during the days that we will be close to where you are. We look forward to meeting our long time Kingdom partners and make new friends and Kingdom partners for the work that GOA does in Africa.

She dropped out of school in the second term due to inability of her family to pay school fees. Jackline is a twelve grade candidate expected to sit her National Exams in October this year. With a gift of USD. 500, Jackline will go back to school and prepare for her final examination together with her classmates



More GOA congregations have been planted across the GOA regions. Through these new congregations more people are getting to know Christ, love and worship him. GOA Hangamakwer in Uganda (Left above) and GOA Kibukwo in Nandi County of Kenya are such congregations that have withstood difficult times to reach the community with the Gospel. GOA Kibukwo church worships under tree, making it difficult for the members to come to church when it rains heavily. GOA Hangamakwer in Uganda has put up a temporary reeds worship structure that gives them temporary relief from the Hot sun awaiting its timely dilapidation and remaking. With a gift of USD 5000 you can help a congregation to have a temporary tin worship sanctuary to keep them safe from the rains and sun. More than 20 GOA congregations are today in dire need of a worship sanctuary.

GOA High School

Key outstanding examiners have professionally guided our student in various Sciences, Technical and Languages subjects for both form 3 and four KCSE exam candidates. We look forward to have them come in this term to help in



the other subjects too. The Form Four Agriculture project was completed and manual submission made in August to the Kenya National Examination Council, through the Sub-County Educational Office at Engineer town.

The school Christian Union remains highly active and holds church activities and church services.

The Sports for Jesus Ministry visited our institution

on Sunday 6th August 2023. They motivated students through personal testimonies and sports activities. They discussed how to gain self-esteem and career choices available to the youths, professional sports being one of them.



Upgrade of Sanitation facilities

The new modern toilet was sponsored by Joy Griffin and the Beautiful feet. This came at the right time when the institution needed the facility following the inability of the previous facility to handle the needs of the institution

GOA Education Centre Kinangop

The enrolment has grown by an addition of 4 from Private Parents and the school is now having a population of 142 Pupils. The teaching staff has been successful in completing the KNEC projects and marking on time. The Syllabus is at 100% Complete for Class 8 and the other Grades they are working hard to complete it in good time. The school is in great need for two extra class rooms to avoid sharing of the classes as has been the case.

GOA NABWELPUS

The school was opened for third term on 28th with three teachers. The Cabinet Secretary for water, Sanitation and Irrigation Hon Alice Wahome, UNICEF Director, Koica and County Government officials visited the school to officially launch the water project which was installed by UNICEF.



The Cabinet secretary promised the gift of an administration block and two more classrooms. The Constituency Development fund for Turkana Central Constituency has also promised to help build two more classrooms at the school. With this donation the school will have more classrooms to accommodate all the learners from the community. Close to 3 kilometers from Nabwelpus School at GOA Kaapokor, a feeder Kindergarten school was launched by the community to help educate their children. The Kindergarten graduates from

Kaapokor Centre join Nabwelpus for their Primary and Junior Secondary Education. The new centre however suffers lack of basic teaching aids as well as food for the children causing many of them to be inconsistent in the school. We are also in need of one teacher for the ECDE class and one teacher for the Primary level.

The 10 candidates for KCPE are getting ready for the KCPE exam at the end of the year 2023. We keep praying for them for the courage to face the examinations and perform well to proceed with their education journey.

Glory Academy in Burundi school acquired land within the month. Constructions and renovation of the existing building is going on. To transfer the children from the school at the church to the new school premises. The process of the land transfer the land to the school is in progress.



Peace



A team from GOA Head Office in Nairobi and other friends travelled to Burundi for the GOA Burundi conference which took place over the first week of August. The journey by bus took us 6 days to and fro, it was long but exciting. The conference was well organized and planned and impactful in many ways. The Children Retreat Teenagers

A one day retreat with children from Nairobi Region was held at Arboretum. It was well attended by around 130 children from different GOA churches. We had a moment of learning how to know and avoid those who aim at destroying children’s lives.



Individual counseling took place and issues shared were on mental health and marriage related issues

Counseling to three different couples from different Regions in Western, Tharaka and Nairobi who are planning for their marriage as well legalizing marriages has been

made and continues to be made as they continue to prepare for the same.

Support for GOA Schools and Homes

Counseling to GOA high school was given twice to prepare them for the reforms that are being implemented, i.e. the transition from the home to their guardians during the Holidays. This will prepare them for exit after High School. At the beginning of the term, we emphasized on the need to prepare by putting more effort to improve on their performance. More encouragement was given by different motivational speakers with the aim of improving their academic performance.



Our efforts this graciously showed the huge need our society has for mental health interventions; we therefore feel encouraged for the impact we will have. We actualized our plans to offer intervention and help to people struggling with addiction and substance abuse disorders. The program was officially launched at our headquarter church on 23rd of July during our Sunday service. As part of this, initiative, we are hosting two young men after they left rehab earlier in the month with aim helping them develop healthy and dependable coping mechanisms.

To further our efforts to assist people struggling with addiction and substance abuse disorders we pursued a partnership with alcoholic anonymous group with an aim to have such meetings in our premises. Our AA meetings run every Thursday between 5.30 and 6.30 seeking to help the people breaking their dependence on alcohol and other narcotic drugs.

In as much as our mental health initiatives are highly needed our teams are working with very little to produce much. With more funding we can get more effective teams reaching addressing the needs in the communities.

Leadership Training

To realize the vision for leadership training and development, GOA works in partnership with International Leadership Institute (ILI), GOA Switzerland, Nairobi Pentecostal Bible College (NPBC) and Daily word feast foundation (CBR).

History Makers Leadership training

Our teams had set the goal of training at least 300 leaders through History Makers in English/ Swahili speaking Africa. A total of 477 leaders were equipped with the eight core values of effective leaders in 14 different training events held in Kenya, Botswana, Malawi, DR. Congo, Rwanda South Africa and Zimbabwe. The training conferences that our teams deployed were both in person and online training conferences. The leaders that have been equipped have in turn set goals to equip more leaders to accelerate the spread of the gospel.

Bible and Theology Training

August class begun on Monday 21st August 2023. The class had twenty four students out of the thirty. The class



covered the course on apologetics that was facilitated by John Mbiti and students were given assignment to submit in the month of September for evaluation.

Only six students were able to pay for the class. We pray to God for the provision of the funds for the students to pay their tuition fees in good time. The September class will start on 18th Monday to 22nd

Thursday and the course to done will be Missiology which will be taught by John Nyaga. The students are remaining with a few more courses to complete the current level of study to graduate early in the coming year.



The class in Tharaka have completed their seven month course and they are graduating on 21st September which will be on Thursday. We have invited all alumni, friends and others people from different churches where our students come from. Our aim is to have a good number of people who will join the next class after graduation of the current class. The students decided to buy T-shirts to wear during graduation, they have placed an order so that they can come from Nairobi.

A total of 25 students are being equipped in Nairobi with the discipline of Consistent Bible Reading. The group during the first week of August where their progress was evaluated according to the month’s assignments given. We continue praying for them to successfully go through the training and be equipped with this invaluable discipline of Bible Reading.

Sports Ministry

GOA creatively responds to the great commission through sports such as Football, rollball, volleyball, athletics and floorball. We currently have 70 teams in different parts of Kenya and Africa where we are discipling and mentoring our youths to achieve their God given destinies. The month of July was very impactful. Paul and Victor travelled to Malawi for floorball introduction and Discipled by Jesus conference. Over 100 Pastors attended the training and over 100 youths too. A total of 70 youths gave their lives to Christ. Sports ministry through floorball is now on course in Blantyre Malawi

Floorball East Africa tour

The month of August was very impactful with global impact. The floorball4all coaches from Switzerland introduced floorball in Tanzania in partnership with Tanzania Evangelical Church in order to use the sport for evangelism. A total of 17 attended and 17 projects resulted from this. This was closely followed by the team touring Burundi in the company of Paul Maina, The GOA Sports Director together with his family and other key sports ministers from Kenya including coach Victor Mwai for floorball introduction in partnership with GOA Burundi where we trained over 30 sports ministers. The Swiss and Kenya team then proceeded to Uganda to encourage the floorball4all Uganda team where over 20 coaches were trained and we had a tournament as well. The Kenya National Floorball team is the current African champions. The team was seeking to defend the floorball African cup from 13th to 17th September at Cote D'Ivoire. 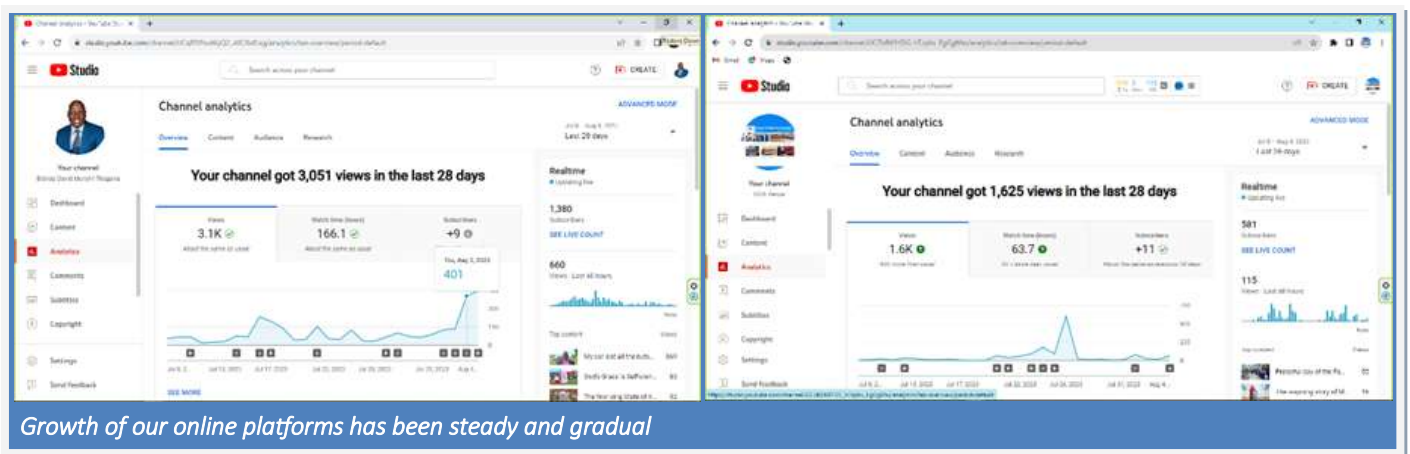

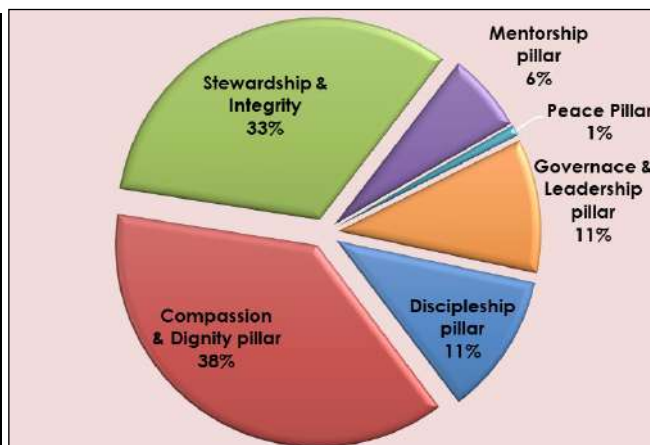
Our Sources of funding from the month of August 2023

Overall ministry Expenditure

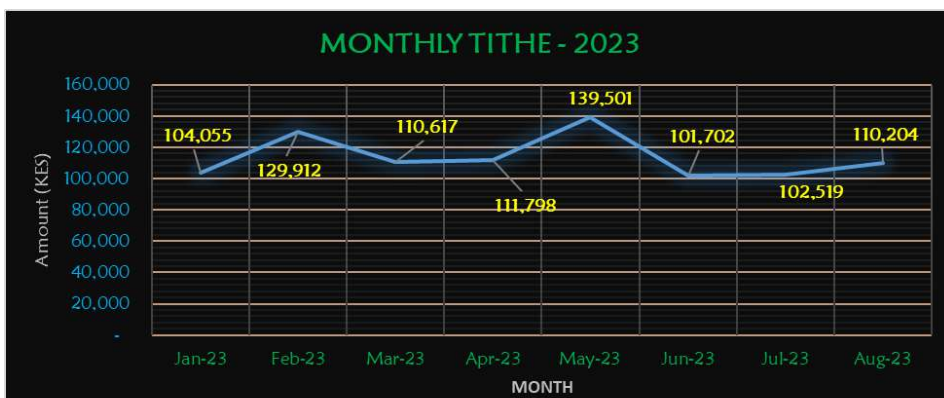

Tithes from our Churches



80 churches managed to send their tithes to the head office. This represents 55% of the total congregations. The total amount tithe of tithe received was KShs. 110, 204/. This represents 7% increase from last

month (KShs. 102, 519/) our target for this calendar year is to receive a monthly tithe average of KShs. 150, 000/.

SUSTAINABILITY PROJECTS

Ensuring financial stability is a top priority for our ministry as it enables us to effectively pursue our mission and create a lasting impact on the community. We have undertaken strategic initiatives with potential for sustainable income and long-term stability. These include construction of Guesthouse in Naivasha, developing Umoja House in Nairobi (Residential apartments), development of a Guesthouse in Tharaka venturing into commercial agriculture at Githabai Farm, and running several businesses at the head office such as M-Pesa shop, Hotel, cyber and selling water.

GITHABAI FARM



Farming activities are ongoing well at Githabai farm. Currently we are having 4 acres under cultivation. Two acres of cabbage and two acres of potatoes. The cabbages have started forming heads. We are praying and believing in God for provision of USD 37,500 needed for drilling and equipping a solar powered borehole at Githabai farm.

The 3 M USD Guest House Vision

Our Ministry, committed to financial sustainability, plans to utilize our beautiful land in Naivasha to establish and operate a profitable guesthouse. This endeavor will not only create employment opportunities but also contribute to the economic growth of the local community.



Our potential in Housing



Our plan involves constructing a five storey apart-

ment building in the prime Umoja outskirts of Nairobi, which will not only meet the increasing demand for quality housing but also address a significant market gap. This building will provide residents with high-quality housing options, generating consistent rental income for the Ministry. Upon completion, this investment is projected to yield a monthly income of KShs. 250,000 for the Ministry.

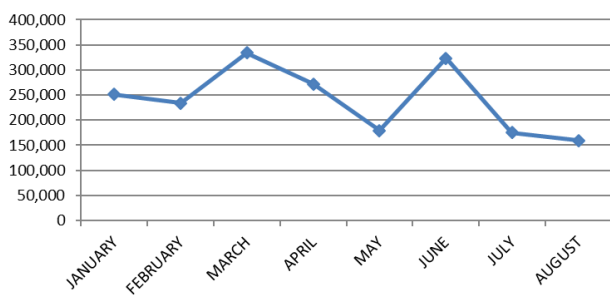
GOA SACCO

TRENDS IN MEMBER SAVINGS FOR THE FIRST 8 MONTHS OF 2023

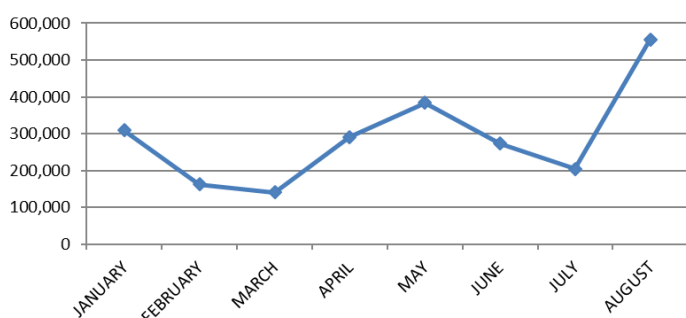

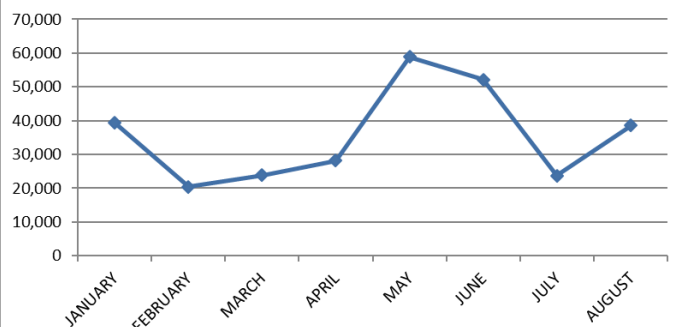
SACCO CREDIT FACILITIES

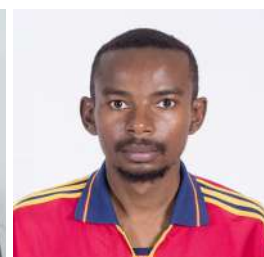
